

## Hearing for Spiegel's Rezoning Request

A night hearing will be held for Spiegel Associates' proposal to the Town of Oyster Bay to construct a two-story office building at the intersection of West John Street and Strong Street in Hicksville. The proposal involves demolishing residential structures numbers 92, 102 and 106 and rezone the area. The hearing will be held on Tuesday, July 12 at 8 p.m. at Town Hall, Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay.

## Hearing Set on Closing Of Jeanson Place

The closing of Jeanson Place, Hicksville, will be the subject of a Tuesday, August 9, public hearing of the Oyster Bay Town Board, according to Town Councilman Thomas L. Clark. "Three years ago, the Town Board made Jeanson Place a one-way street into Mid-Island Plaza, now known as Broadway Mall," Clark explained. "This solution has proved unsatisfactory to the surrounding residential community, so the board feels the answer may be to close off the street entirely to any traffic."

The meeting is scheduled for 10 am in the hearing room of Town Hall East, Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay.

## Highway Improvements

The Oyster Bay Town Board has approved a bid for storm drainage and highway improvements in Hicksville, according to Oyster Bay Town Councilwoman Ann R. Ocker.

The town has awarded a road construction and highway improvement contract for Edward and Walter Avenues, Ocker said. The project will include curb and apron improvements and the installation of catch basins for improved drainage where necessary. At the completion of the project all areas will be repaved.

Guy Pratt, Inc., of Holtsville was awarded the contract with a low bid of \$507,255. Construction is expected to begin by the end of the summer.

## Residents: Building Plan Conflicts with Local Fire House

Volunteer firemen may have a difficult time responding to an alarm from the fire house on Strong Street if a developer constructs an office building adjacent to the station, residents said last Thursday at a

community meeting.

Hicksville residents and representatives of Jerry Spiegel Associates met to discuss Spiegel's plan to demolish three existing residential structures and construct an office building at the corner of West John and

Strong Streets.

The preliminary plan includes locating one of the entrances/exits on Strong St. Residents said the fire trucks would be delayed with the increase in traffic generated from the proposed building. "The volunteer firemen must get in through Strong St. to the fire house, get their trucks and equipment and then get out of there," resident Helen Lafferty said. She added that if the fire trucks could not exit onto West John St. they would have to travel north to James St. which is a residential area, then to Maple Place and onto West John St. which would cause a delay in response time. She also said, "There should be absolutely no exit or entrance on Strong St. They are already encountering problems from the Doctors Emergency Office Center" which is located on the northeast corner of West John and Strong Streets.

Residents also said that the fire department services the entire northwest area of Hicksville including Burns Avenue Elementary School. William S. Cohn, attorney for Spiegel Associates, said, "If the fire sirens go off and the fire engines are coming out, and somebody is in the parking field, they are going to stay. I think that most right-minded people are not going to come out if the fire engines are there." He added that he does not know if the parking area can be designed to eliminate an entrance on Strong Street. "If I can do something to eliminate the traffic on Strong Street I'll make the effort to do it," he added.

A Sackett Street resident who is also a volunteer fireman said, "We've had problems with the traffic already. I think this is going to add to it. You have commuters who park on Strong Street now. We have double parking [currently]. I'm sure you are going to have deliveries during the day and that is going to cause double parking."

Also of concern to the residents is the exterior appearance of the building. Residents said that the property is currently poorly maintained. Mr. Spiegel has owned this property for the last couple of years and the residents say that the houses on the land "look like slums and are an eyesore." Mr. Cohn said that Spiegel Associates' "inherited" those conditions and they have been emptied of their occupants. He also said that they will provide some guarantees of proper maintenance. When residents suggested that Mr. Spiegel build homes on the lot, Mr. Cohn said, "Look at that property and what's around it on West John Street. Many people will agree that it shouldn't be for houses." West John Street is mostly commercial.

Questions were asked as to what Mr. Spiegel would do with the property and the houses if their proposal to the town was turned down, and if they were also denied a permit from the courts. Arthur Sanders, a Spiegel associate, said they do not know what they will do with the structures.

Although the plan for the building is in its initial stages, Rosemary Islieb, architect of the building, said that the area of the site is 54,444 square feet and the area of the proposed building is 21,800 square. She also said that two exits are proposed, one on Strong Street and the other on West John Street. "All parking would be below grade," she said, "As you drive on West John you basically don't see the cars and we will provide a landscape buffer and a wall." There will be 109 parking spaces provided. The developer is also trying to rezone the area to all-business. Currently the property is part residential and part business.

Spiegel Associates will present their plan to the town board Tuesday.

## Concerns and Replies About Spiegel's Proposed Building

Residents' Concerns & Questions and Spiegel's Atty. William S. Cohn's Replies

Q. What will happen if there is a fire and the area is heavily congested with traffic?  
A. The occupants of the building will generally arrive during the morning and leave at night. If they hear sirens people aren't going to get up and block them [the fire engines].

Q. How can we be guaranteed that the exterior appearance of the building will be properly maintained?  
A. The building is an expensive investment and they will maintain it.

Q. Can you eliminate putting an entrance on Strong Street?  
A. I don't know but it's something that has to be looked into.

Q. Do you have another proposed exit and entrance?  
A. Yes, on West John Street.

Q. How many parking spaces will there be?  
A. 109.

Q. How many tenants do you plan to occupy the building?  
A. Arthur Sanders, a Spiegel associate said, "Our goal is one."

Q. Why don't you build houses on that lot instead of an office building?  
A. Look at that property and what's around it on West John Street. Many people will agree that it shouldn't be for houses. West John Street is mostly commercial.

## Large Drug Shipment In Chocolate is Seized in Hicksville

What federal authorities are describing as the third largest shipment of illegal cocaine ever found in the United States was seized at a Hicksville warehouse last Thursday by a task force of federal and state detectives.

The Drug Enforcement Administration said the illicit drugs were discovered on June 24 by a U.S. Customs Contraband Enforcement Team concealed in boxes of "unsweetened Ecuadorian cocoa chocolate" in a vessel named "Allyson Lakes", which arrived in Port Newark, N.J. carrying two 20-foot containers. Because the ship came from Ecuador, said to be a major supplier of cocaine, agents checked the shipment carefully and when they found the contraband, investigated thoroughly.

The shipment was brought June 30 by a local trucking firm which had no knowledge of the criminality, to "Toronto Imports, Inc." at 100 Tec Street in an industrial section of Hicksville, just north of Old Country Road. Efforts to obtain information about this company were unsuccessful and one source described it as a "front". Calls to its listed number were not answered.

The containers held 1200 cartons of powdered chocolate and more than 5000 pounds of cocaine, with a street value close to \$500 million dollars, according to a DEA spokesman. At 8:40 p.m. June 30, after the containers were unloaded and three Colombian nationals known to authorities had been identified, the task force moved in, arrested the three and seized the shipment. The three

men apprehended were identified as Oscar Nunez, 28, of Jamaica, Queens; Jaime Enrique Caro, 48, of Corona, Queens; and Absalon Borrero, 42, who gave a Miami address. The trio will be prosecuted in federal court on charges of importation, distribution and conspiracy to distribute cocaine. The Queens address given by Mr. Nunez did not appear to be genuine, a source said.

The task force was composed of the DEA, U.S. Customs Service, New York State Police, Nassau and Suffolk Police departments and the FBI. The District Attorney's offices in Nassau and Suffolk were also said to be participating.

The seizure was the third largest shipment taken in this country and the largest outside Florida. All photos by Cathy Greenfield

### Systemic Lupus Erythematosus - A Disease of Inflammation

Systemic lupus erythematosus (lupus) can affect any organ in the body. No one knows the cause of lupus, but women are eight to ten times more affected than men. For some reason, the body's immune system turns against itself and attacks healthy tissue. The result of this attack is inflammation and injury to the involved organ.

Lupus can begin as fever, weakness, weight loss and fatigue. If the inflammation involves the skin, a butterfly rash may occur on the face. If the joints become involved, arthritis can ensue. In the more severe forms of the disease, the lungs, the heart, the kidneys, the blood, the muscles, and even the brain may be attacked.

The diagnosis of lupus can be very difficult.

Your physician will need to obtain a careful history of your illness, and perform a complete physical examination. Specialized blood tests are also often required.

Rheumatologists (specialists in lupus) usually treat the mild form of the disease with simple medications. If the inflammation is severe and many organs are involved, your rheumatologist may begin more powerful medications. Additionally, a program of rest, exercise, balanced diet, avoidance of sunlight and emotional support groups may be recommended.

## The Investor's Corner By Dr. Joseph P. Frey

## Repurchase Agreements

I have started to see TV ads for people to invest in this type of financial instrument. The returns are very good, higher than a C/D or a US Treasury bill, or note. The security seems superb, usually US Treasury notes or bonds. It is with a bank that has size and apparent stability. Everything is absolutely right. So, why an article?

Repurchase agreements, or repos as they are called, CAN be excellent investments with a high return. They are just another investment (paper) in the vast varieties of paper on the street available for the public to buy. You can buy them and enjoy all of the benefits that they offer. I am writing this article so that you will know what you are buying and what risks you are taking.

Risks? How can there be risks when I invest in a repo that is backed up by US Government securities which the bank gives me as collateral. In addition, the bank gives me a contract that says they will buy them all back from me at a specific date. What can be the risk?

These can be good investments as long as you know what you are buying. This article tells you what the bank does not, or if they do, it is in the contract in fine print. The first thing that you should know is that these instruments are not deposits. When you buy one of these you are making a LOAN to the bank and they give you collateral as protection in case anything goes wrong at the bank. Because it is not a deposit, you DO NOT have FDIC or FSILC deposit insurance coverage. So there is an added risk. The second thing that you should know is the bank can count the face value of the bond as the collateral value. This means that the face value, not the true MARKET value, is the collateral amount. This is allowed in the regulations. You can bet your bottom dollar that the market value of the collateral is below the face value. This means that if something happens to the bank, like bankruptcy, you have as your collateral an investment that is worth less than your LOAN (yes, loan) to the bank. You hold the bag if it goes under. How will you know if they are below market value? Look at the coupon rate of the collateral on the contract. If it is below the present market rate, the value will be less than the market value.

I know what the bankers out there are saying to themselves. My bank has no risk, these are absolutely safe investments. It is probably true. However, if three or four years ago you had purchased a repo from the BOWERY SAVINGS you would have taken tremendous risks. It was near bankruptcy then (not now) before it was sold to a private group. My point is that you should know what you are buying when you buy ANY financial instrument. Repros are only one of many. I am not saying that you should not make the investment. I am saying that you must know the risks when you do. It is not up to the bank to tell you what weaknesses there are in these instruments. You are supposed to know, it is your responsibility.

So what should you do when you want that higher yield. First, make sure the bank is safe; not in trouble or in danger. Let me add, that I know of no bank or thrift in the NY metropolitan area that is in serious trouble. I know a lot of them outside of this area that are. The outcome of most deals is pretty much predictable, but in some deals one side or the other achieves a better result than would normally be expected.

For example, take this deal where South gets to six clubs on the sequence shown. It is true that six notrump is a much better contract; in fact, it cannot be defeated regardless of how the East-West cards are divided.

But theory and practice are two

different things, and South wound up playing the hand at the practical contract of six clubs instead of the theoretical contract of six notrump.

The slam would have gone down one but for an unusual play by declarer. West led the ace of hearts and he would surely have led another heart had South followed suit with the five.

But declarer, concluding that West would lead another heart if he played his five on the ace, played his king on the ace! It then became difficult for West to continue with either the queen or a low heart and, rightly or not, he played the jack of diamonds at trick two.

This permitted declarer to make the slam as a direct result of his brilliant falsecard. Perhaps West should have led a second heart, but it was understandably difficult for him to realize that South had dropped the king, a winner, on the ace, instead of the five, a loser.

Actually, South could not have felt certain that his king play at trick one was correct. West's four heart bid theoretically might have been based on six hearts rather than seven, and in that case the falsecard could have proved fatal. But South backed his judgment that West had a seven-card suit, and was eventually rewarded for his exceptionally good play.
