



The Greater New York Automobile Dealers Show is coming up soon in February I haven't gotten my press tickets in the mail ver, but I'm looking forward to them. Last year I photographed the Corvette they envision as the dream car of the, future. This week I received a picture of the Peugeot of the future. They have a lot in common on the lock of it. A sist cen-

tury look They are different and yet similar. They look as if they were kept in the wind tunnel a attle too long.

Both cars nace an oval snaped top that is all glass. They both have a low windswept They both have a depression in the COK side to delineate the door as opposed to the older look of the fenders sticking out.

Jean Derampe, a senior engineer at the automaker's LaGerenne research center in France, explains the idea behind the Proxima: "We call it 'Peugeotechnology' Instead of a wild dream, the Proxima is a synthesis of systems that are already being proven in our laboratories."

Here is Peugeot's vision, a fully functional prototype unveiled in Los Angeles:

The roof is a glass bubble, with ventilation of the four-passenger cockpit provided by solar-cell power. The electronic pilot and navigation system includes five color ideo display units, managed by two central computers with 40 megabytes of memory.

An anti-collision radar continuously scans the road ahead. The radar image is displayed on a screen together with the stopping distance at the speed of travel and current road conditions. Television cameras replace rearview mirrors.

Other safety features include electronic * monitoring of tire pressures. If the pressure of one tire drops, the central computer will indicate the maxiumum speed not to be exceeded.

The disk brakes are made of carbon liberfor powerful braking and high temperature stability. The anti-skid braking system prevents wheel lock. 1

The four-wheel drive transmission is engaged only as needed. Rear-wheel drive is used until the Proxima's computer senses that wheelspin is about to occur

The ooo horsepower V6 Peugeot engine is a high-tech masterpiece. It has four valves per cylinder and two turbochargers. Each spark plug has its own ignition coil. Fric-tional losses are minimized through the use of ceramic linings on bearings and shafts. Engine management systems are computerized, including fuel injection, ignition and turbocharger boost pressure.

The Proxima is named after the star in the Centaurus constellation that is the closes to our sun, 4.27 light years away. The car is a lot closer than that







Opening lead - king of hearts No bidding is given with this hand because the deal itself is a mythical one where it is imagined that the final contract is seven notrump, which would certainly be a bad contract if ever there was one.

Having dreamt up the hand, which is given to demonstrate one of the rarest plays in bridge, and in order to preserve whatever chance there is to make all thirteen tricks, it behooves us to win the opening lead with the ace of hearts and then start worrying about how to make each and every trick when there are only eleven tricks in view

Not only are there only eleven tricks, but there does not even appear

seven notrump, to be the semblance of a twelfth, let alone a thirteenth.

Nevertheless, we can proceed to make them all, and strange to say, it is not even a difficult proposition. All that has to be done is to keep right on playing and the thirteen tricks fall

right into your lap. The first thing to do is to cash all five diamond tricks. There is no trouble discarding from dummy, but if you can imagine putting yourself in West's shoes you will find a situation that no aspirin in the world can cure That character can discard two of his hearts on the third and fourth diamonds led, but what does he do for a discard on the fifth diamond? He will have to release a spade, a hear or a club, and as soon as he parts with any one of them you have suddenly moved into the twelve-trick bracket. Not only that, but whichever suit he unguards, you then continue the

relentless squeeze by cashing the trick he has just established for you. This, in turn, then compels him to unguard one of his two remaining suits, and as soon as he does that you gain another trick - number thirteen.

This could go on and on forever if there were more suits in the deck for West to guard, but let's not be sadistic about the whole matter. West has already reached the end of the trail.

Yes; as you pay down the loan, fewer dol-las are due for interest, and more of each paye-ment can so toward reducing the principal.

The Investor's Corner By JOSEPH P. FREY, Ph.D.

"What Goes Up Comes Down-Eventually"

Rule =0 of "How to Get Rich" is to protect yourself from disaster. To play the stock market under ther rule and to protect your profits I advocate a device callled a "stop order", sometimes known as a "stop loss" order. With the market up now, we can call it a "protect profit" order.

A stop order costs nothing yet it can save you plenty. It is a powerful device to guard

against losses or to let profits increase. All of us know how to buy stock. We establish a brokerage house relationship; fill out some easy forms: buy the stock or other investment; and pay for it. When we tell the broker to buy or to sell we are placing a market order which means that we have told the brokerage house to sell the stock "at the market", the price on the exchange when our order reaches the floor.

Most of us have some system or criteria for buying-few know when to sell. Selling is the hard part because we can be wracked with indecision. We ask ourselves, is it going lower? higher? why?

The use of a stop order takes the decision out of your hands. The market decides when to sell. A stop order allows you to minimize your losses; to recognize mistakes early; and still leave you with a nest egg to invest again. It is protective, not perfect. It also protects your profits.

If it does all of these wonderful things, why do so many stockbrokers discourage its use. Maybe it is an ego thing because they are not advising you. The standard response is that sometimes you will be sold out and the stock will go up and you lose out. True!! but only true one out of twenty times.

When we invest it is essential that we understand that no one, no one, has a batting average of 1000. We will make mistakes. Even when the market advances on a broad basis there are new lows every day.—some stock advances and others decline. Bernard Baruch understood this. He anticipated that he would be wrong 8 out of 10 times, yet he went from rags to riches. His strategy was to limit your losses and ride your winners. So, with a 200 batting average, how did he get rich? He practiced what he preached-you can do the same thing with stop orders.

How do they work? A stop order is an instruction given to your broker to sell a par-ticular stock at a specific price. When and if that price is reached, your instruction becomes a market order. It will be sold at the market price. Itels not a guaranteed price. You can do this with any investment-stock, bond, future, or commodity contract. If you sell "short"

(another article) you buy the stock to protect yourself. An example: you purchase a stock at 450. At the time you place a stop order to sell at 45 (always 10 to 15% below). If 45 is reached, you get sold out at or near 45. You cancel

the stop order and replace it with a 55 stop order. You keep doing this, cancelling and rasing until such time as the stop order gets triggered. You are saved sweat, pain and anguish. If you have a loss, you can invest in something else to recoup. If you have a gain, you come away clean. It is simple and easy. You will have followed the principles of Bernard Baruch. Baruch. All of us should be so fortunate.


