

Back Pain May Have Many Causes

One of the most common medical problems referred to a rheumatologist is chronic back pain. Back pain may affect over one half of all Americans some time in their life, and is one of the leading causes of work disability in this country

Frequently, back pain results from ar thritis of the spine, spasm of the back muscles, inflammation of the joints in the back, or pressure on the spinal nerves. This pain can occur at rest, or with movement, such as walking. Additionally, emotional stress and tension can produce back pain. In fact, anything that puts pressure on the spine may result in back-pain.

The discomfort of back pain may be only an occasional dull ache, or a severe, sharp, debilitating pain. Most back pain resolves by itself. However, if the pain is very severe, persists, or is associated with pain or numbness in the legs, you should consult your physician.

Proper treatment can only begin once the cause of the back pain is known. A comprehensive examination, including a complete medical history, and a physical examination are usually required. X-rays, as well as blood tests may be needed to aid in the exact diagnosis.

Fortunately, most back pain can be successfully treated without the use of surgery. Depending on the diagnosis, and if your symptoms do not improve, you may be referred to a rheumatologist (a specialist in arthritis and muscle disorders).

Your rheumatologist can establish an individualized medical program. This may initially involve bed rest, analgesic medication, and local heat. Special antiinflammatory medications, specific exercises, and physical therapy may also be required if the pain is persistent. You should keep in mind that most back pain will improve with proper medical management, and needless pain could be avoided with prompt medical attention.



For many Long Island families, visits to relatives are often synonymous with trips to the city. Note that in our suburban jargon city" does not necessarily refer only to Manhattan, as out-of-towners might think, but includes Queens, Brooklyn, the Bronx and Staten Island as well. And while family get-togethers are much anticipated and enjoyed, especially by the youngsters, the drivetime associated with them is usually a thing to be dreaded—most especially by the

That city driving is less than popular among suburbanites is understandable. A move east of the Queens border is as often precipitated by the desire for safer and saner roadways as by the lure of backyards and green lawns. We've come to assume, in fact, that the mellower pace of our Long Island lifestyle should inspire more responsible and courteous driving habits than the horn blowing and brake-screeching that pedestrians in the city expect to contend with.

Well, according to certain Long Island traf-fic experts, our assumptions could be wrong. It seems a pattern of increasing disregard for

traffic control devices has been noticed in the Nassau and Suffolk region. With surprising frequency and nonchalance, Island motorists are running stop signs and red (nor yellow)
lights, disregarding pedestrian crosswalks,
and generally ignoring other rules of the road.
In offering an analysis of the trend, a commanding officer of the Nassau County Police

Traffic Safety Unit was recently quoted as saying this seemingly lawless driving mentality is spilling over from the city." That's too bad. and something I'm sure none of us would opt for or encourage.

It may be true that one person's decision to run a red light in Oyster Bay will not disrupt our suburban quality of life, but if the experts reports of a trend toward our casual disregard for traffic control regulations are true, the cumulative effect could indeed citify our Long Island streets.

The next time you're tempted to ignore a stop sign or go through a red light—even if you're in a hurry and there are no other cars around-take a minute to consciously consider why a drive into "the city" is probably not one of your favorite things to do.

was hoping to find the diamonds divided 4-3 or, failing that, to find either opponent with the singleton or doubleton queen

outh then led a trump to the ace and ruffed another low diamond After drawing trumps, he entered dummy with a club and tried to run the diamonds. Unfortunately, it turned out that East had five to the queen, and the outcome was that South went down one

The declarer at the second table, upon winning the heart lead, first cashed the A-K of diamonds and then ruffed a diamond high. When West showed out on the third diamond, South realized that he could no longer establish the diamonds with normal play. He was short one entry to dummy for this purpose.

So at trick five, he led a low trump and, after West followed low, played the seven from dummy! The finesse succeeding, South was now home. He ruffed another diamond high, played a trump to the ace, and ruffed the fifth round of diamonds, feasily fellium. Earth super. The finally felling East's queen. Then, after drawing West's last trump, he was able to enter dummy with a club to cash the jack of diamonds and so make the grand slam.

Parishioners of Hicksville's St. Ignatius Lovola R.C. Church were both proud and sad this past month as they learned of the departure of their much-esteemed curate, Father ture of their much-esteemed curate, Father Thomas Costa. His many parish friends were proud and happy over Bishop John McGann's appointment of Father Tom as the new co-pastor of Saint John of God Church in Central Islip, but they felt a real sense of loss as

Father Costa is young as Catholic pastors go (he was ordained in 1978) but he brings to his priestly ministry and leadership a great warmth in human relations, much initiative, and a versatility of abilities. In the all-too-brief four years he served Hicksville's oldest Roman Catholic Church, St. Ignatius, he offered himself to his people in so many ways that will be remembered. There was his dignity and youthful enthusiasm; his brave enterprise and inspiration in leadership; his compassion and understanding in his service to AIDS vic-tims and their families; his patriotism in ready participation in community public ceremonies, his pride in his uniform of a serving U.S. Air Force Chaplain: his eloquence in homily, with the gift for analogy his warm normity, with the girt for alradogy ins warm family life prompts; the linguistic gift at his Bishop's command (his regular Masses in Italian for St. Bridget's in Westbury), and his strong leadership in innovative fund-raising, such as the recent Annual St. Ignatius summer bazaars he sparked for several years. (Father Tom making Italian zeppoli is a joyous

reather form manighted and a popular programments, indeed).

Father Costa's departure came in a month of changes at St. Ignatius. His replacement is the Reverend Robert Giuntini, transferred from St. Patrick's in Huntington. A young priest with a bright wit, cordiality and many of the physical attributes of his predecessor, Father Giuntini remarked on being mistaken for Father Costa when he and this writer first met: "I told Father Costa, you and I look so much alike, the folks will think there's been a mistake, and you're still here!

Another new arrival, an experienced hand at the parish administrative tiller at St. Ignatius is the Reverend Edward L. Tarrant. Father Tarrant comes to Hicksville from St. James parish in Setauket. He will relieve Pastor Frederick Harrer of stressful responsibilities so the veteran churchman may recover more readily from a recent illness. Father Harrer's managerial talents, his progressive, scholarly outlooks and Christian humanism, as well as a most gifted literary talent have been at the service of St. Ignatius since January, 1969—a long tenure in a difficult generation of his quurch's history. A respite for this devoted, modest, sensitive leader is well earn ed. His flock welcome Father Tarrant and his vigor and experience.

Also leaving St. Ignatius Church after serving for much of the '80s as a Sunday 'helping priest' is Dominican Father James Moyna, chaplain of the Amityville retirement home for the Sisters of St. Dominic, who has re-quested pastoral duty as diocesan priest. Father Moyna will be remembered among other graces bestowed, for thought-stirring sermons and for a passion for honest, loving human and family relationships. His beard-ed countenance, impassioned or restrained appeals for brotherhood, honesty and con-sideration created for many who heard him an image of the mendicant friars of the bygone, great ages of faith. This writer has known these St. Ignatius priests as a lector and commentator at their Mass during their full sojourns in Hicksville and is thankful for the spirituality, vision and hope they have brought to the old Gothic edifice on
