One Christmas Day in Hicksville By DEANNE F. PURCELL

It is at least 44 or 45 years ago this Christmas season that our count came to Hicksville to visit Grandma's cousin. We usually came here in the summer. It was very cold—but I enjoyed the ride. I was five years old—and coming from Hollis by car was an adventure.

I remember riding by St. Ignatius (my parish now) and all the stores. We sometimes came down East Marie Street or Barclay Street to get to Miller Road (off Woodbury Road). Our cousin George lived there with his sisters and a friend. When we arrived he couldn't contain himself. He said, "You'll have to see my Christmas tree—but it is so cold on the porch—wear your hat, coat and gloves." (He told me this after I had taken them off. I thought he didn't like me and wanted me to leave).

This was a live tree—like the one we had at home...only so beautiful. I think that he probably had two large trees chopped down, uniform in size, bore holes in the trunks and two trees became one. It took George and Charlie a month to decorate it. He also had white bed sheets under the tree. And he had a train set, winding around a village, with houses and a church. (I don't remember if there were stores too.) The more questions I asked, the more excited he became. I asked him: "It is so cold out here, when will you take it down — at Easter?" I gazed at the tree for two minutes but the memories lasted a lifetime. I sometimes walk to that house—stand outside—and look and think about my childhood.

I remember another Christmas in Hollis. The year was 1948 and I was 11. Up until then I never had a really sad Christmas, but since my brother Bud died that May, two days before heart surgery, I had no desire for Christmas. My mother couldn't get me to leave my bed to look at the Christmas tree. I eventually did and the tree was beautiful. Mom had it plugged in. It stood on that white bed sheet. I didn't see any gifts, but for some reason I looked toward the mantlepiece. There stood this blue and white two-wheeler. I read the tag: Merry Christmas, Love Bud. I cried and asked, "How could he?" My mom said, "Buddy saved every coin he had at the end of the week in an old Atlantic City taffy barrel, the one he kept on his dresser. He saved half the money and I supplied the rest, Deanne. When you had polio last year Buddy thought you could use a bike to make your legs strong."

I could feel Bud's presence and spirit in that room. That Christmas I dreaded ... because he wouldn't be there... but he was!

A Letter from Lulubelle ...

...It's Christmas, Christmas Christmas!!... and I am in my usual wonderful green and red fog, absolutely certain that I'll never be done—and I know that, impossible as it sounds, I will be... I love to decorate—my family vows that if they don't move quickly. I'll decorate them!...Every noom has some decoration—a tree, an angel, a wreath sometimes all threet... and have you noticed that, without even thinking about it, family traditions emerget...Suddenly your kids and grandkids are saying. "Oh, we have to have the tree in that corner—it's a tradition" and "No, we can't go downstains in the morning until Dad turns the lights on the tree—it's a tradition"...and isn't it wonderfull?...And every year, I go through the Christmas shops and look at their beautiful trees all done so precisely in one color with garlands meticulously draped in careful curves from bough to bough—and I think, that looks wonderful, I should ry that...Then I go home, get out the boxes of decorations from many years of trees—and I can't bear to eliminate even one of the wonderfully old battered omaments we have always had—the ones the kids made from colored papet in kindergarten—and the peculiar ones we had on our first tree in World War II when ornaments were hard to find, and the ones a dear aunt made with baby pictures of our lids in each globe...They are old, tired, battered and very, very precious...and I swith a single one...Christmas is for me and mine—and I still believe in Santa Claus and he never lets me down...to all of you, a special holiday—whatever you celebrate—as long as it's with those who are special to you.

The Great Neck Board of Education has been discussing eliminating the rank ing of seniors in order of their class averages and it seems that this proposal has a lot of merit.

In today's schools students take many courses which are of greatly varying degrees of difficulty for example, it's a lot easier to take regular track mathematics than it is to take advanced placement mathematics yet if the grades are used as they are earned, not weighted, they can make a great difference in a student's final average and. and, hence, his rank in class. In fact, some students have declined taking some of the more difficult courses only to keep their rank in class high, believing that this rank is of prime importance in acceptance to prestigious colleges. College admissions directors have said in most cases that rank in class in only one among many factors leading to the acceptance of a student and they have no difficulty with students from schools which do not rank

Many fine schools including nearby Roslyn do not rank students.

And statistically, if a student's average is 94.00, should he be ranked above a stu dent whose average is oa os? The dif ference is so small as to be insignificant. yet in shools such as those here in Great Neck, many students are this close of even closer

To look at the other side, it is very special for a student to know that helis first or second in his class, particularly if the class is of the high caliber found locally
