(b) The appropriation of the necessary funds to meet the estimated expenditures of the Hicksville Free Public Library for the 1968-69 school year for library purposes.

Thousands Business Concern



GRANDPARENTS, PARENTS, and TEENAGERS ALIKE, all expressed concern over the effects of Hicksville's first austerity budget at last night's special Board of Education meeting which got off to a late start last night (Wed., Sept. 4), first in the Board of education room, then, as the crowd gradually increased in numbers, public address systems were changed into the High School cafeteria, and finally, when that became inadequate, into the High School auditorium. A crowd of well over a thousand were present - some seated, many standing throughout the 3 1/2 hour meeting. They alternately cheered and booed the answers given to their questions by individual members of the Board, the Administra-

tion, and the district's attorney. This in a major effort to understand the legal problems harassing the Administration and the Board as they did their best to work out the details of educating Hicksvilles children, under the law of our state governing austerity.

THE MEETING had been called as a direct result of petitions signed by 7,018 voters of the district, requesting the Board of Education to put a proposition before the voters providing for interscholastic sport, not to exceed \$75,000 in total. The Board voted to put this and six other propositions up for a vote on Sept. 20th.

## INTERSCHOLASTIC SPORTS

Shall the Board of Education Union Free School District 17, Town of Oyster Bay provide a program of interscholastic sports for the school year '68-69, for a sum not to exceed \$75,000 and that the necessary taxes be levied thereon?"

According to the education law of our state, only a little over 6,300 signatures of the qualified voters of our school district make the placing of this proposition before our voters, a mandate to our Board of Education.

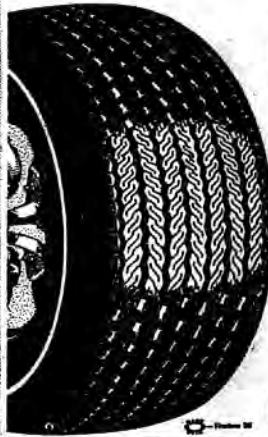

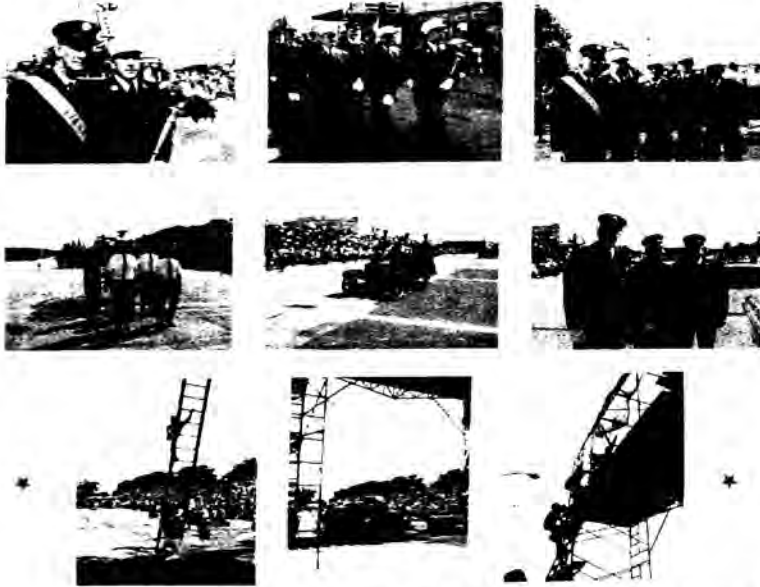
