Hicksville residents and representatives of Jerry Spiegel Associates met to discuss Speigel's plan to demolish three existing residential structures and construct an office building at the corner of West John and

Strong Streets.

The preliminary plan includes locating one of the entrances/exits on Strong St. Residents said the fire trucks would be delayed with the increase in traffic generated from the proposed building. The volunteer firemen must get in through Strong St. to the fire house, get their trucks and equipment and then get out of there; resident Helen Lafferty said. She added that if the fire trucks could not exit onto West John St. they would have to travel north to James St. which is a residential area, then to Maple Place and onto West John St. which would cause a delay in response time. She also said, "There should be absolutely no exit or entrance on Strong St. They are already encountering problems from the Doctors Emergency Office Center" which is located on the northeast corner of West John and Strong Streets.

Residents also said that the fire department services the entire northwest area of Hicksville including Burns Avenue Elemen-tary School. William S. Cohn, attorney for Spiegel Associates, said, "If the fire strens go off and the fire engineering same control of off and the fire engines are coming out, and somebody is in the parking field, they are go-ing to stay. I think that most right-minded people are not going to come out if the fire engines are there." He added that he does not engines are there. He added that he does not know if the parking area can be designed to eliminate an entrance on Strong Street. "If I can do something to eliminate the traffic on Strong Street!" A Sackett Street resident who is also a volunteer fireman said, "We've had problems with the traffic already. I think this is going to add to it. You have commuters who park on Strong Street now. We have double parking [currently], I'm sure you are going to have deliveries during the day and that is going to cause dovible parking."

Also of concern to the residents is the exterior appearance of the building. Residents said that the property is currently poorly maintained. Mr. Spiegel has owned this property for the last couple of years and the residents say that the houses on the land "look like slums and are an eyesore." Mr. Cohn said that Spiegel Associate's "inherited" those conditions and they have been emptied of their occupants. He also said that they will provide some guarantees of proper maintenance. When residents suggested that Mr. Spiegel build homes on the lot, Mr. Cohn said, "Look at that property and what's around it on West. John Street. Many people will agree that it shouldn't be for houses." West John Street is mostly commercial.

Ouestions were asked as to what Mr. Questions were asset as to what Mr. Spiegel would do with the property and the houses if their proposal to the town was turn-ed down, and if they were also denied a per-mit from the courts. Arrhur Sanders, a Spiegel associate, said they do not know what they will do with the crustures. will do with the structures

Although the plan for the building is in its Although the plan for the building is in its initial stages, Rosemary Islieb, architect of the building, said that the area of the site is 54,444 square feet and the area of the site is 54,444 square feet and the area of the proposed building is 21,800 square. She also said that two exits are proposed, one on Strong Street and the other on West John Street. "All parking would be below grade," she said, "As you drive on West John you basically don't see the cars and we will provide a landscape buffer and a wall." There will be 100 parking spaces provided. The developer is also trying to rezone the area to all-business. Currently the property is part residential and part business.

## Large Drug Shipment In Chocolate is Seized in Hicksville

What federal authorities are describing as the third largest shipment of illegal cocaine ever found in the United States was seized at a Hicksville warehouse last Thursday by a task force of federal and state detectives.

The Drug Enforcement Administration said the illicit drugs were discovered on June 24 by a U.S. Customs Contraband Enforcement Team concealed in boxes of "unsweetened Ecuadorian cocoa chocolate" in a vessel named "Allyson Lakes", which ar-rived in Port Newark, N.J. carrying two 20-foot containers. Because the ship came from Ecuador, said to be a major supplier of cocaine, agents checked the shipment carefully and when they found the contraband, in-vestigated thoroughly.

The shipment was brought June 30 by a local trucking firm which had no knowledge of the criminality, to "Toronto Imports, Inc at 100 Tec Street in an industrial section of Hicksville, just north of Old Country Road. Efforts to obtain information about this company were unsuccessful and one source described it as a "front". Calls to its listed number were not answered.

The containers held 1200 cartons of

powdered chocolate and more than 5000 pounds of cocaine, with a street value close to \$500 million dollars, according to a DEA spokesman. At 8:40 p.m. June 30, after the containers were unloaded and three Colombian nationals known to authorities had been identified, the task force moved in, arrested the three and seized the shipment. The three men apprehended were identified as Oscar Nunez, 28, of Jamaica, Queens; Jaime Enri-que Caro, 48, of Corona, Queens; and Absalon Borrero, 42, who gave a Miami address. The Borreto, 44, who gave a manufacture of the prosecuted in federal court on charges of importation, distribution and conspiracy to distribute cocaine. The Queens address given by Mr. Nunez did not appear to be genuine, a source said.

The task force was composed of the DEA, U.S. Customs Service, New York State Police, Nassau and Suffolk Police departments and the FBI. The District Attorney's offices in Nassau and Suffolk were also said to be

participating.

### Systemic Lupus Erythematosus - A Disease of Inflammation

can affect any organ in the body. No one knows the cause of lupus, but women are eight to ten times more altected than men. For some reason, the body's immune system furns against itself and attacks healthy tissue. The result of this attack is inflammation and mury to the involved organ.

Repurchase Agreements

I have started to see TV ads for people to invest in this type of financial instrument. The returns are very good, higher than a C/D or a US Treasury bill, or note. The security seems superb, usually US Treasury notes or bonds. It is with a bank that has size and apparent stability. Everything is absolutely right. So, why an article?

Repurchase agreements, or repros as they are called, CAN be excellent investments.

or repros as they are called, CAN be excellent investments with a high return. They are just another investment (paper) in the vast varieties of paper on the street available for the public to buy. You can buy them and enjoy all of the benefits that they offer. I am writing this articles of that you will know what you are buying and what risks you are taking.

Risks? How can there be risks when I invest in a repro that is backed up by US Government securities which the bank gives me as collateral. In addition, the bank gives me a contract that says they will buy them all back from meat a specific date. What can be the risk?

These can be good investing at saylong as you know what you are buying. This article tells you what the bank does not, or if they do, it is in the contract if line print. The first thing that you should know is that these instruments are not eof these you are making a LOAN to the bank and they give

Dr. Joseph P. Frey deposits. When you buy one of these you are making a LOAN to the bank and they give you collateral as protection in case anything goes wrong at the bank. Because it is not a deposit, you DO NOT have FDIC or FSIC deposit insurance coverage. So there is an added risk. The second thing that you should know is the bank can count the face value of the bond as the collateral value. This means that the face value, not the true MARKET of the bond as the collateral value. This means that the face value, not the true MARKET value, is the collateral amount. This is allowed in the regulations. You can bet your bottom dollar that the market value of the collateral is below the face value. This means that if something happens to the bank, like bankruptcy, you have as your collateral an investment that is worth less than your LOAN (yes, loan) to the bank. You hold the bag if it goes under. How will you know if they are below market value? Look at the coupon rate of the collateral on the contract. If it is below the present market rate, the value will be less than the market value. be less than the market value.

I know what the bankers out there are saying to themselves. My bank has no risk, these are absolutely safe investments. It is probably true. However, if three or four years ago you had purchased a repro from the BOWERY SAYINGS you would have taken tremendous risks. It was near bankruptcy then (not now) before it was sold to a private group. My point is that you should know what you are buying when you buy ANY financial instrument. Repros are only one of many. I am not saying that you should not make the investment. I am saying that you must know the risks when you do. It is not up to the bank to tell you what weaknesses there are in these instruments. You are supposed to know it is your responsibility.



So what should you do when you want that higher yield. First, make sure the bank is safe; not in trouble or in danger. Let me add, that I know of no bank or thrift in the NY metropolitan area that is in serious trouble. I know a lot of them outside of this area that are. So be careful if your broker suggests REPROs for a bank in other states. There, the risk may be substantial. You can be almost positive that the collateral is weak.






