

## HERALD READER OPINIONS

To The Editor:

With the Hicksville Library Board scheduled to meet Dec. 17 to reconsider the ban on the use of texpayers' funds to rent a film featuring the notorious pro-Communist Charlie Chaplain, your readers may be interested in a report by Fulton Lewis, Jr., in the New York "Daily Mirror" of Dec. 6. He said that three years ago Turner Shelton of the United States Information Agency, warning about the danger of Communist movies, told a Senate, committee all about the chief American distributor of Communist movies. 




