KLM Soccer Tournament Set For Cantiague Park

Young soccer players doing the no hands juggle are welcome to enter along with their teams in the Second Annual KLM-Nassau Recreation Soccer Tournament to be played at Cantiague Park in Hicksville. A team application form and registration fee must be received no later than August 1.

Midgets (age 11 & 12) and Bantams (9 and 10) with a current Long Island Junior Soccer League, German-American, PBC, CYO pass or other accredited affiliation are eligible.

A registration fee of \$25 per team to cover cost of officials and a \$25 bond returnable upon appearance, is required. The separate checks should be made payable to the Long Island Soccer Referees Association. For an application form or further information, call the Nassau County Department of Recreation and Parks' Sports Unit at 292-4284.

Games will begin on September 23 and continue through October 2, on weekday evenings and on Saturday and Sunday during the day. The schedule will be announced after an open draw is conducted to determine pairings.

The team winner of each division will receive a perpetual revolving trophy to be displayed in Eisenhower Park. Members of the winning teams will be awarded KLM travel bags. All participants will be awarded jacket patches. Finalist Bantam and Midget teams will receive four "mini-trophies" modeled after the permanent prize. Members of the two top teams in each division will appear in the finals wearing team shirts, donated by KLM Royal Dutch Airlines, which they will keep.

On the last day of the tournament, the KLM Soccer Team will play an exhibition match against an outstanding opponent.



Rail P.O. Makes Last Trip

The last remaining Railway Post Office in the United States makes its final run between New York City and Washington, D.C., today marking the end of an historic communication system that began more than 100 years ago.

The southbound train from New York City to Washington and the northbound train from Washington to New York City will roll past each other early the next morning somewhere near Frank-

ford Junction, Pa. The Washington-New York Railway Post Office, involving two four-car trains on which mail is sorted, has been the Postal Service's solitary RPO since 1972. It began operating on October 15, 1864, five months after the system was inaugurated between Chicago and Clinton, Iowa.

Since 1972, the southbound train to Washington has left New York City each night at 11:40
