## A Dissent

The Hicksville Junior High School Student Council voted 48-2 against moving the ninth grade to the High School.

In the interest of presenting all views, the *Hicksville Illustrated News* presents the statement to the student government by Miss Sandy DelPercio.

It has been reported that the student vote met with a caustic faculty comment that the "Student Council's vote doesn't count."

"I think 9th graders should be allowed to remain in the Junior High as they have in the past because some 9th graders are not mature enough to handle the peer pressure, the added freedom and decision making the high school atmosphere brings.

"Because our high school has never had 9th graders as part of their student body the older age range of the students has allowed them certain privileges. One of these privileges is an open campus. If the younger students cannot handle the responsibilities of this freedom it could not only cause discipline problems for the younger students but could possibly lead to revoking open campus privileges for the older students. If this should happen the resentment shown to the younger students coming into the school will make the transition even harder.

"This year being president of the Student Council has taught me many things. I have learned what being responsible for myself, as well as for others, means. If I had been given this opportunity in the 8th grade I do not think I would have been able to accept the responsibilities given to me to the fullest extent. I have learned to organize functions such as the Battle of the Sexes, the Talent Show, and the various school dances. Speaking for myself, and many others, I do not think these functions would have been a success if we were asked to participate as 8th graders. I think last year most of us were

In the July 19th issue of the *Hicksville Illustrated News* there was a CAPTIONED reprint of Hicksville resident children attending nine non-public schools! It is a matter of public record and clearly stated that it was included in the report of the Secondary Committee to the Superintendent of Schools. In fact, it is an actual reprint from the report.

It is an excerpt from the report bearing on the possible future of the organization of Hicksville Public Schools.

It should be of interest to any parent whose child may promote from any elementary school into an educational environment different from that previously experienced in Hicksville.

Free copies are available at Hicksville High School and the Hicksville Public Library.

There is no criticism of private or parochial schools nor those who choose to attend them. Rather it does show that the burden on the Hicksville Public School System is cost-lesened by students attending those learning institutions.

*Editor's Note:* The Secondary Committee has worked over a year for its recommendation on projections and had to have a starting base. It used 1979-1983 to establish a stable curve. There was no ulterior motive that 1984-1985 was not included in the reports — the years used established the overall trend indications desired.

A reduction of \$20,468 cut the proposed increase in the first budget submitted from \$1.99.00 per 100 to \$1.66.00.

As previously reported in the *Hicksville Illustrated News* the official rate will not be established until Nassau County sets the assessed valuation of the Hicksville School District. Based on the mini-boom in building a slight reduction is expected.

This newspaper has been alerting Hicksville taxpayers to the fact that the Oyster Bay Town Board has overruled the Hicksville School District and continues to grant commercial tax abatements on new buildings.

This places a heavier tax burden on ALL Hicksville taxpayers.

## With A Little Help

Going to the beach. Lugging much too much stuff. Shambling over the scorching sand, sinking in, surveying the vast stretch that lies between you and the water, you sometimes feel like Lawrence of Arabia after his camel ran away.

Without a camel, how can you cope? There is a way — a cart designed to go through deep sand and big enough to hold all your gear. Then when you arrive at where you want to settle, the cart opens out into a multi-position, 43" lounge chair that you can flop right down on as soon as you've unloaded it. It's about 153 from Comfortably Yours, 52 West Hunter Avenue, Maywood, N.J. 07607 (201) 368-0400. It has a white-enamelled aluminum frame and a blue-striped body, weighs 13 pounds and folds to fit in your trunk. (If carrying is difficult for you, check with your doctor to be sure that pulling is a safe substitute motion.)

If you love sun but can take just so much of it, consider "Sun-Mate" the seat with its own (detachable) umbrella. This is a blue cotton seat with a non-adjustable back on a tubular steel frame and a rope handle for carrying. Lillian Vernon, 510 South Fulton Avenue, Mount Vernon, N.Y. 10550-5067 (914) 633-0300 has it for \$22.33 postpaid.

Another beach chair with its own shade is a four-position blue canvas armchair with a 22" x 21" canopy. Its 25" high back gives full support for your neck and it's about 175 from Brookstone, 127 Vose Farm Road, Peterborough, N.H. 03458 (603) 924-9511.

Then there's a folding beach chair that rotates 360 degrees so that as the earth revolves around the sun, you can too — without get-

ting up and moving your chair. Arrange your stuff in a circle around you and then simply swivel to reach everything. The four-position armchair is tubular with a fabric body. The "Sunswiveler Chair" sells for \$75.90 from Ways and Means, 28001 Citrin Drive, Romulus, Mich. 48174 (800) 654-2345.


If you are in a wheelchair, consider getting your shade via a Universal Support Arm (about \$125) and its umbrella holder (about \$10). The Arm is made to hold your camera, phone receiver, etc., but you can also get book, tray, fishing-rod and hair dryer holders. They run about \$10 apiece and some can be used for holding hobby equipment, tools, etc. Order them from surgical supply shops or from Maddak, Inc., Pequannock, N.J. 07440 (201) 694-0500.

To get to the beach easily in your wheelchair, try the new access ramps at Neptune Boulevard and National and New York Avenues in Long Beach. These ramps are near handicap parking, lead to within 15 feet of the high tide mark as well as to the rest rooms and in conjunction with its famous boardwalk, help to make Long Beach one of the most accessible beaches in the world.

(Considering that that boardwalk has withstood 79 years of assault by (how many?) millions of bare feet, not to mention hurricanes, the elephants who helped build it must have known what they were doing.)

## Contract Bridge B. Jay and Steve Becker

### A Common Sense Conclusion

Opening lead — queen of hearts.

One of the first general principles learned by the serious bridge player is the "Eight ever, nine never" rule. In effect, it states that when the queen is the only high card missing in a suit, declarer should finesse the jack when his combined holding is eight or fewer cards, but play for the drop of the queen if he holds nine cards or more.

This is certainly good advice, since it reflects the percentages that can be found in any table of bridge probabilities. Nevertheless, percentages sometimes have to take a back seat to the

special circumstances of a particular deal.

That was the case in this deal, where South found the winning route to six spades. He took the heart lead with the ace, crossed to the ace of spades, and ruffed dummy's last heart before drawing a second round of trumps.

Next came a diamond to the king and a diamond return. When East followed with the ten, declarer, disdaining the "nine never" rule, successfully finessed the jack. He later lost a club to the king to finish with twelve tricks.

Note that if South had played the ace instead of the jack, he would have gone down one, losing a diamond and a club.

Although it could be argued that declarer merely made a lucky stab, the fact remains that it was the correct play in this instance because, win or lose, South was sure to make the slam.

Suppose the finesse had lost. In that case, West would have found himself in an utterly hopeless position. He would have to return either a club into the A-Q, or a heart, allowing declarer to discard a club from dummy while ruffing in his hand. Either way, the slam was guaranteed to succeed.

Generally speaking, percentages are very reliable, but nothing is more trustworthy than old-fashioned common sense.

**HOUSE CALLS**

**Do The Buyers Tip?**  
Dear Edith: We are in the process of buying a home shown to us by a broker. She is not the sellers' broker directly but has clearly been designated as sharing in the sale.  
We have called on her a number of times to arrange the house inspection, water test, mortgage application appointment etc. Do we owe her any money or any kind of tip? Or is that how the game is played; in other words, that she works for us to assure that the sale goes through for the seller?  
This is our first purchase and we just don't know. — O.N.  
The broker is, as you realize, working for the seller. Her services to you are considered part of that job.  
Except in the rare instance where both buyer and seller agree to it in advance, she may not accept remuneration from both sides. I'm sure you can understand why a

tip might be construed as a bribe to favor you over the seller, to whom she owes first loyalty.  
If you particularly appreciate the broker's work, write a note of appreciation to her firm, and recommend her to your friends.  
**Sale Fell Through**  
Dear Edith: I purchased a home in Virginia when I thought my home, which I have lived in 46 years, was sold. The deal fell through, but I am still going to buy the new place. If I were to rent my old home and keep it on the market for sale, and move into my new home, when I sold would I still be eligible for that one-time tax break? I am 65. — Mrs. O.M.  
Your question is not a simple one, and court cases have been fought with the IRS on the matter. Talk with a real estate lawyer or an accountant.  
The rule is that if you change the place to rental property, you lose the homeown-

ers' tax breaks. On the other hand, if you merely rent it as a convenience before selling, you can still claim it as your own residence, you can see there's plenty of room for confusion.  
It helps if the sale takes place within a year, and it must take place within two years, or the homeowners' tax treatments wouldn't apply in any event. It also helps if you can prove you kept the property listed for sale while it was rented out.  
**Deed Lost, Stolen or Destroyed**  
Dear Edith: If deeds to property are destroyed, lost or stolen, where can you get a duplicate or an authoritative reasonable facsimile, to show ownership (valid for selling)? — Ms. D.Q.  
When you sell a parcel of real estate, you do have to prove ownership, but you don't do it by showing an old deed, so don't worry about a lost one.  
The deed transferred ownership in the past; a new one will transfer ownership next time. The old deed should have been entered in the public records. If it was, you can call the county and ask about obtaining a duplicate, but you probably don't need one.

**Doing The Right Thing**  
Dear Edith: I took back a purchase money mortgage for five acres of land in 1980. The buyers have faithfully made their payments and the final one is due this month. I want to do the right thing for them as they are naive about business matters, so I will tell them about the certificate of satisfaction and recording it.  
But should my lawyer prepare an abstract of title for them? My own abstract just shows a title search up to 1980. Shouldn't there be something in it showing my sale to them? — Mrs. V. S.  
It's enough to turn over your present abstract to the buyers at the same time you give them the signed certificate of satisfaction. If they ever sell the property, they'll need to update the abstract at that time.  
When pricing your home for the market, ignore original cost, assessment and insured value. Factors that do count are detailed in the leaflet "Pricing Your Home To Sell." The 52-year-old athletic director was public relations chairman for the United States Committee for the XV World Games for the Deaf from 1981-1985, and was the United States Deaf Olympic Wrestling Coach in 1973, 1977 and 1981. He is a former chairman of the ECAC Division III Football Committee and is a member of the ECAC Eligibility Committee. Getchell has recently been named assistant coordinator of media relations for the U.S. Olympic Sports Festival.

## Nassau Sports Review

By JACK WHITE

With the 1985-86 scholastic season completed, it is time for all statisticians to record the accomplishments of the teams and the individual exploits of the many fine athletes who competed in Nassau this year. For me, it means updating the Section Eight record book.

Over the past few years, with the help and support of Executive Director Bernie O'Brien, I have been researching the county's high school sports history. Some weeks back, this column introduced some of the results of that research. In the coming weeks we'll feature a series of reports on Nassau sports history including baseball, track, soccer, tennis, football and more.

To kick off the series, let's look back at baseball on the North Shore. Until 1978, Nassau sports were governed by two bodies, the North Shore Athletic Association and the South Shore Athletic League. The N.S.A.A. crowned champions in baseball for 51 years from 1928 through 1978. Oddly, it wasn't until 1945 that the two leagues agreed to have their champions meet for a Nassau title.

In the early years, the dominant team was Mineola under the late coach Ken "Dutch" Hafner. Through his long and highly successful career, Hafner's teams reached the finals a record 16 times and won 10 championships.

Hicksville was a power in the early years, reaching the final game six times in the first nine years. The Comets have always fielded a competitive diamond squad as is evidenced by their five North Shore championships. Glen Cove also captured five titles.

Until 1954, the North Shore consisted of two divisions. The Western division included Glen Cove, Garden City, Mineola, Manhasset, Great Neck and Port Washington. The Eastern division consisted of Farmingdale, Oyster Bay, Hicksville, Roslyn, Sea Cliff (now North Shore High School) and Westbury.

From 1954 until 1978, the N.S.A.A. expanded from 12 to 29 teams, and from two divisions to four. Most successful among the "newcomers" were Bethpage, Levittown Division and Clarke. Clarke coach Jack McDonald recently completed his 28th season. In 1985 he became the first Nassau baseball coach to win 400 games.
