# wn-Graded Athletics Are Not Lurking In Middle School Plans

Re-organization plans for the Hicksville School District do not include abolishment of interscholastic athletics for junior high or middle school students.

Responding to inquiries from the Illustrated Press concerning purported stories to that affect, Superintendent of Schools Dr. Catherine Fenton cleared the air.

The administration has not gone on record, nor has advocated, the abandonment of interscholastic athletic teams when or if the proposal to have a middle school for seventh and eighth grade students and a full four year high school is approved.

Dr. Fenton indicated that the committee, which has been working for a year on the reorganization, will report to a Board of Education sub-committee on Wednesday, June 12, and will report at a regular meeting on Wednesday, June 25 day's drug and alcohol problems confront-

It has come to light that one paragraph in the report indicates a National Education Committee study found that the presence or absence of an athletic program in a junior high or a middle school has no appreciable effect either way on

Many Hicksville parents and students dispute that philosophy as alien to the competitive 65-year history of the school district and community.

Repercussions from inclusion of that statement fanned what had been smoldering suspicions as far back as last August.

Many Hicksville citizens regard a vigorous, healthy, competitve athletic program, coupled with club and extracurricular activities, to be a deterrent to toing students.

# Hicksville Elks Nominate Peter T. Affatato For Grand Exalted Ruler

He was admitted to the Bar of the State of New York and the United States District Courts for the Southern and Eastern Districts of New York. Brother Affatato is a practicing attorney in Hicksville, New York and specializes in the trial of tort litigation. In 1985, he was elected President of the Bar Association of Nassau County, one of the largest local Bar Associations in the United States with 4,500



Service to his community in Nassau County included numerous offices in civic and charitable organizations. He was elect-\ ed a member of the Board of Education at Island Trees Public School in New York in 1054, served for 12 years and is a Past President of the Board.

Brother Affatato met his wife, Irene, on their first day at college in 1941. They were married in 1948 and have two daughters, Irene Burkhard and Anne Affatato. He resides in Massapequa Park, Long Island, and is a lector at his local church, St. Rose of Lima.

He was initiated into the Order of Elks in February, 1950, is a Charter Member, Honorary Life Member and Past Exalted Ruler (1957-58) of Hicksville Lodge No. 1931. He was appointed District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler in 1060 and elected President of the New York State Elks Association in 1965. He served as Chairman of the Veterans Service Commission Hospital Visitation Committee for New York's East District for twenty years. He is a former Director of the New York State Elks Major Projects Corporation and a member of the Advisory Committee of that Association. In 1964he was appointed a member of the Grand Lodge Committee on Judiciary where he served for five years. Thereafter he served nine years as a member of the Grand Lodge Activities Committee and as Chairman in 1978-79.

### The Investor's Corner

Last week we asked you to make a list of banks and mortgage companies if you are considering refinancing your house or getting a first-time mortgage. Now we suggest you start to call them-let your telephone do the walking. Ask for the mortgage department.

You will finish up with a large quantity of information. To organize it, get a large sheet of paper; list the questions down the left side; the names and telephone numbers of the banks across the top. Fill in the answers. The better deals will become readily apparent. You will be able to eliminate most, ending up with two or three, and some unanswered questions. Call back; get your questions answered; and get an application through the mail.

They will want to know your financial history, the value of your assets, etc. This alone makes the exercise worthwhile since most of us do not know how much we are worth. Many of us "feel poor" because we do not have much cash in the bank.

Here are the questions to ask:

- 1. What is your interest rate for variable rate mortgages?
- 2. To what index is the rate tied? 3. What additional margin do you
- get over the index? 4. What prepayment penalties are
- there? 5. What cap (upper limit) do you
- 6. What is the maximum adjustment
- for the rate at the end of the period? 7. How often do you adjust the variable rate? (They probably will give you this information with question 1.)
- 8. Can the mortgage rate be renegotiated (called a modification) if the rates fall in the future? (This can save you a bundle.)
- 9. What type of fixed-rate mortgages do you have?
- 10. What are the fees involved to get a mortgage?
- 11. What limitations as to the maximum loan do you have?

A recent auction of movie-related collectibles offered hundreds of items, including posters, lobby cards, window inserts, stills, magazines, props, equipment, glass coming attraction slides, personal belongings of performers and various types of ephemera for sale.

Some highlights included a collection of approximately 150 autographed stills that brought \$470; a re-release King Kong lobby card for \$175; a Dracula photoplay book for 150; a French poster on linen "Camille" for 1550; a Rudolph Valentino poster, French for the Son of the Sheik, \$850; a "Silent' era 1 sheet size poster "Love & Doughnuts," \$800; "The Boss of Bar 20" 1 sheet size poster, 1500; an uncatalogued Bugs Bunny 1 sheet cartoon poster dated 1942 brought \$135; and another similar one brought \$200. Glass coming attraction slides were offered throughout the auction in lots of 20 and sold in the 1100-1130 range. A cast iron Mutoscrope on wood base with stereoview cards sold for 1500. Window inserts were offered in lots of four and five, averaging about 420 an insert. Photoplay books, novelizations of the actual movie, were generally a bargain, averaging about 45 each in lots of five or more. Posters from the 50s averaged about 110-11s each.

Declarer naturally presumes that the defenders are doing everything they can to defeat him and are not deliberately acting against their own best interests. It follows, therefore, that any information he acquires from the opponents' chosen line of defense can be utilized to guide him to the best method of play.

Take this case where South capitalized on the first two plays made by the defenders. After West's king of diamonds held the first trick, West led a low diamond to East's ace. East shifted to the jack of hearts, and the outcome of the deal hinged on South's play at this point.

Confronted by a potential loser in hearts and another in clubs, there was a normal temptation for declarer to now play the queen of hearts to try to win the trick. But before doing so, he paused to consider the likelihood that East had the king of hearts.

Correctly, he reasoned that the defenders, by their diamond plays, had arranged for the heart lead at trick three to come from East, and that West therefore had the king. Consequently, playing the queen could serve no useful purpose.

Retaining the queen, however, could prove enormously beneficial if West had fewer than three clubs. In line with that thought, South won the heart jack with the ace, drew trumps, cashed the A-K of clubs, and then led the queen of hearts.

West won with the king, but since he had no more clubs he was forced to return either a diamond or a heart. This allowed declarer to trump in dummy while discarding his club loser, and so, the contract came sailing home

Had South played his queen of hearts at trick three, it would have become impossible to make the contract Inevitably, he would have lost a heart and a club and gone down

### Poxabogue Will Be in Center Of Long Isand Golf Year

Bearing the austere prestige of the Royal and Ancient, America's oldest private golf club, Shinnecock Hills, will host the United States Open in June.

host the United States Open in June. Carved out of Eastern Long Island by Shinnecock Indian labor almost one hundred years ago, it has a panoramic clubhouse with an expansive view from which the Long Island Sound and the Atlantic Ocean may be seen.

A short way down the road is the North American Links with an equal reputation, reserved and formidable.

A bit south from the greens where the premier American Tourney is carded is another delightful course constructed on ancient Indian land. Nestled between the same bodies of water is a nine-hole course ideally ready for the average duffer.

Poxabogue Golf Course, which is located in Bridgehampton, was opened in 1962. It was originated by Hewlett Treadwell and Howard Liberty. The course was designed by Alfred Tull, a member of the American Society of Golf Course Architects. Mr. Tull, a gifted designer, was born in 1897 and learned his craft under the likes of Walter J. Travis, Devereaux Emmet and Albert Tillinghast. These were the three premier architects of the early 1900s.

Poxabogue is a nine hole, executivelength course. It is designed so the course offers everything that a fulllength course has, with the exception that it doesn't take the golfer 6 hours to play it. The course is comprised of six par 3 holes of quite varied length, and three par 4 holes of moderate length. The course plays to a par of 30.

The putting greens are relatively small and are well bunkered. Most of the greens are pitched and have very interesting rolls and undulations. The layout, coupled with an ever-present breeze, produces a different test each day. Although not difficult for the player who is starting, the course will present some very interesting shots to the good golfer who wants to par the course. When he loses a shot or two to par, he will find, more often than not, that they are irretrievably lost. Playing the course seldom requires more than an hour to an hour-and-a-half for nine holes. This makes it convenient to play both before and after work, and allows the wife time at the shops of Southampton.

Poxabogue is open from April 1 through November 30, seven days a week. Along with the golf course is a practice driving range and practice putting green. During the summer months golf lessons are available from professionals. There are several youth golf clinics given, which is an excellent way for youngsters to learn the proper fundamentals of the game. Any equipment necessary is available for purchase in the pro shop. Club repairs are expertly done, and complete sets may be made to order to the golfer's specifications. Sets of clubs may be hired out for use on the golf course. Also, there is a cafe which serves breakfast, lunch and after-golf libations.

The course is two miles east of Bridgehampton, traveling on Montauk Highway. The course opens at 7:00 a.m. Additional information may be obtained by calling 537-0025.

There are a number of summer flowering bulbs that can be planted now. Most major garden centers have a wide assortment. An even larger assortment can be obtained from any of the mail order firms that specialize in bulbs.

Tuberous Begonias are among the most showy summer flowering bulbs. They are particulary useful in partially shaded areas. Although bulbs are readily available, it is frequently better to purchase plants that have been grown from seed or bulbs that were started in March. Prestarted bulbs will have a significant headstart on bulbs that you plant directly outside. Tuberous begonias are heavy feeders and should be fertilized monthly. Tuberous begonias are not hardy in our climate. They should be dug before the first frost and stored over the winter in a cool dry place.

Dahlias are a hobby for many Long Island gardeners. There are literally thousands of varieties ranging from miniatures that are superb for bedding in borders to giant plants with blooms 14 to 15 inches in diameter Garden centers usually carry dwarf dahlias grown from seed for use in borders as well as tubers for the very popular pompon varieties which grow to approximately four feet in height. Dahlias should be planted in full sun and require soil which is rich in organic material (compost, peat, etc.). Because of the extensive root structure needed to support the larger plants, soil for dahlias should be prepared to a depth of at least one foot. Dahlias are heavy feeders requiring significant amounts of potash and phosphorus. Avoid using fertilizer with nitrogen during the growing season as you might get heavy vegetation with no flowers. Dahlias should be watered every seven to 10 days. Make sure that you give them enough water to get down to the

Freesia are an excellent source of midsummer color in the garden and cut flowers for the house. Once they have bloomed in the garden they can be dug and replanted in the house as houseplants. When purchasing freesias at a garden center, make sure that they are prepared for growing outdoors.

Cladious represent a wide variety of plants ranging from the miniature, with flowers as small as two inches across on stems of less than a foot, to the giants, with flowers over five inches across and borne on stems over six feet tall. Traditionally, they have been the mainstay of the florist's industry but they are being used more frequently in home gardens. The large and giant corms (as the bulbs are known) are readily available in garden centers.





# HOUSE CALLS

Moving That Fence

Dear Edith: In 1979 I bought a vacant lot from a local real estate broker who had just purchased it from the adjacent property owner. A fence separated the two properties, however it encroached on my property by about ten feet. I was assured by the broker that he would get the previous owner to move the fence in a few short weeks or have it done at his own expense if necessary.

After six years the fence is still there and in the meantime the property next door has a different owner. My broker friend during all this time managed to write three letters asking the owner to move the fence. Now he says the matter is out

of his hands and I should sue the new neighbor.

Whose responsibility is it to move the fence and what is your opinion about the length of time my broker friend sat on this? What do you think?-Mr. M.L.

I think you should have had a lawyer handle the matter from the beginning, and I think you should talk to one immediately. It's more than a matter of moving the tence; you may be in danger of losing ownership of that strip of land.

Out-of-State Mortgage Companies Dear Edith: We bought a home in 1979. Less than a year later our bank sold our mortgage to an out-of-state company. Our payments have always been made on time.

My husband applied for a car loan in September. We were told that company does not furnish credit statements to our credit bureau. Nothing showed on his credit report. Consequently, I had to co-sign for his loan.

Is it possible to transfer our mortgage to a local company or must we sell our house to be rid of that company?-Mrs. V.C.

I'm afraid your mortgagee had the right to sell the loan anywhere they pleased. You'll just have to deal with the out-of-state firm.

Keeping Retirement Secret

Dear Edith: My wife and I plan to purchase a small retirement home this September. My income is 832,900 annually, but when I retire in July it will be reduced. I may be able to increase it some with part-time work.

When we go to apply for our mortgage loan, should I not mention retirement? If I did tell them about it, what would be the result?-Mr. E.F.

You might as well come clean with the mortgage interviewer. They'll be verifying mcome with your employer and would find out about your coming retirement anyhow.

More important-you won't do yourselves any favor by taking out a loan you aren't really qualified for. The bank's stan dards are intended to keep you from getting in over your heads.

### Nassau Sports Review

By JACK WHITE

Long Island that it seems impossible to believe that in most areas of the U.S. the game is vitually unknown. At both the high school and college level, lacrosse is largely centered in three areas: Long Island, upstate New York and nearby New England and the Maryland-Virginia area.

There are teams in North Carolina, Pennsylvania, a few in the midwest, and some club teams on the West Coast, but the growth of the game has not been as widespread or rapid as local fans would have expected. There are some reasons which come to mind: the lack of national television exposure, the expense of starting a program, particularly from the standpoint of equipment, the lack of qualified coaches for youth programs, and competition from established sports such as baseball, track, tennis and soccer (at the youth level).

What is, in fact, the "national game" of Canada, was introduced to the Metropolitan New York area in prep schools and in some New York City high schools early in this century. The first Nassau public school to play lacrosse was Manhasset. The pioneer was Jason "Jay" Stranahan, who learned the game at Springfield College and introduced it to Manhasset when he became a physical education teacher there in 1932.

Stranahan had to schedule private schools, out of state games and college freshman teams to fill out a schedule. Two years later he convinced Jim Steen. another Springfield man, to start a team at Garden City High and, in 1935, the first Nassau public school varsity game was played between Manhasset and Garden City. That rivalry continues today as the longest uninterrupted public school series in the nation.

Stranahan and Steen organized the Metropolitan-Long Island Lacrosse League which was lacrosse's governing body until Section Eight took over in 1961. The first members included Poly Prep of Brooklyn, Locust Valley Friends, Erasmus Hall and Alexander Hamilton. Sewanhaka, under coach Howard Nordahl, became Nassau's third public school team in 1938.

World War II killed lacrosse in New York City and slowed its growth on the Island. But with the help and encouragement of Hostra coach Howdy Myers, in-

The game of lacrosse is so popular on terest was renewed. Bill Ashley started a team at Freeport High in 1949 and two years later, Mineola joined the league un-

der coach Pete Kuchinsky.

Huntington was the first Suffolk school to play, beginning in the mid-1950s. From that time until today, growth has been steady to the point where the great majority of Nassau schools have lacrosse teams.

In addition to being a terrific specta-tor sport, lacrosse scholarship money flows into Long Island schools somewhat like football money goes to Pennsylvania or Texas. This is prime recruiting ground for college lacrosse and the rosters of all the top teams are dotted with the names of Long Island players. Farmingdale High coach Bob Hartranft has said that his players abve received more than one million dollars in scholarship money. Similar numbers probably apply to schools such as Manhaset, Garden City, Sewanahaka and Elmont.


