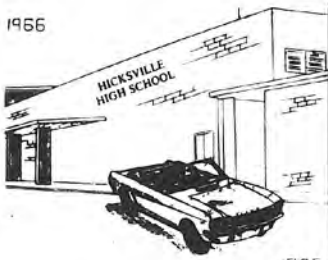

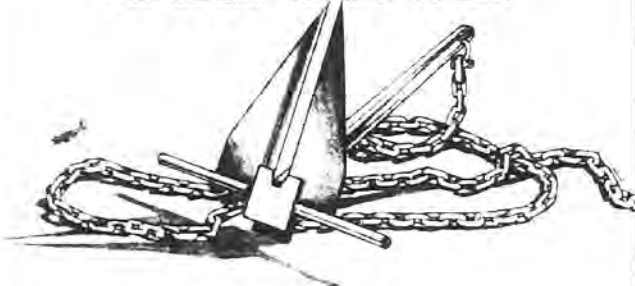

Unpaid Fire Volunteers Deserve Total Support

It's that time of the year again—the Hicksville Fire Department is about to host their 58th annual parade and drill on Labor Day. This event for 57 years has thrilled and pleased residents young and old.

This seems to be a better time than ever to reflect on what it's like to be a fireman in the Hicksville F.D. and to explain to the residents of Hicksville who don't understand, how much we are involved.

This department responds to many fire and medical alarms 24 hours a day in the heat of summer and the cold of winter. This department stands ready during times of trouble—such as blizzards and hurricanes—and also answers many malicious false alarms. The average residents do not understand how much time is put in by these volunteers. We must attend two training courses a week, three meetings a month, and attend the Nassau County Fire Service Academy with a minimum of four weeks a year. Some of the firefighters spend months at a time training to be medical personnel, all while still performing their every day job responsibilities. We all spend many countless hours away from our loved ones and friends to serve our community.

This department is made up of many dedicated individuals who are willing to give their valuable time at great personal risk to protect the lives and property of their fellow residents.

We actually save the Hicksville community substantial cost savings by not having a paid department and receive no compensation except for the knowledge that we've helped to make Hicksville a much safer town for all to live in.

I have heard some complaints from residents who are against the fire department holding these events. As Labor Day is approaching—and the 58th annual parade and drill, I feel that these events are not only community involvement, but a much better way for the residents to know their fire department.

Most of the Hicksville community can be thankful that as of yet, they haven't needed the fire department's service, but it should be a fantastic feeling for them to know that we stand ready and prepared to help one and all.

Spring Pond, Jericho, L.I.

Hicksville—Jericho Reflections

The lives of Hicksville and Jericho residents were so intertwined from early Colonial days that until 1950 the communities were regarded as one.

The Spring Pond pictured was on the site of the present Millridge. It is not covered and is the roadway approaching the restaurant.

The building in the photo was the original historic Hicksville home an eighth of a mile from the intersection of Hicksville-Oyster Bay Road and Jericho Turnpike.

It was the meeting place on cold winter nights for ice hockey games between Jericho and Hicksville High School teammates, as well as keen competitors from Oyster Bay, Brookville, Locust Grove and Oyster Bay. After skating the Hicksville lads would walk to the Sweet Shop for hot chocolate and toll house cookies. Rumor had it that the pond had no bottom and that a horse and carriage had met its fate there one foggy night. That theory was disproved when local boys walked across it with a fish net to catch the gold fish.

The house, with extensions, was converted into a restaurant during the early thirties by the Roberts family of Sea Cliff.

It was the original Maine Maid, a Quaker oriented establishment which did not serve liquor.

It, however, served marvelous New England home style cooking and was the warm choice for diners particularly on festive Christmas and Thanksgiving holidays.

Many students from Hicksville High secured employment in the restaurant during the depression years. On Saturday nights, just before closing, Mr. Roberts could be seen purchasing the Maine Maid's Sunday vegetables at the local A&P or Frank DeMonaco's premium vegetable stand.

The fresh, crisp vegetables were able to be purchased at a reduced rate.

Not Miller Ridge

The picture of the lake is a boon to those who espouse the correct pronunciation of the eating establishment.

It is not Miller Ridge.

In Colonial days and during the lifetime as the Maine Maid, the lake washed against a stone ridge that serpentine around the south side of the building.

The water was wheeled by a mill — as one would see in many English countryside towns.

Thus the name is derived from Mille Ridge.

When the Maine Maid moved across Jericho Turnpike to its present location in the historic Jericho compound, the structure was named Mille Ridge.

Soon after a Texas family named Miller purchased the restaurant causing the resulting misconception.

The Millridge today is an enlarged charming dining house with a large loyal clientele.

Christmas decorations are famous the world over and the atmosphere retains a yesterday ambience.

Hicksville Taxpayers Still Punished As Assessed Value Soars

Hicksville School District taxes will rise to approximately \$1.72 per \$100 dollars of assessed valuation despite an \$11,324,904 increase in total valuation for 1986-87.

Figures were released by Abe Seldin, Nassau County Commissioner of the Board of Assessors.

The total taxable for Hicksville only rose \$80,174 out of the almost \$12 million increase.

Jericho's value increased at the same rate with taxpayers there gaining a 2.737 per cent increase. The taxable valuation for Jericho went up \$1,714,999 on a base of \$38,957,830.

The Hicksville Board had estimated an increase of \$1.66 per hundred in its 1986-87 budget submission.

The extraordinary low increase is attributable in large part to the massive tax abatements the Oyster Bay Town Board accords some builders in the hamlet.

Hicksville Illustrated News recently ran a series on this aspect to alert its readers in 12,000 residential Hicksville homes.

Seldin explained by state law Nassau County's tax roll is divided into four parts:

- Class one is one, two and three family homes and condominiums of three stories or less.
- Class two is apartments, and residential cooperatives and condominiums of more than three stories;
- Class three is public utility property; and
- Class four is essentially commercial and industrial properties and vacant land.

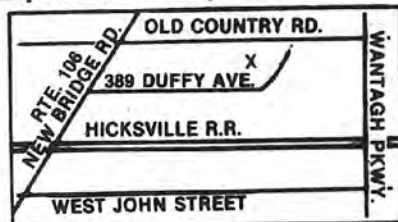

How to Avoid Guesswork

The bidding:

There is no denying that a certain amount of guesswork is inevitable in bridge. However, it is also true that some guesses are self-inflicted, and can be avoided with correct play. In these cases, a player has only himself to blame if he subjects himself to a guess and then goes wrong.

Consider this deal where West led the ten of clubs against three notrump. The jack was covered by the king and ace and declarer, after cashing four diamonds, then had to decide whether to tackle hearts or spades.

When he led a low spade from

dummy, East alertly rose with the ace and returned a club. Declarer ducked West's eight, but another club drove out the queen. South now had only eight tricks, and when he tried for a ninth by leading a heart, West took the ace and cashed two clubs for down one.

Had declarer guessed to attack hearts first, he would have made his game, since this would have removed West's entry before the clubs became established.

However, the outcome was due not so much to an unlucky guess as it was to declarer's play. Had he ducked East's king of clubs at trick one, he would have averted subsequent guesswork.

The practical danger is that West has five clubs and a side ace. By ducking the opening trick, declarer can disrupt the opposing communications.

Assuming East returns a club, South wins and can attack either spades or hearts and make his contract. If spades are chosen, East can win but has no club to return, giving declarer time to develop a heart trick later.

Alternatively, if South tries hearts first, West can win, but he loses the entry to his clubs in the process, after which spades can be safely broached.

No guesswork is really necessary at all.

DUNRAVEN IN THE WRONG

Investigating Committee Finds Vainkyri's Owner Was Mistaken.

CUP VICTORY FAIRLY WON.

Evidence Proves the Allegations of Fraud Against Owners of the Defender to Have Been "Based Upon a Mistake"—Complete Exonerations of the Charges Made Against Them by the Earl.

New York, February 3.—The famous case of Lord Dunraven against C. Oliver Iselin and the yacht fraternity of this country has been decided, and Dunraven has lost. The special committee which was appointed by the New York Yacht Club, at the request of Mr. Iselin, to probe the charges which were made by the Earl of Dunraven in a published statement, and reiterated by him in a speech before a number of his countrymen, submitted its report at the special meeting called for that purpose. The report was a complete vindication of the Defender syndicate and a victory for Mr. Iselin. Every point in the great amount of testimony has been carefully considered by the committee in its report, and so well has every important feature been treated that it gives a good idea of the proceedings, even to those who have not time to read the great amount of testimony which was taken in the case. The committee consisted of ex-Minister E. J. Phelps, J. Pierpont Morgan, ex-Secretary W. C. Whitney, George L. Rives and Captain A. T. Mahan, of the Navy.

After carefully reviewing the evidence presented in the investigation, the report says: "Upon a careful consideration of the whole case, the committee are unanimously of the opinion that the charge made by Lord Dunraven, and which has been the subject of this investigation, had its origin in mistake; that it is not only not sustained by evidence, but is completely disproved; and that all the circumstances indicated by him as giving rise to his suspicions are actively and satisfactorily explained. They deem it therefore, but just to Mr. Iselin and the gentleman concerned with him, as well as the officers and crew of the Defender, that the committee should express emphatically their conviction that nothing whatever occurred in connection with the race in question that casts the least suspicion upon the integrity or propriety of their conduct."

"And the committee are not willing to doubt that if Lord Dunraven had remained throughout the investigation, so as to have heard all the evidence that was introduced, he would, of his own motion, have withdrawn a charge that was so plainly founded upon mistake, and that has been so unfortunate in the publicity it has attained and the feeling to which it has given rise."

On motion the club deferred final action until February 18. This was done to give Lord Dunraven time to apologize. Should he fail to do so it was believed that the club would expel him.

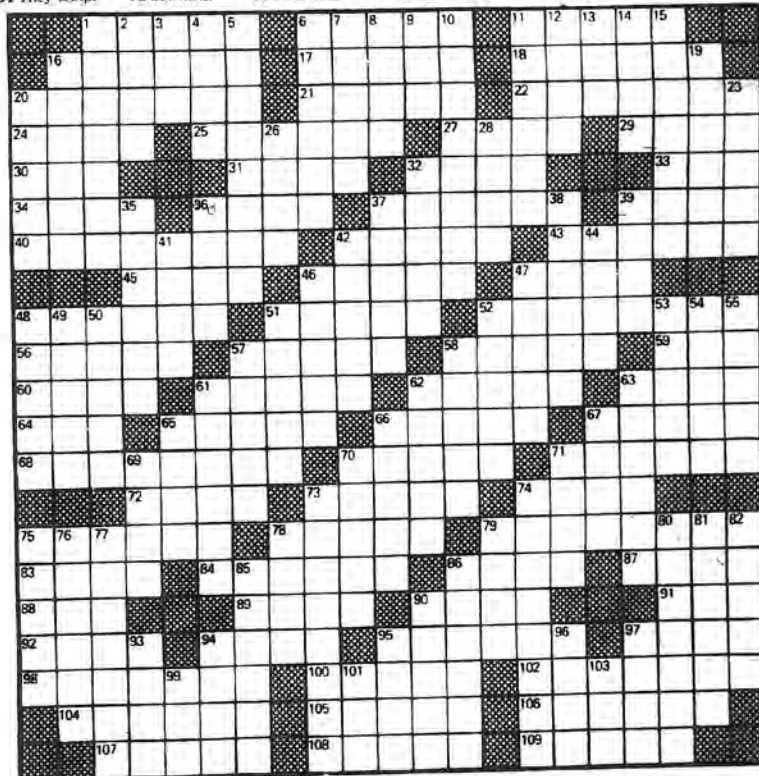

North Shore Polo Is Back

Polo is taking hold of the North Shore again. At the White Haven Stable across from the C.W. Post campus, horses are being trained for the sport.

After 10 years in advertising, Janet Eastwood has found her niche working with polo horses at the stable in Old Brookville. She takes care of 25 horses. The owner of the stable is Al Bianco, the president of the Meadowbrook Polo Club.

Polo is a tough sport and the horses have to be fit and agile. To keep them that way they are exercised daily. That means three miles of galloping and one-and-a-half miles of jogging every day. That is Janet's job.

There are 24 horses at White Haven. Of them, she is training 12 horses. At the stable there are six other horses that play polo regularly.

The Shearson Lehman Brothers Invitational Polo Cup game on July 26, at Bethpage State Park, brought the game back to Long Island. The Meadowbrook Polo Club is looking for a sponsor to keep it here. Several of the riders from the group are from our area.

This is the third annual Shearson Lehman

Brothers Invitational Polo Cup, and each year the event has generated increased interest in polo. In 1985 NBC used the event to produce a 10-minute primer, which aired on "Sports World." The three-hour event itself was televised on cable by ESPN.

Another good week of Fluke fishing all around, especially around Fire Island Inlet. Snappers are getting bigger. Seamanneck Park was loaded with Snappers (Seaford). Crabs are a little slow and still a little small, things should get better as the weeks go by. Should be a good late August for Crabs. Flounder fishing has just about ended with a few still in the deep holes. Last week I mentioned that raw chicken in Crab traps was good bait, as Killie's have been difficult to obtain, well it looks like the price of chicken might make it cheaper to buy Killies. I guess you can't win. Blue Fishing is still good especially around Huntington Bay area some big choppers have been marauding the area. Here's a tip for Fluke fishing: use long and flowing bait as it looks natural, long strips of Fluke belly and a Killie will work better than a rig with spoons, feathers, etc. If you get a few small Snappers, freeze them for Fluke

bait. The doormats love those little Snappers. If you're going Crabbing, string as many Killies as you want on pieces of wire about 12" long and then freeze them this way you can take 4 or 5 everytime you go, making it handy, cleaner and easier.

Remember throw those little ones back.
