

## Early Morning Patriots Color Local Area

At 5 a.m. July 4, Mike Campon placed a wooden stick in the ground of a Hicksville residence, and the homeowner shouted out the front window "Don't you light it." But much to the resident's surprise, Mike wasn't lighting a firework, he was planting an American flag, one of more than 2,000 which were placed on the lawns of local homes by Coldwell Banker Real Estate.

Between 4 a.m. and 6 a.m. July 4, representatives from Coldwell Banker, located in the lower level of Sears, made their way through Hicksville planting two foot flags on lawns, Charles Rufe, branch sales manager, said.

Mr. Rufe said that Coldwell Banker employees distributed the flags because they wanted to "thank our market area for being so good to us and for all the good business we have received."

Some of the streets where the flags were planted were April Lane, Angel Lane, Atlas Lane, Arbor Lane, Grape Lane, in the Glenbrook area, Field Avenue and Hollins Road. Distributing the flags were Candy Scotto and her son Brian, a recent graduate of Woodland Avenue Elementary School. This pair dispersed the flags in the Hillside Terrace area. Resident Janice Nolan and her three daughters, Michelle, Jennifer and Christine also participated in the program. June Miller and Marie Napolitano made their rounds through the Levitt section of Hicksville. Geri Kanuck and her two children, David and Chris, planted flags on Field Avenue.

"As we planted the flags, some people waved out the window and said 'thank you,'" Mr. Rufe said. "We had a hard time planting because the ground was hard. We all had blisters on our hands."

This is Coldwell Banker's second year sponsoring this project. More than 50,000 flags were distributed to Long Island homes July 4 by Coldwell Banker.

## Memorials Stolen From Hicksville Church

Officials of a Hicksville church from which 20 assorted silver pieces were stolen last week claim the loss may run to \$100,000, but declined further comment on the robbery which took place between 3 p.m. July 7 and 8:45 a.m. the following day.

Jean Blaha, church secretary, is said to have found the loss when she came to work. She said the chalices, patens and ciboria, used in religious services at the Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, 330 Jerusalem Avenue, were "very old" memorials donated by parishioners of the 90-year-old church.

Mrs. Blaha declined further comment in the absence of the rector, Rev. Dominick Cianella. Police said that entry to the church was made through a storage room window on the side of the building, and that several doors were pried open to gain access to the church office.

In another incident, a Manhattan man who asked a woman customer in the Foodtown store on South Oyster Bay Road to get him a jar of peanut butter reportedly stole the woman's purse while she was complying with the request. This happened at 1:30 p.m. July 8, but the alleged thief, realizing that he was being watched by a store employee to whom the customer complained, is said to have hidden the stolen wallet, containing \$6 and credit cards, on a shelf. Police said the 35-year-old employee, collared Charles VanCleave, 30, a programmer who gave a Manhattan address, and held him for police.

VanCleave was arraigned July 9 before Judge B. Marc Mogil in First District Court, Hempstead, where bail was set at \$7,500 pending further court proceedings.

## Rotary Club Pitches in for Local Youth's Operation

Mr. and Mrs. Robert Nathanson did not have the funds to transport their daughter to the Mayo Clinic in Minnesota for a heart operation, that was, until the Hicksville-Jericho Rotary Club came up with enough funds to cover the costs. As a result, 18-month-old Stephanie of Hicksville should now be undergoing the first of three operations.

The local organization provided a limousine to bring the family to and from the airport as well as round-trip tickets (provided by Mid-Island Travel Bureau) to the clinic for the July 14 operation.

"The family was somewhat at their wits end on how to raise the money," William Hayday, a rotary officer said. "It's a depressing situation for the family. The rotary club would like to meet this challenge and do what we can for the Nathansons."

Stephanie was born with pseudotruncus arteriosus, a condition in which the pulmonary artery does not properly connect to the heart and lungs. As a result, the infant has poor blood-oxygen content and her lips, feet and

hands often turn blue. According to Donna Nathanson, the child's mother, the surgeons will implant a man-made right pulmonary artery. Because no Long Island hospital has the technology to perform the operation, the child's doctor suggested the operation take place at the Mayo Clinic.

The child was hospitalized many times during the past year-and-a-half. She had three cardiac catheterizations, in which dye is injected into the heart area for X-ray purposes.

Because the first operation will cost nearly \$40,000, the Nathansons have turned to family, friends and the general public for financial support.

A fund-raiser will be held by the Massapequa Elks Lodge, Josephine Longabardi, Mrs. Nathanson's mother, said. Relatives are sponsoring garage sales, as well as canvassing door-to-door for donations, she added.

"It's wonderful that someone could help us in this way," Mrs. Longabardi, a Hicksville

resident, said. "It means so much to us."

Mrs. Nathanson, who has lived in Hicksville all her life, said, "We're very grateful for all the financial help we've received. If it weren't for all the generous people, we don't know what we would do."

Local merchants have taken to the cause as well. Those businesses participating in raising funds include Gem Deli, Allied Stationery, Allied Deli, Petro Gas Station, New Brown Bitti Bake Shop, and Pastosa Ravioli. Pastosa is the store from which nearly \$300 was stolen last week. The rotary club heard of the Nathansons' plight through press coverage about the robbery.

"I was surprised how helpful the store owners were," Mrs. Nathanson said. "They've really been great about the whole thing."

Mr. Hayday said, "We do want to help this child. We want to give her an opportunity to start equal."

## TO YOUR HEALTH

### Back Pain May Have Many Causes

One of the most common medical problems referred to a rheumatologist is chronic back pain. Back pain may affect over one half of all Americans some time in their life, and is one of the leading causes of work disability in this country.

Frequently, back pain results from arthritis of the spine, spasm of the back muscles, inflammation of the joints in the back, or pressure on the spinal nerves. This pain can occur at rest, or with movement, such as walking. Additionally, emotional stress and tension can produce back pain. In fact, anything that puts pressure on the spine may result in back pain.

The discomfort of back pain may be only an occasional dull ache, or a severe, sharp, debilitating pain. Most back pain resolves by itself. However, if the pain is very severe, persists, or is associated with pain or numbness in the legs, you should consult your physician.

Proper treatment can only begin once the cause of the back pain is known. A comprehensive examination, including

a complete medical history, and a physical examination are usually required. X-rays, as well as blood tests may be needed to aid in the exact diagnosis.

Fortunately, most back pain can be successfully treated without the use of surgery. Depending on the diagnosis, and if your symptoms do not improve, you may be referred to a rheumatologist (a specialist in arthritis and muscle disorders).

Your rheumatologist can establish an individualized medical program. This may initially involve bed rest, analgesic medication, and local heat. Special anti-inflammatory medications, specific exercises, and physical therapy may also be required if the pain is persistent. You should keep in mind that most back pain will improve with proper medical management, and needless pain could be avoided with prompt medical attention.

Bingo sessions still need more help. Next regular meeting is Thursday, July 14.

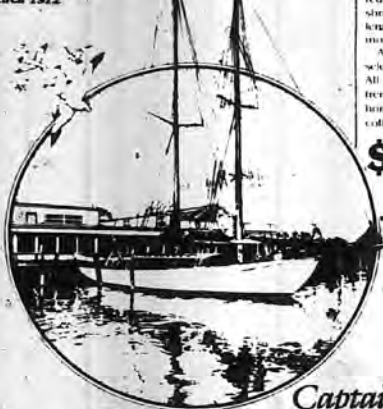

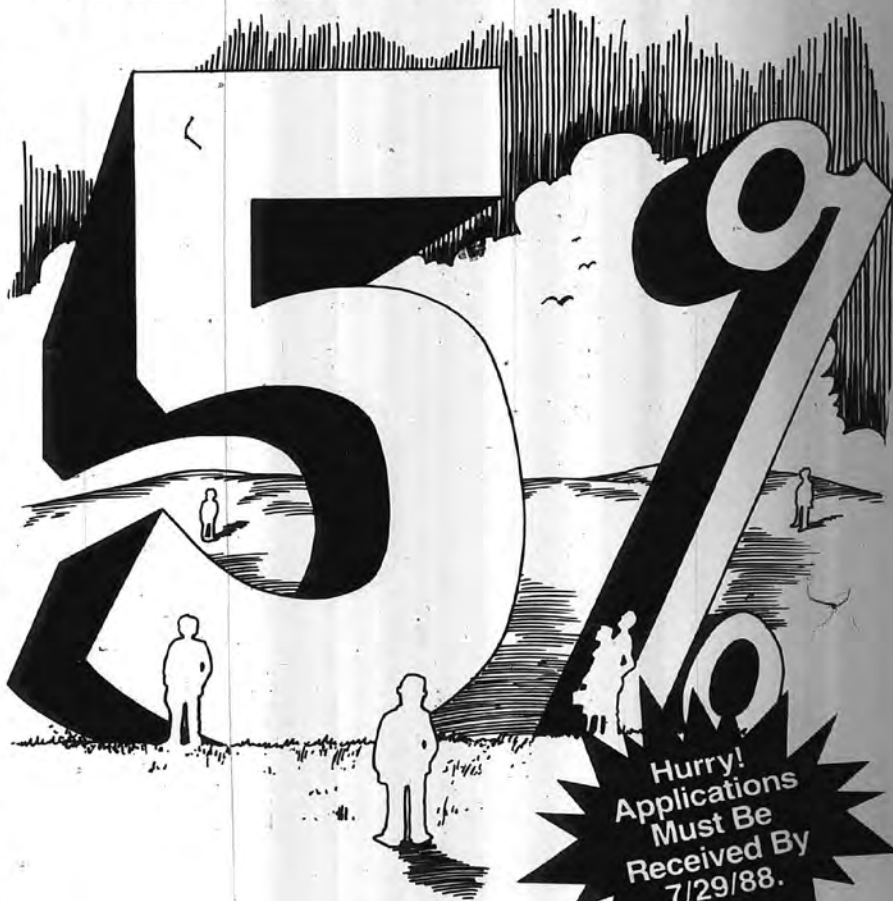

## SUPERVISOR DELLIGATTI



For many Long Island families, visits to relatives are often synonymous with trips to the city. Note that in our suburban jargon "the city" does not necessarily refer only to Manhattan, as out-of-towners might think, but includes Queens, Brooklyn, the Bronx and Staten Island as well. And while family get-togethers are much anticipated and enjoyed, especially by the youngsters, the drivetime associated with them is usually a thing to be dreaded—most especially by the driver.

That city driving is less than popular among suburbanites is understandable. A move east of the Queens border is as often precipitated by the desire for safer and saner roadways as by the lure of backyards and green lawns. We've come to assume, in fact, that the mellower pace of our Long Island lifestyle should inspire more responsible and courteous driving habits than the horn blowing and brake-screaming that pedestrians in the city expect to contend with.

Well, according to certain Long Island traffic experts, our assumptions could be wrong. It seems a pattern of increasing disregard for

traffic control devices has been noticed in the Nassau and Suffolk region. With surprising frequency and nonchalance, Island motorists are running stop signs and red (not yellow) lights, disregarding pedestrian crosswalks, and generally ignoring other rules of the road.

In offering an analysis of the trend, a commanding officer of the Nassau County Police Traffic Safety Unit was recently quoted as saying this seemingly lawless driving mentality "is spilling over from the city." That's too bad, and something I'm sure none of us would opt for or encourage.

It may be true that one person's decision to run a red light in Oyster Bay will not disrupt our suburban quality of life, but if the experts' reports of a trend toward our casual disregard for traffic control regulations are true, the cumulative effect could indeed cify our Long Island streets.

The next time you're tempted to ignore a stop sign or go through a red light—even if you're in a hurry and there are no other cars around—take a minute to consciously consider why a drive into "the city" is probably not one of your favorite things to do.

NBC Nightly News has reported this story, which the DIA debunks. Som Dy escaped from prison in 1984 and went to US officials in Thailand.

## Contract Bridge By Steve Becker

### Born of Despair

East dealer.  
Both sides vulnerable.

#### NORTH

♠ A 7

The bidding:

East South West North  
Pass 4 ♠ Pass 7 ♠  
(Opening lead — king of hearts.)

Desperate circumstances require desperate remedies.

For an extreme example, consider this deal from a team of four match where at each table the final contract was seven spades and West led the king of hearts.

At the first table, declarer won with the ace and, realizing that his thirteenth trick would have to come from diamonds — there were only twelve sure tricks in sight — ruffed a low diamond at trick two. Declarer

was hoping to find the diamonds divided 4-3 or, failing that, to find either opponent with the singleton or doubleton queen.

South then led a trump to the ace and ruffed another low diamond. After drawing trumps, he entered dummy with a club and tried to run the diamonds. Unfortunately, it turned out that East had five to the queen, and the outcome was that South went down one.

The declarer at the second table, upon winning the heart lead, first cashed the A-K of diamonds and then ruffed a diamond high. When West showed out on the third diamond, South realized that he could no longer establish the diamonds with normal play. He was short one entry to dummy for this purpose.

So at trick five, he led a low trump and, after West followed low, played the seven from dummy! The finesse succeeded. South was now home. He ruffed another diamond high, played a trump to the ace, and ruffed the fifth round of diamonds, finally felling East's queen. Then, after drawing West's last trump, he was able to enter dummy with a club to cash the jack of diamonds and so make the grand slam.

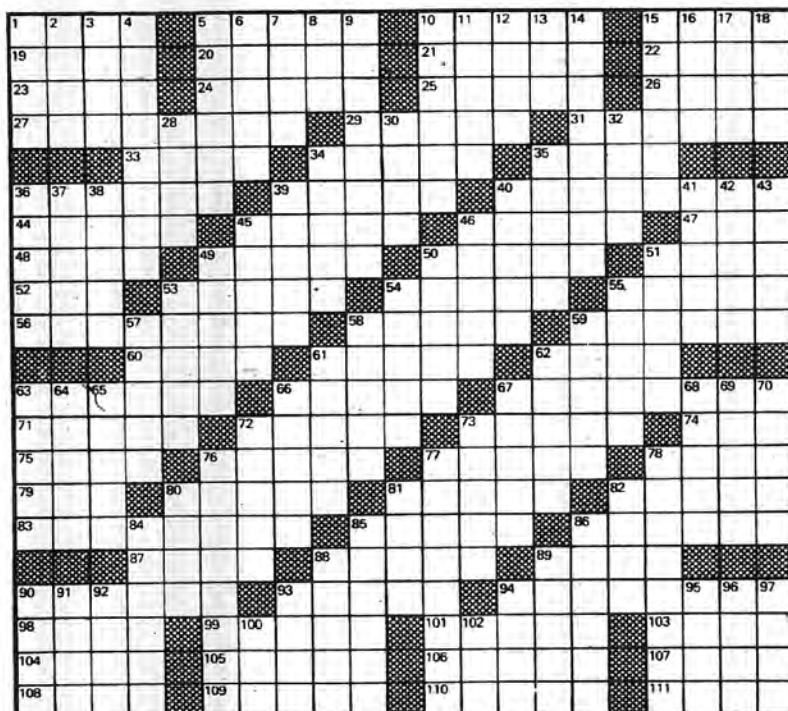

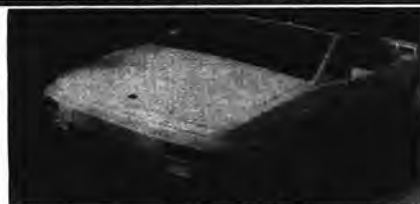
