Preparing for Newbridge Detour

WITH NEWBRIDGE ROAD, a state highway thru Hicksville, scheduled for reconstruction starting this year, town, county and state authorities are planning to re-route traffic during the construction interval. Lieut. John Blenn of the Nassau Police Traffic Control Bureau, left; Robert Francis, assistant civil engineer of the State Dept. of Public Works traffic dept., center; and Town Councilman A. Carl Grunewald discuss plans in the vicinity of the Rail Road depot, New route of Newbridge Rd. will swing left starting at Old Country Rd. and go north along present-day Jackson Ave., rejoining Broadway near the entrance to Mid Island Plaza.

Seeks Repeal Of Commuter Tax

State Senator John D. Caemmerer of Williston Park who will be seeking re-election in a new district including Hicksville in November has promised that he will introduce legislation to repeal the recently enacted Commuter Earnings Tax. Caemmerer called the tax a Pandora's box that when opened will increase the problems of the City of New York 100 fold rather than assist it in solving its tremendous financial problem.

"Some 23 millions of dollars are to be raised by this tax out of a total budget of \$4.6 billion dollars," Caemmerer said. "This 23 million in relation to the total budget is a drop in the bucket. The efforts to justify this tax as a major part of the solution of the present needs of the City

of New York is obviously false. It was not the money that the City wanted but the principle that this Bill establishes of a Commuter Income Tax."

Caemmerer noted that the Federal government now gets 20¢ of every Federal tax dollar from the State of New York. "If any shortchanging is done, it is being done by the Federal government."

He proposed as a practical solution to the desperate plight of big cities, direct Federal dollar grants with no strings attached. He suggested that an aid program similar to the State aid program to schools and local governments be established by the Federal government since the plight of our cities is no longer a local problem.

38th Annual Parade-Drill

Firemen Ready For Labor Day

Hicksville Fire Dept. is ready for the 38th annual Labor Day Firemen's Invitational Parade and Drill for volunteer firemen, the oldest Labor Day competition of its kind on the Island which annually attracts more than 50,000 spectators.

In addition to the State Champions from Oyster Bay and other fast teams from Nassau and Suffolk counties, the parade participants will include representatives from Henniker Fire Dept. in New Hampshire and Avoca Fire Dept. in upstate New York, according to Joseph Janca, general chairman of the event this year.

Suffolk participants will include St. James and East Patchogue which set a new state record recently.

The parade on Monday, Sept. 5, will start at 9 AM, rain or shine. In case of severe inclement weather the drill program, which normally starts at the Mid Island Shopping Plaza shortly after noon, will take place the following Saturday, Sept. 10.

Several new leg trophies requiring three wins for permanent possession will be offered the drill teams this year.

Ex-chiefs of the fire dept. will be the marshals of the six divisions of the parade which will include color guards of Hicksville veteran organizations. Janca, as general chairman, will be grand marshal.

The parade route will be the same as recent years. Hicksville Fire Dept. will leave the headquarters on E. Marie St., go west to Broadway, north of Herzog Place, south on Jerusalem Ave., to Old Country Rd., and thence on Old Country Rd. and Carl St. to Broadway, picking up the assembled parade divisions enroute. The parade will then move north on Broadway to Mid Island Plaza.

Residents Win In Rocketry

Hicksville and Plainview residents were among the winners in the 8th Annual National Model Rocket Championships of the National Assn of Rocketry in Wilmington, Ohio. During the four-day event 80 contestants flew 1500 rockets in 10 events. Albert G. Kirchner Jr. of 49 Cheshire Rd., Bethpage, was declared the national junior champion. His scale model of a Thor missile complete with a detailed launch pad attracted special notice.

George Ludwig of 11 Balsam Lane, Hicksville, won first place in the Class 2 altitude junior division and tied for third in the plastic scale junior division.

In the scale junior division, James Kokous of 25 Elmwood Court, Plainview, placed third.

School Enrollment Decline Is Forecast

The start of the school year in Hicksville will see public school enrollment somewhat below the peak figures for recent years. It is expected the total enrollment in all schools will be approximately 12,600. The first day of school this year will be Wednesday, Sept. 7.

The first faculty orientation meeting will be held on Friday, Sept. 2nd, for teachers who will be in the Hicksville schools for the first time. A general faculty meeting for all teachers will be held on Tuesday, Sept. 6.

Water District Vote on Aug 30

William A. Cislser of Henry Pl. Hicksville, is a candidate for re-election as a commissioner of the Hicksville Water District. The election will be held on Tuesday night, Aug. 30, at the district courthouse between 7 and 9 PM.

Cislser noted this week that during the record summer heat this year, with many 100 degree days, no restrictions were imposed upon residents regarding the use of water for sprinkling or other purposes. Record high pumpage levels were reached.

Woman Stabbed

Elizabeth Hart, 29, of 65 Pelican Rd., Levittown, was apparently stabbed with an unknown weapon by an unknown assailant while walking south on Jerusalem Ave., 100 feet south of Marie St., Hicksville, at 12:20 AM on Aug. 20, according to precinct police. She was taken to Syosset General Hospital suffering a puncture wound in the lower back.

All residents who are legal voters are eligible to cast their ballots in this election. No advance voter registration is required. The election will be conducted jointly by the Oyster Bay and Hempstead Town Boards since the district includes sections of both townships.

Cislser also reports that the tax on real estate for water district purposes will decline in the coming fiscal year.

Announce Clerk Carrier Exams

An announcement of an open continuous examination for Career Clerk Carrier Examination will be issued on Aug. 24. The registers established as a result of this examination will be used to fill vacancies at 1st and 2nd class Post Offices in the State of New York (except the five boroughs of New York City).

There is no residence requirement; however, certification to post offices named in this announcement will be made first, of eligibles who reside within the delivery area of the post office requesting certification, or who are bona fide patrons of that

office; second, of eligibles residing elsewhere in each county; and third, of all other eligibles filing under this announcement.

This examination will be open to both men and women. No experience is necessary. Applicants must have reached their 17th birthday at the time of filing. This does not apply to persons entitled to veterans' preference. There is no maximum age limit. Eligibles will not be certified to Substitute City Carrier positions until they have reached their 18th birthday.

Andy Borg, national commander in chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, has again lashed out for the benefit of the veteran by criticizing severely the State Department for its "machinations" and "secretive maneuvers" to gain legislative approval of the Hays Bill (H.R. 6277).

Commander Borg has written a letter to Assistant Secretary of State for Congressional Relations, Douglas MacArthur II, demanding that the department "come forward in full faith of its employees and offer protection rather than platitudes."

The bill, strongly opposed by the V.F.W., would eliminate veterans preference in employment with the State Department Agency for International Development and U.S. Information Agency and put its employees under Foreign Service. If veterans preference is knocked out for the State Department employees then other agencies will undoubtedly be making the same demands.

The Veterans Administration has asked Congress to pass legislation exempting soldier insurance benefits to survivors from State taxes and creditor claims. At present proceeds from this insurance is taxable in many states.

In recommending this form of legislation officials of the VA noted that National Service Life Insurance proceeds are currently exempt from taxes and creditor claims.

The VA feels that the proceeds from the new Servicemen's Group Life Insurance should also be exempt.

This is only one of six proposed changes in SGLI which is scheduled for quick action by the House Veterans Affairs Committee.

Other changes are: 1) allowing payment of insurance proceeds to minor widows and survivors under 18 years of age without the appointment of a guardian, 2) bar servicemen from converting their group policy to a commercial permanent plan until 121 days after discharge or separation, 3) extend SGLI benefits to cadets and midshipmen at the service academies, 4) stop coverage for soldiers who are AWOL or are in jail for more than 31 days, 5) permit court martialled soldiers to reinstate SGLI after a period of honorable service.
