One Christmas Day In Hicksville

It is at least 44 or 45 years ago this Christmas season that our family came to Hicksville to visit Grandma's cousin. We usually came here in the summer. It was very cold—but I enjoyed the ride. I was five years old—and coming from Hollis by car was an adventure.

I remember riding by St. Ignatius (my parish now) and all the stores. We sometimes came down East Marie Street or Barclay Street to get to Miller Road (off Woodbury Road). Our cousin George lived there with his sisters and a friend. When we arrived he couldn't contain himself. He said, "You'll have to see my Christmas tree—but it is so cold on the porch—wear your hat, coat and gloves!" (He told me this after I had taken them off. I thought he didn't like me and wanted me to leave.)

This was a live tree—like the one we had at home... only so beautiful. I think that he probably had two large trees chopped down, uniform in size, bore holes in the trunks and two trees became one. It took George and Charlie a month to decorate it. He also had white bed sheets under the tree. And he had a train set, winding around a village, with houses and a church. (I don't remember if there were stores too.) The more questions I asked, the more excited he became. I asked him: "It is so cold out here, when will you take it down—at Easter?" I gazed at the tree for two minutes but the memories lasted a lifetime. I sometimes walk to that house—stand outside—and look and think about my childhood.

I remember another Christmas in Hollis. The year was 1948 and I was 11. Up until then I never had a really sad Christmas, but since my brother Bud died that May, two days before heart surgery, I had no desire for Christmas. My mother couldn't get me to leave my bed to look at the Christmas tree. I eventually did and the tree was beautiful. Mom had it plugged in. It stood on that white bed sheet. I didn't see any gifts, but for some reason I looked toward the mantelpiece. There stood this blue and white two-wheeler. I read the tag: Merry Christmas, Love Bud. I cried and asked, "How could he?" My mom said, "Buddy saved every coin he had at the end of the week in an old Atlantic City taffy barrel, the one he kept on his dresser. He saved half the money and I supplied the rest, Deanne. When you had polio last year Buddy thought you could use a bike to make your legs strong."

I could feel Bud's presence and spirit in that room. That Christmas I dreaded... because he wouldn't be there... but he was!

A Letter from Lulabelle...

...It's Christmas, Christmas Christmas!!!... and I am in my usual wonderful green and red fog, absolutely certain that I'll never be done—and I know that, impossible as it sounds, I will be... I love to decorate—my family vows that if they don't move quickly, I'll decorate them!... Every room has some decoration—a tree, an angel, a wreath—sometimes all three!... and have you noticed that, without even thinking about it, family traditions emerge!... Suddenly your kids and grandkids are saying, "Oh, we have to have the tree in that corner—it's a tradition" and "No, we can't go downstairs in the morning until Dad turns the lights on the tree—it's a tradition"... and isn't it wonderful!... And every year, I go through the Christmas shops and look at their beautiful trees all done so precisely in one color with garlands meticulously draped in careful curves from bough to bough—and I think, that looks wonderful, I should try that... Then I go home, get out the boxes of decorations from many years of trees—and I can't bear to eliminate even one of the wonderfully old battered ornaments we have always had—the ones the kids made from colored paper in kindergarten—and the peculiar ones we had on our first tree in World War II when ornaments were hard to find, and the ones a dear aunt made with baby pictures of our kids in each globe... They are old, tired, battered—and very, very precious... and I wouldn't part with a single one... Christmas is for me and mine—and I still believe in Santa Claus and he never lets me down... to all of you, a special holiday—whatever you celebrate—as long as it's with those who are special to you.

Then we would rush off to church, "So you don't forget the true meaning of Christmas!" Mom would say.

I also remember the frazzled look on Mom's face after getting caught in the hustle-and-bustle of holiday shopping. Exhausted, she would come home and say, "I didn't find anything," then she would add teasingly, "Looks like you're going to get coal this year." After which I would say, "It's OK Mom. You can

get me only 20 of the 21 things I asked for," and walked away feeling like Brer Rabbit.

The whole family used to go looking for the biggest and fullest tree in the world to put in our living room. We would spend the day upstate looking for a tree like the one on Broadway. Wasn't that one huge, with all its pretty lights? Then we would drive past the firehouse and admire all the sparkling decorations.

And do you remember what really began the Christmas Season? It was when Santa Claus came around on the fire engine. We'd hear the engines honking all around the neighborhood and would wait outside to get bombarded with popcorn balls from Santa. This year when Santa came around again, my Mom and I stood on our front steps waving and yelling for some of those popcorn balls. All of sudden we heard a fireman shout, "Nail 'em! Nail 'em!" as popcorn balls were pitched at us as if Gary Carter were on the steps.

Well, things have changed. This year, my parents divorced. My brother will be stationed on a gray aircraft carrier somewhere in the Pacific, and Grandma isn't well enough to entertain.

Mom and I, both struggling College students now, will not be able to have all the plentiful things we have had in the past. But the memories of Christmas-past still flicker in our minds as we thank God for the happy times when the family was together. This Christmas will not be as simple as all the other years, and it will not be the same in many respects. Sure, things could be much harder for us, but this year I have learned what will be the most important lesson of my life. I have learned that my mother is my best friend. She really does know more about life than I do. She is an expert in the field of boyfriends, not to mention girlfriends, school, peer-pressure, and so many more harsh realities that life has hit me with. She always took the smallest piece of pie, the thinnest blanket, the hardest chair, raked more leaves, shovelled more snow as I goofed with a snowman, and always got in trouble with Dad everytime she made us late—but she was helping my brother and me get ready.

These are by no means the greatest things she had done, not the meakest. But I never thought of how much a mother sacrifices for her children. She gives more than she can, and I love her for that.

This year I already know what my present is; but it took me 21 years to find out that I've always had it and I've never asked for it.

Merry Christmas Mom. I hope I can give my kids all the things that you have given me. I love you.

In Our Opinion

The Great Neck Board of Education has been discussing eliminating the ranking of seniors in order of their class averages and it seems that this proposal has a lot of merit.

In today's schools students take many courses which are of greatly varying degrees of difficulty—for example, it's a lot easier to take regular track mathematics than it is to take advanced placement mathematics yet if the grades are used as they are earned, not weighted, they can make a great difference in a student's final average and, hence, his rank in class. In fact, some students have declined taking some of the more difficult courses only to keep their rank in class high, believing that this rank is of prime importance in acceptance to prestigious colleges. College admissions directors have said in most cases that rank in class in only one among many factors leading to the acceptance of a student and they have no difficulty with students from schools which do not rank.

Many fine schools including nearby Roslyn do not rank students.

And statistically, if a student's average is 94.00, should he be ranked above a student whose average is 94.05? The difference is so small as to be insignificant, yet in schools such as those here in Great Neck, many students are this close or even closer.

To look at the other side, it is very special for a student to know that he is first or second in his class, particularly if the class is of the high caliber found locally.

We would welcome comments from students, parents, educators and the general community.

This deal occurred in a team-of-four match. Maybe what happened on the hand shouldn't have happened, but the fact is that it did.

At the first table, where Team A held the North-South cards, the bidding went as shown. South had no good reason to think that six spades could be defeated and he bid seven hearts, not expecting to make it but entirely willing to suffer a small loss in order to avoid the possibility of a

large one.

However, to his surprise, South wound up making the grand slam when West made the abominably bad lead of the ace of spades instead of the ace of clubs. South got rid of both his club losers on dummy's diamonds and came out smelling like a rose with a fantastic score of 2,470 points.

This outcome was surely sad enough from Team B's viewpoint, but matters got infinitely worse at the second table where the bidding went:

South	West	North	East
4♥	4♠	5♥	5♠
6♥	6♠	Dble	Pass
Pass	Pass	Pass	Pass

This time Team A's East-West pair got to six spades on the bidding shown and again came out on top when North chose the king of hearts as his opening shot. Declarer ruffed, drew trumps, and lost only a diamond trick to rack up an additional 1,660 points.

So the extraordinary outcome was that Team A gained 4,130 points on this one deal.

Of course, North could have stopped six spades by leading a diamond instead of a heart, but his team would still have lost 2,270 points on the hand. There was simply no way for North to make a significant dent in the huge loss his teammates had sustained at the first table.

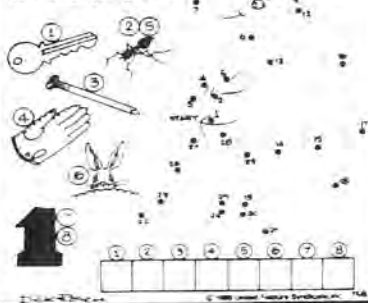

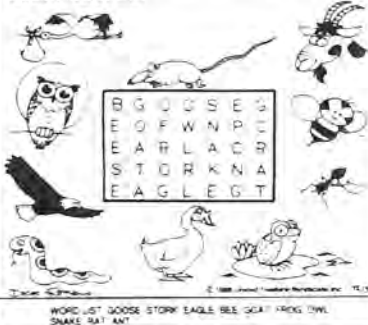
