# Library-School Tax Increases 19 Cents

The combined Hicksville School-Library tax rate for 1960-61 has been set at \$5.174 per \$100, an increase of 19 cents over the 1959-60 rate. The rate was set by the Board of Education at a regular meeting, Friday night, as required by law. The decision of Supreme Court Justice Howard Hogan in reducing the tax assessment on Mid Island Plaza by a million dollars had no bearing on the final rate determined. It could be reflected in the years ahead.

The rate for school purposes for the coming year is \$4.954 per \$100 which, added to 22 cents per \$100 for the library, makes the total \$5.174.

The rate is based upon an assessed valuation of \$89,603,667 which does not include a reduction for Mid Island Plaza. School Attorney Michael Sullivan told the Board the recent court verdict, which will probably be appealed by the County of Nassau, has no effect on the assessment for this year.

The total school budget is an all-time peak of \$6,679,837.20 with estimated state aid of \$3,525,000. Being raised by taxation is \$4,436,837.20.

## OKAYED BOOKMOBILE

The operation of the Library for the coming year, which includes a bookmobile service approved under the budget by the voters last May, will cost \$197,103.52. The library portion of the tax rate is six cents per \$100 more than last

## Plaza Business Below Forecasts

SOME OF THE DETAILS about the operation of Mid Island Shopping Plaza on North Broadway, Hicksville, which is celebrating its fourth birthday in October, were disclosed by Supreme Court Justice Howard T. Hogan in his decision granting the Plaza a 23.3 per cent reduction in assessment for tax purposes and a \$310,010 refund.

The Plaza, (artist's conception above) "has fallen greatly short of" anticipated gross rent potential, volume of business done by its tenants. The court felt that this may have been due to two factors: (1) the area served does not at this time contain the potential buying power necessary and (2) competition from other regional shopping centers in Nassau, easily available. Evidence introduced indicated a gross rent potential of from \$2,000,000 to \$2,400,000. Apparently the actual rent has come to less than half this amount. While a majority of the leases were based upon a minimum rent with a percentage of the gross business over a fixed minimum, only five or six tenants "ever paid rent in excess of their minimums, and three of these became entitled to a return of such overage at the end of the year." Gertz, the largest tenant, was on a straight percentage lease. It is also noted that Gertz occupies 300,000 square feet, that there are a number of "chain stores" and the balance "consists of small, independently operated specialty shops. The experience with this latter class of tenants has been disappointing. There have been a number of failures and in some cases replacement tenants have not yet found or obtained only by concessions and reductions in rent."

year. The school portion went up 13 cents, despite the increase in State Aid granted by the state legislature under the Fehrenbach bill. The Board of Education last Friday night voted to interview candidates for the position of District Auditor prior to its next regular meeting on Aug. 26. There are three filed candidates for the position, including the present auditor, Solomon Neustadt. Since the movement of 12 temporary-type classrooms from East St. and Old Country Rd., planned originally to be done during this summer, has been delayed by court action, previously announced plans for sessions during the fall term were changed. The Administration

recommended, and the Board approved, keeping second graders at Park Lane, Old Country Rd. and East St. on single sessions until the movement of the temporary buildings. When adding the room starts, these classes will go on double sessions as planned. In addition, third graders at Old Country Rd. will remain in that building until the temporary buildings are shifted. When the shift is made, they will shift the year at Park Lane as planned. The Junior High will remain on a summer program until the 12 rooms are moved over. When the temporarys are ready for occupancy, the Junior High will go on one single session as previously planned.

### EXTEND DANCES

The Board also approved a recommendation of Joseph Madigan, recreation director, to continue the popular summer teen dances for the remainder of the vacation period. Nine group leaders are being employed to supervise the dances at the rate of \$10 per session.

Assistant Superintendent Donald F. Alt recommended the hiring of four consultants for the summer workshop, which the Board approved. The consultants are Dr. William Carlson from Potsdam University; Dr. Oscar Danneberg, Chesham Research; Dr. Abraham Tannenbaum, State Education Dept; and Dr. Paul Wending, Fort Monmouth. Dr. Wallace E. Lamb, superintendent of schools, was away on vacation and did not attend the meeting.

## BETWEEN DEADLINES



The Bethpage School Board announces that the old Powell Ave. elementary school will not be used for students this fall because it may be unsafe. The decision brought back a flood of memories of many hectic and exciting events we covered at that building, particularly when Bethpage was called Central Park.

Back in those days, including the period when Paul S. Gilbert, now Grumman's personnel manager, was the principal, the School Board held its meetings in a second floor classroom. Admittedly the building is ancient and we have not stepped inside of it in 10 years, but we did spend a lot of hours in there when school board sessions were in progress. We remember the annual school meetings when it was customary to have a couple of policemen on hand to maintain order, when an excited woman tore the shirt off the back of Jimmy Amendola and when nearly every school election wound up with somebody suing someone else—and usually settling some months later for an apology.

An interesting change is coming into our community life. The presidency of a local civic association was always considered the particular field of the men with the job of secretary delegated to a willing woman. Now we have today two Civic Associations in Hicksville which are led by women, and there is no particular reason why they should not.

In a recent effort to compile up to date data on our organizations, we found that the Schlosser family probably has organization leadership tied up. Phil Schlosser is president of the Exempt Firemen's Assoc. His wife, Rita, is president of the Fire Dept Ladies Auxiliary and regent of the Catholic Daughters. Another double leadership woman is Grace Stoll, head of the Red Cross and Women's Club, while Julius Schwartz is president of both the Chamber of Commerce and the Alumni Association.

Our study did not include other positions, besides presidents, but we recall the time when our editor, Fred Noeth, was secretary of five organizations at one time.

The Jericho school tax rate went up from \$3.59 to \$3.99 for \$100 of assessed valuation.

## Syosset School Tax Reduced

By Horace Bernstein

A school tax rate of 84 per \$100.00 lower than the 1959-60 rate published in the Budget Brochure last May was announced by the School Board of Central District #2.

Substantial increases in State Aid, plus an addition to the assessment roll of almost \$2 million more than anticipated, combined to make the tax cut possible. This tax reduction occurs in spite of the fact that the District will have approximately 1,000 more pupils and about 4,000 more teachers than last year. State Aid calculated on a current attendance basis instead of on the basis of the previous years attendance gave the district an increase of state funds of more than \$200,000.

Assessed valuation estimated last April at \$69,000,000 turned out to be \$70,907,810. The amount to be raised in taxes is figured at \$3,157,475.44.

By Ralph Diamond and George Frankel

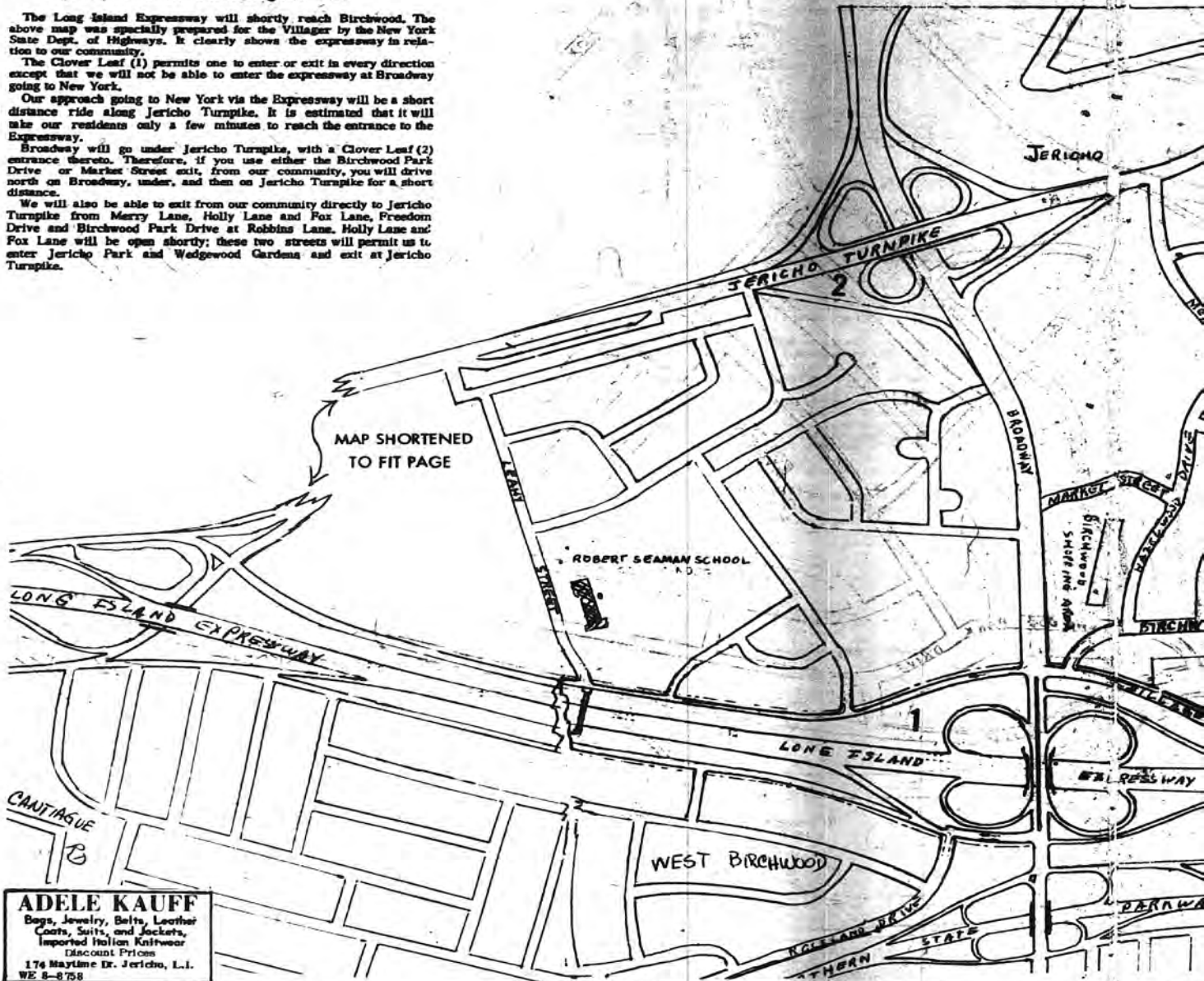
The Long Island Expressway will shortly reach Birchwood. The above map was specially prepared for the Village by the New York State Dept. of Highways. It clearly shows the expressway in relation to our community.

The Clover Leaf (1) permits one to enter or exit in every direction except that we will not be able to enter the expressway at Broadway going to New York.

Our approach going to New York via the Expressway will be a short distance ride along Jericho Turnpike. It is estimated that it will take our residents only a few minutes to reach the entrance to the Expressway.

Broadway will go under Jericho Turnpike, with a Clover Leaf (2) entrance thereto. Therefore, if you use either the Birchwood Park Drive or Market Street exit, from our community, you will drive north on Broadway, under, and then on Jericho Turnpike for a short distance.

We will also be able to exit from our community directly to Jericho Turnpike from Merry Lane, Holly Lane and Fox Lane, Freedom Drive and Birchwood Park Drive at Robbing Lane. Holly Lane and Fox Lane will be open shortly; these two streets will permit us to enter Jericho Park and Wedgewood Gardens and exit at Jericho Turnpike.

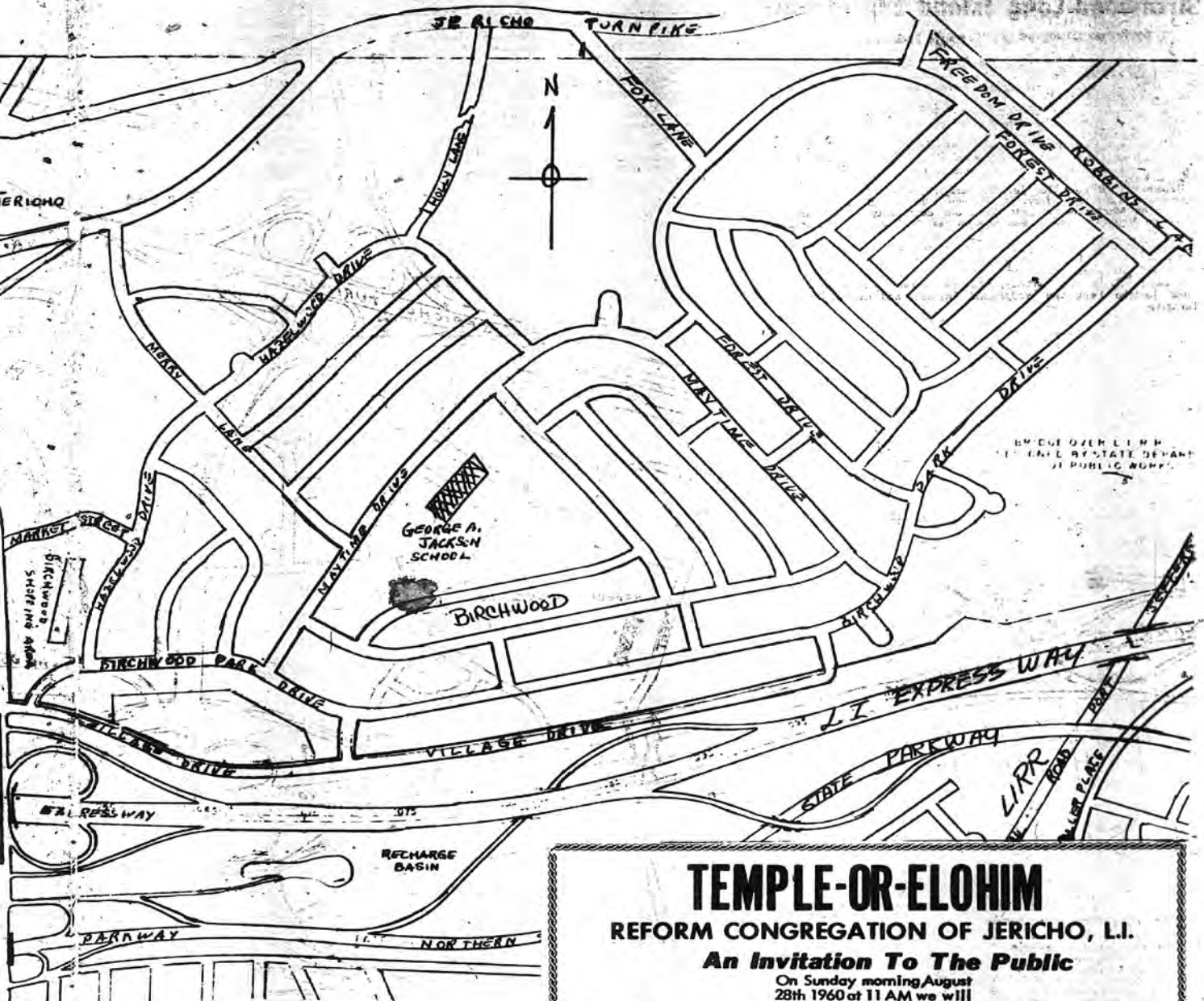
