A Letter from Lulabelle...

...Passing under the raised railroad tracks in our little home town led to thinking about the way it was when we were kids when the tracks were down at road level. In our town there were several tracks and the distance between the gates was quite wide. The gates were operated by hand by a man who came out of his little house by the side of the track and let them down (and later up) by turning two handles, one clockwise and the other counter. As I remember, he was always very grouchy to the kids waiting for the train to pass—now that I consider it, I suppose he was nervous about his responsibility. He always looked very scruffy, bundled up for his continued running in and out—and he always smoked a pipe. The smoke was echoed by the smoke which curled from a crooked pipe on the roof of his little house. When darkness fell, he came out with four old fashioned kerosene lanterns which he hung on each of the gates on both sides of the track. Sometimes foolish people would duck under the gates and cross the track before the train came, and then the gateman would yell!!!! There was also a freight station at that crossing and all sorts of exotic looking packages bulging with excelsior (whatever happened to excelsior—that was before those little white plastic pellets which shoot all over when you open a package) were unloaded onto the platform which was as high as the freight car door. As kids who seldom travelled, we were fascinated by those packages from faraway places. I hear many people complain about how the raised tracks have "unurbanized" our little villages—and something is different, its true—but when I remember how fire trucks, ambulances, and the police were held up from their rescue missions because the gates were down and a train was in the station, I can't think too much has been lost.

General Tax Payments

Oyster Bay Town Receiver of Taxes Gary F. Musiello reminds residents that the first half of the 1987 General Tax Levy is due on Jan. 1.

"By law, a taxpayer has a 40-day grace period from the date the tax is due during which payment may be made without penalty," Musiello explained. "After that 40 days, a 1% penalty is added for each month the tax remains unpaid, retroactive to January 1st."

Residents can pay in person at the Tax Office, Oyster Bay Town Hall West, Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, at Town Hall South, 977 Hicksville Road, Massapequa, or they can pay by mail. The Town Clerk's Annex, Newbridge Road and Duffy Avenue in Hicksville, will be opening to accept 1987 tax payments from 9 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. on Feb. 4, 5, 6, 9 and 10th.

When paying in person at the Tax Office citizens are reminded to bring the entire tax bill with their payment. Payment being made by mail for the first half of the year should include Stub No. 1 only. Stubs No. 1 and No. 2 should be included if the entire tax for the year is being paid.

Musiello also cautioned residents NOT to write on, cut, fold, staple or otherwise deface the tax stubs as it can cause the computer to reject the payment.

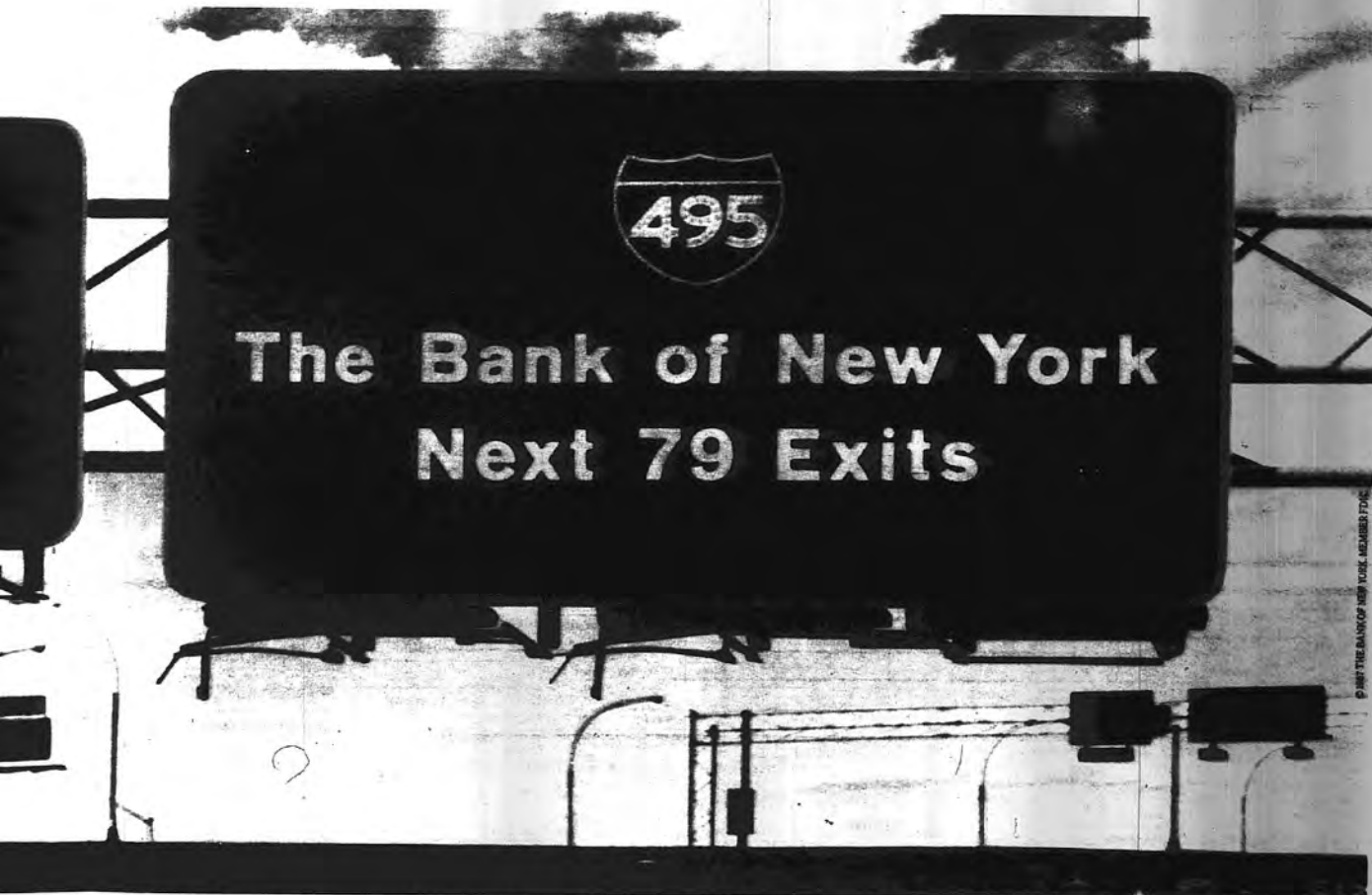

Plays which are virtually automatic on the great majority of deals can be completely wrong in some situations. For this reason, declarer should make an effort not to play impulsively, no matter how automatic a play may seem to be.

Consider this case where South reached three notrump as shown and West led a spade. Declarer won East's eight with the nine and played a diamond to the jack, losing to the king.

East's spade return was taken by the king in dummy, and South tried to

reach his hand by leading a club to the queen. However, West won the queen with the king and returned a heart to dummy's king.

With no entry to his hand for another diamond lead toward dummy, declarer tried leading a low diamond from the table, hoping the ace was now singleton. But West won with the ten and threw dummy back in with a second heart. A diamond was conceded to the ace, whereupon West led a heart to East's queen to set the contract one trick, the defenders scoring three diamonds, a club and a heart in all.

Declarer's error may not be readily apparent, but that's because the mistake occurred on an "automatic" play. The hand was lost at trick three when South won East's spade return in dummy with the king. Instead, declarer should have taken the trick with his ace, even though this meant decapitating dummy's king!

This play would have enabled South to lead a second diamond toward dummy, assuring the contract if West had the missing diamond honor and the suit divided 3-2, the most likely possibility. West could win the diamond on this trick or the next one, but with declarer's J-2 of spades acting as a stopper against West's suit, South was certain to score four diamonds, two spades, two hearts and a club for his contract.

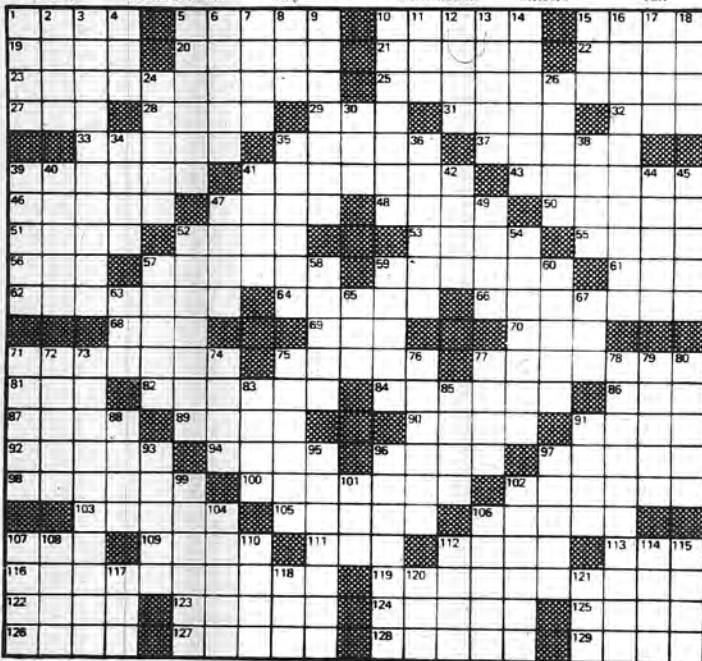

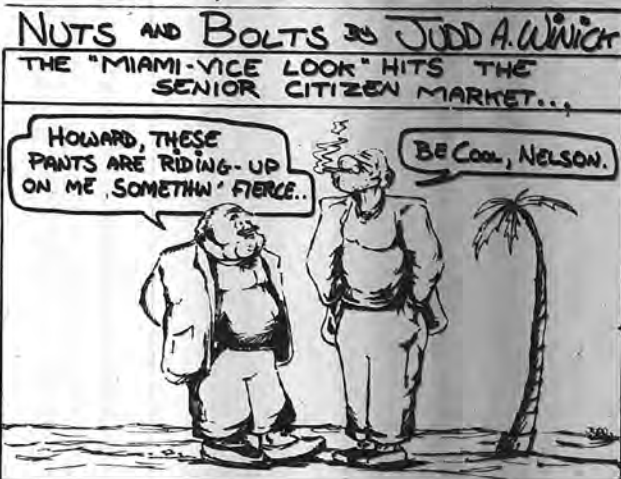
Many different people help to make any organization a success. We are very proud of our many volunteers and are again profiling one of our coaches.

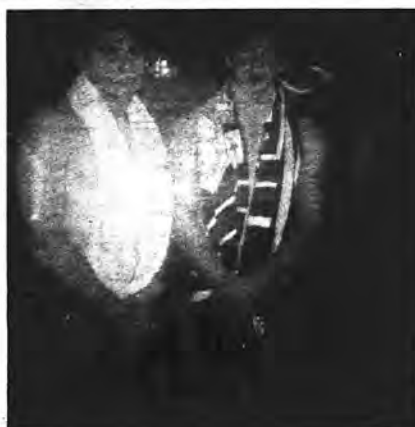

Hicksville Residents Urged To Enter 10K Run

Sponsors of the Plainview Long Island Championship 10 Kilometer Run have issued a special invitation to runners from Hicksville and Plainview-Old Bethpage to compete in the 10th annual running of the race, to be held on Saturday morning, April 11.

All proceeds of the event will be donated to the Sloan Kettering/Hospital for Special Surgery Children's Prosthesis and Rehabilitation Foundation to fund an innovative program aimed at helping young amputees reenter the world of sports.

The program, which is called ASPIRE-A Sarcoma Patient's Intense Rehabilitation with Exercise-provides young amputees with the prosthetic devices, rehabilitation and therapy they need to participate in athletics. The program is under the direction of Paddy Rossbach, herself a leg amputee who has overcome her handicap to become the first female amputee to successfully complete the New York Marathon.

More than 1,000 runners throughout New York metropolitan area, from 12-minute milers to topflight competitors, are expected to participate in this year's race. The event

is sponsored by David Lerner Associates, the Syosset-based investment firm, in conjunction with the Plainview-Old Bethpage Road Runners Club.

The run, which will start and finish at the H.B. Mattlin Middle School in Plainview, is the first major race of the spring season and among the largest on Long Island. Since it is sanctioned by The Athletics Congress of the United States (TAC), personal times can be used to qualify for TAC events throughout the country.

In addition, this year's event will include drawings for two round-trip tickets to the San Francisco Marathon and a week's vacation for two at Gurney's Inn in Montauk, as well as numerous age-group, team and special awards. A new feature is that the top male and female winners will have their names engraved on "The Lerner Cup."
