An average of 103.2 earned Cheryl Zukowsky the honor of being Hicksville High School Class of '89 Valedictorian. Cheryl is the daughter of Barbara and Edward Zukowsky of Dean Street, and sister of Gail who recently graduated from SUNY at Geneseo.

Cheryl's outstanding grade point average, along with the 1,430 she scored on her SAT, has virtually assured Cheryl of much future success, which she hopes will begin at Worcester Polytechnic in Massachusetts. She will major in engineering, though she has not yet decided on what specific type of engineer she wants to be besides a "rich one." Cheryl selected this college over two other colleges including the prestigious Mount Holyoke, which is also located in Massachusetts.

Her career at Hicksville High has been almost as active as it has been successful. Cheryl is a member of the high school marching band and the jazz ensemble; she is also captain of the math team and treasurer of the Modern Music Masters honor society.

Though she has had great academic success in all of her subjects, she has no favorite one; However, she does have two favorite teachers, Mr. Palmieri, an English teacher, and Mr. Horn, a Social Studies teacher.

Among the many awards and honors that have been bestowed upon Cheryl are the National Merit scholarship and the Empire State scholarship, though she will not be able to use the latter as she will be attending college out of state.

It certainly appears that Hicksville High School's Class of '89 Valedictorian is well on her way to a future as exciting as it is promising.

Steven McNicholas, the son of John and Rose McNicholas of Burns Avenue, and older brother of Pauline, age 15, and Kenny, age 13, earned the distinction of Hicksville High School Class of '89 Salutatorian. Steve was ranked second in his class with a grade point average of 100.6. He also scored a remarkable 1,360 on his SAT.

Steve has aspirations of entering the business world. He will attend Hofstra University this fall as a business major in either finance or management. Though he was accepted to many colleges, including New York University, SUNY at Binghamton, Manhattan College, St. John's University and Adelphi University, Steve decided to attend Hofstra because of its excellent reputation and also because he received a full scholarship there.

Steve has undoubtedly made the most of his tenure at Hicksville High School. Along with his academic success, he has participated in such distinctive organizations as the National Honor Society and the Spanish Honor Society.

His favorite subjects in school are Spanish and English. He said he does not really have a favorite teacher.

School Budget Approved on Second Vote

By a margin of 424 votes, the Hicksville community approved the revised school budget on June 21. The \$46,686,710 budget, 193,600 lower than the budget defeated on May 10, drew 3,882 voters to the polls. This was 70 voters fewer than had voted in May. However, the June 21 budget received 2153 yes votes, 1720 no votes, vs. 1806 yes, 2146 no on May 10.

School Board President Jo Ann Miltenberg reported that more than 154 people had registered on June 14, considerably higher than the usual number of new registrants for a budget vote.

Board Trustee Daniel MacBride, who had

urged the public to vote no on the first budget, thanked the CSEA for urging in its newsletter that members vote yes on the June 21 budget.

Recognition of Services

Outgoing school board trustees Daniel E. Arena and Carole R. Wolf were presented with plaques by Mrs. Miltenberg Mrs. Wolf, in accepting her award, announced that she would seek re-election to the board next year.

Mr. Arena, commenting on his 12 years on the board, said it "had its rough moments... [but I] wouldn't change it for the world."

Board Action

The board unanimously approved the ratification of the Memorandum of Agreement between the school district and the Hicksville Council of Principals, Assistant Principals, Supervisors and Department Chairs covering the period July 1, 1989 through June 30, 1991. Mrs. Miltenberg announced that the Superintendent's contract is not covered by this agreement and that Dr. Catherine Fenton would be receiving a six percent increase.

The board also approved the Town of Oyster Bay grant to continue the Hicksville

Youth Activities Program for 1989-90.

Bids were awarded to the lowest responsible bidders in several areas, including \$258,000 for fuel oil tanks at Burns, Dutch, Fork, Woodland, Lee and Old Country Road elementary schools; \$50,840 for demolition of temporary structures; and \$211,500 for bids for fuel oil under a cooperative bid with other school districts.

The board approved the extension of transportation contracts for the 1989-90 school year with Hartran, TomFor and We Transport calling for a 4.6 percent increase.

East Street School will be joining the subsidized milk program in the district. Participating schools are Fork Lane, Old Country Road, Woodland Ave., the Middle and High Schools.

The board accepted the following gift donations: picnic tables and benches from the East Street PTA, Electric Welbilt stove and refrigerator donated by Mr. and Mrs. Fagan, and a Briggs & Stratton engine to be used in the Technology course at the Middle School.

New Director

Dr. Daniel Kremin* was appointed director of special education and pupil personnel services by a board vote of 5-2; board trustees Mark Cardella and Mr. MacBride voting no.

Hearing Section

A board policy relating to students with H.I.V. Related illness will be submitted for action at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Education.

In Memoriam

The board began its meeting with a moment of silence in memory of Jean Tobin, a dedicated teacher's aide, PTA member and concerned resident who faithfully attended board meetings and spoke on behalf of the children of Hicksville.

Reorganization Meeting

The school board will hold its next meeting on Thursday, July 6 at 8:15 in the Conference Room of the Administration Building. At that time the board will elect its officers for the 1989-90 school year, as well as determine Board Committee Chairs and dates for future meetings.

Ten Hicksville teachers received a truly special honor prior to the school board meeting on Wednesday, June 21. Their former students chose them to be the recipients of engraved crystal bells commemorating the occasion, which came about as a result of this year's Scholars Dinner.

Eighty-three seniors representing the top 20 percent of this year's graduating class from Hicksville High School attended the Scholars Dinner in May at the Elks Club. Space limitations restricted the guest list to students, parents, PTA and school representatives. Many teachers who would have liked to attend could not.

In order to share this event with the many

teachers who contributed so much to their education, these students selected the teachers they remembered most—the people who had an impact on their lives—and presented them this unique honor, entitled "Remember When."

Each school (with the exception of Burns Avenue) was represented by a group of former students who bestowed their gift, which was accompanied by speeches that made the evening a wonderful moment for all who attended and believe so strongly in education.

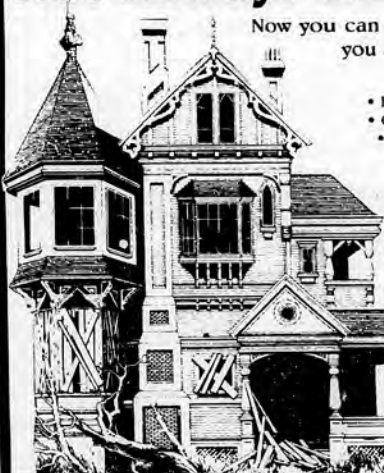

90 YEARS AGO, JUNE 30, 1899

"MILE-A-MINUTE MURPHY"

A Letter from Lulabelle...

"Can you remember your first garden?...My paternal grandmother was the gardener of the family and I remember so well when I was about six and my little brother was four, she decided that we should each have a garden of our very own and we should take care of it...First, she bought each of us a set of miniature garden tools—rake, hoe and shovel, about three feet long...Then we received a very large envelope with all sorts of flowers printed on the front—and inside were many small envelopes, each with a different kind of flower seeds—cosmos, marigolds, petunias, sweet alyssum, ageratum, even hollyhocks—and more...She helped us spade up the little plots and made us take out every weed and large stone and make it all ready for the seeds...Then, of course, we had to plan the planting scheme, since some flowers were much taller than others...We made careful little troughs and scattered our seeds, patting each one down with gentle fingers...We each had a watering can—it was tin and had pictures on the sides and Grandma showed us how to water very carefully in order not to disturb our seeds...Then she gave us a piece of fine mesh chicken wire, which we spread over our gardens so that the chickens would not be able to scratch up our seeds before they germinated—(Do you remember that lots of people had chickens in those days and we were always awakened by the crowing of the rooster?)...How excited we were when the first little tender green leaves poked up from the earth!...and when the flowers bloomed!...one would think that we had invented flowers...and all summer, these plants kept blooming and we were so delighted to take bouquets to our Mother...and Grandma made us keep the garden all watered and weeded...and do you know, I have never, to this day, had a garden that was as satisfactory as that first one!!

The Investor's Corner

Understanding Closed End Mutual Funds

Last week we looked at open end mutual funds. We looked at how they were purchased,

what the charges are and why they are there for us if we want them. This week we will do the same for the closed end type. We will give you some investment ideas in them.

Closed end mutual funds are very different from the open end funds, because their shares are not able to be constantly purchased from the fund or resold to them. You purchase your shares like any other stock, through normal brokerage channels. There is no difference from buying shares in General Motors, IBM, Kodak or any of the thousands of companies listed on the New York, American or over-the-counter stock exchanges.

The investment managers originally sell the stock to the public through investment banking houses, the same as any other listed company. Because of this, when you want to sell your stock, you sell it to someone else through a broker. The company never, never has to buy it back from you.

When they take your money, they invest it like any other mutual fund. Therefore, before you buy one of these you should know how the fund invests that money. They all have a strategy. Some invest only in particular areas of the world, the Korea fund is an example. Others only in a particular industry sector, like the Petrol and Resources Fund (petroleum and natural resources). You can buy these funds in particular types of

securities, such as the Ellsworth Convertible Growth and Income Fund (specialists in preferred stock and/or bonds that can be turned into common stock). The *Weekly Barron's* has more than a full page of these funds every week in the Laboratory section of the paper. Our advice here is to know what you want before you buy.

When the fund gets your money from the stock sale, they invest it like any other mutual fund, and like other mutual funds, they take their expenses from the cash on hand. The expenses will vary by the fund, some high, some low. The investment results will vary in the same way.

Since the fund does not have to redeem the shares at any time, and since the price is dependent upon the supply/demand for the stock on the exchange, the investment results, the NAV (net asset value), and the stock price are independent. Which means you can buy the shares at whatever price an owner is willing to sell and you are willing to pay. This is a fancy way to say that the value and the stock price may be higher or lower than the NAV. If it is higher, you would buy

at premium to NAV, and if lower, at a discount.

This sets up some unusual investment opportunities. For example, if you can buy control of a closed company at a steep discount from NAV and you can convert it to an open end firm (not hard to do), you will have an immediate gain, because all open end funds are priced at NAV. You could liquidate the fund with the same results. Closed-ends are selling at an average 13-1/2 percent discount to NAV. A few sell at premiums like the Rep. of China Taiwan Fund (+24.8%) or Korea Fund (+93.1%), most sell at discounts, like the India Fund (-15.0%) or the Brazil Fund (-51.3%).

The steep discounts mean that you can buy these stock funds with a lot of natural leverage. Example, recently the Franklin Holding Company (American Stock Exchange-FKL) traded at about a 35 percent discount to its NAV. It sells at about 19.50/share (1988 low was 4-1/4), its value is about 115/share. Some of its portfolio is illiquid, i.e., mortgage loans and small company stock. However, in 1996 it has to liquidate or become an open end fund. Either way you can gain. It specializes in utility stocks, not a bad place to be in these times. There are only 880,000 shares, so the total market value is about 8,300,000 dollars. Liquidated it is worth about \$13,000,000. It could be volatile with such a small float; it could also make you a lot of money if you buy and hold onto it.

Direct Line

An outgrowth of the ethics parade on Capitol Hill will undoubtedly be a look at campaign financing. There has already been a great deal of talk. The Democrats have a package, and George Bush has called for restrictions on political action committees.



Because fundraising is difficult, many politicians are ready to jump on the bandwagon of a taxpayer gravy train to pay for elections and will try to make that part of the reform. Nothing could be more wrong. The taxpayer should not be expected to pay for the conduct of elections. Rather than using tax dollars for campaigns, the Congress should explore changes to make the process fairer. Here are some ideas:

The first change should be elimination of the "grandfather" provision of the law which allows more senior members of the Congress to keep campaign funds for their own personal use on retirement. This is an obscene provision and should be repealed. If an individual or a political action committee gives money to a candidate's committee, the expectation is that the funds are going to help finance a campaign—not to line the retirement pockets of members, or to purchase personal items. Those interested in legislation could not give a gift directly to a member and should not be able to do so indirectly through an election committee.

Political action committees have kept the Congressional playing field uneven for challengers. For example, in 1987 and 1988, incumbents received over seventy-four percent of all PAC dollars. Challengers received only twelve percent with some fourteen percent going to candidates running for open seats. Because the Democrats control both the House and the Senate, and money tends to flow where the power is, Republicans received only thirty-eight percent of

political action committee contributions. The imbalance helps to guarantee wins for incumbents. In Senate races, incumbents usually start building a war chest for the next election the day after they are elected. That gives an incumbent six years to collect funds. For practical purposes, a challenger has to announce that he or she is running before money can be solicited. To give challengers a chance, the law should be changed to prohibit fundraising by individual candidates until they have announced for reelection.

There should be limits on how much an individual is permitted to spend in pursuing a seat in Congress. Right now, there is no limit on the amount of personal funds which can be put into a race. That is patently unfair and does not assure that the most qualified person is either nominated or elected. "Freedom of speech" aside, there must be reasonable limitations.

The length of a Congressional race should be limited to nine months. During that nine month period, an incumbent should not be permitted the use of free mailing privileges for newsletters, questionnaires, and the announcements of so-called "town meetings." Taxpayer dollars are currently being used for these direct mail campaign supplements, and the practice should be stopped.

Political action committee contributions should be restricted so that committee funds can only go to the national parties—not to individual candidates. To encourage individual support, the tax laws should be adjusted to permit a one thousand dollar a year political contribution deduction.

Finally, the television industry should provide a greater use of free time for political debate. While it is arguably difficult in a large metropolitan area to be totally fair, there has to be a better structure for the presentation of candidates than the current procedures. The cost of television advertising is prohibitive to many challengers and stifles political debate.

There is little doubt that money has become the key ingredient in political campaigns today. For that reason, it is all the more unfortunate that a candidate's creditability is based more on how much money is in the bank than how many ideas are in the candidate's head. Let's hope that the ethics debate will address some of the shortfalls in the current process.

School District Inducts Its Hall of Fame

Five former Hicksville High School graduates were inducted into the Hicksville School District's Hall of Fame on Sunday. Those elected—Captain Philip S. Anselmo, USN; Roslyn D. Goldmacher; Curt Brill; Dr. John R. Levison; and Dr. Leslie Becker Hecht—had been chosen by present graduates to lead the current senior class onto McCormack Field during commencement ceremonies. Their names have been added to the commemorative plaque hanging in the school's lobby in tribute to their accomplishments since leaving the district's schools.

Persons chosen for this honor are former Hicksville students who have made their marks with important achievements and contributions to their community and/or profession. Anyone may nominate a former student of the Hicksville schools for this honor. A committee made up of student representatives with guidance from an administrative advisor determine, from those nominated each year, who's life and career they value and hold in the highest esteem.

It is the hope of the board of education that this ongoing project will serve to inspire current and future students to instill a sense of pride in the schools and in the community.

Captain Philip S. Anselmo, USN, Class of 1958:

Captain Anselmo received his college degree from the State University of New York at Oswego, furthering his education at the U.S. Naval Aviation Officer Candidate School. He served as an aircraft carrier pilot during the Vietnam War and received many medals and citations for leadership in peacetime, and courage and discipline on highly dangerous missions over Vietnam. Noted one student on the Hall of Fame Committee: "He is one of the few persons recognized for their bravery and courage in their action during Vietnam... He is a part of history." Captain Anselmo has been described as a highly motivated, educated, brave and responsible person. Currently, he is the Commanding Officer aboard the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Constellation.

Roslyn D. Goldmacher, Class of 1971:

Roslyn Goldmacher received her Doctorate of Jurisprudence from the Hofstra University School of Law and is currently a practicing attorney as well as the executive director of the Long Island Development Corporation. Her resume and her energies are endless. She is the founder and president of Women Economic Developers of Long Island, Inc., a regional director of the National

Association of Development Co.; the vice chairperson, L.I. Delegation, of the White House Conference on Small Business; a government resource panelist for the L.I. Business Council; a member of the L.I. Regional Economic Development Council, appointed by the NYS Governor; a member of the Nassau County Womens Advisory Council, appointed by the County Executive; and was an elected delegate to the 1986 White House Conference on Small Business.

Curt Brill, Class of 1970:

Curt Brill received his BS degree in Design from Cornell University and has moved on to achieve fame as a sculptor. His art work has appeared in numerous invitational shows, group shows and individual shows and he has received many awards for his talent. Aside from teaching art courses at several colleges, he has served as a drug rehabilitation counselor, and has been a paid professional as well as an active volunteer in state run mental health institutions and private and county run nursing homes.

"My search in the visual arts is for the hidden human spirit," Curt writes. "That small part that makes us each unique, yet finds us a common home."

Dr. John R. Levison, Class of 1974:

Dr. Levison pursued his biblical studies at Cambridge University, Christ's College, England, before earning his Ph.D. at Duke

University in North Carolina. At Cambridge he received the highest score in his final exams and was honored at a formal dinner where the guest of honor was the Duke of Edinburgh, Prince Philip. Aside from his schooling in England, he studied in Israel and in Germany, and later accepted a Post-doctoral Rotary International Scholarship to study and teach at St. Andrews University in Scotland. Dr. Levison is a published author and aside from books has had numerous articles printed in Theological journals. Currently, he is the Assistant Professor of New Testament at St. Paul's School of Theology in Missouri.

Dr. Leslie Becker Hecht, Class of 1976:

Dr. Hecht received her Ph.D. from the University of California at Riverside in Molecular and Cellular Biology and is currently involved in Post-doctoral research on insulin-stimulated activity. According to Dr. Hecht: "This research may be useful in explaining certain types of diabetes and determining why some cells grow when given insulin." Aside from her research, she is teaching microbiology and general biology at the University of California, Riverside. She has co-authored two reviewed papers and four presented papers. According to one student on the Hall of Fame Committee: "Dr. Hecht has proven her intelligence and devotion to humanity in researching life-giving activities."

AMENDMENTS TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF OYSTER BAY PARKS AND RECREATION CHAPTER 19 DUNE PROTECTION

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay, County of Nassau, State of New York, that the Town of Oyster Bay Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by ADDING to Chapter 19 "Parks and Recreation" the following "Sections 19-29 - 19-40 RESERVED" and "ARTICLE II. DUNE PROTECTION Sections 19-41 - 19-45" to read as follows:

ARTICLE II. DUNE PROTECTION Section 19-41. Legislative Findings.

The preservation of the barrier island which stands between the Atlantic Ocean and South Oyster Bay is of paramount importance to the residents of the Town of Oyster Bay. This barrier island affords protection to the south shore of the Town of Oyster Bay from storm damage and erosion and by its existence creates South Oyster Bay with its unique ecological characteristics and recreational opportunities. Any damage or destruction to the sand dunes and beaches constituting the barrier island will weaken this protection and constitute a danger to the health, safety and welfare of Town residents. It is imperative that the integrity of the barrier island be

Section 19-42. Definitions
Commissioner of Parks shall mean the Commissioner of Parks of the Town of Oyster Bay or his duly authorized designee.

Official vehicle shall mean a motor vehicle while in use for official business of the United States government, the State of New York, the County of Nassau or the Town of Oyster Bay or any ambulance, fire or other emergency vehicle while in use for emergency service.

Sand dune shall include all primary dunes, secondary dunes, transverse dunes and interdune areas, but shall not include officially posted access points to beach areas.

Section 19-43. Establishment of dune protection zone.

A dune protection zone is hereby established by the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay. This zone shall include all of the barrier island which lies within the Town of Oyster Bay and shall extend from the mean high water line at ocean side landward to the mean high water line at bay side, and shall include the J.P.K. Memorial Wildlife Sanctuary.

Section 19-44. Prohibitions.
(a) It shall be a violation of this article for any person to damage, destroy, remove, excavate or relocate any sand dune or portion thereof located within the dune protection zone.

(b) It shall be a violation of this article for any person to kill, destroy, damage or remove any vegetation growing in or upon any sand dune or portion thereof located within the dune protection zone.
(c) It shall be a violation of this article for any person to trespass upon or walk, transgress, cross, intrude or go upon any sand dune or portion thereof located within the dune protection zone, except as necessary for erosion control, dune building or dune stabilization purposes when authorized by the Commissioner of Parks.

(d) It shall be a violation of this article for any person to operate or direct the operations of any motor vehicle upon or across any sand dune or portion thereof or anywhere within the dune protection zone, except for official vehicles when authorized by the Commissioner of Parks.

Section 19-45. Penalty for violation of article.
Any person committing an offense against this article, or any provision or section thereof, shall be guilty of a violation punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) or imprisonment not to exceed five (5) days for each such offense or by both such fine and imprisonment and upon conviction of a second or subsequent offense, shall be guilty of a violation punishable by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment not to exceed fifteen (15) days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

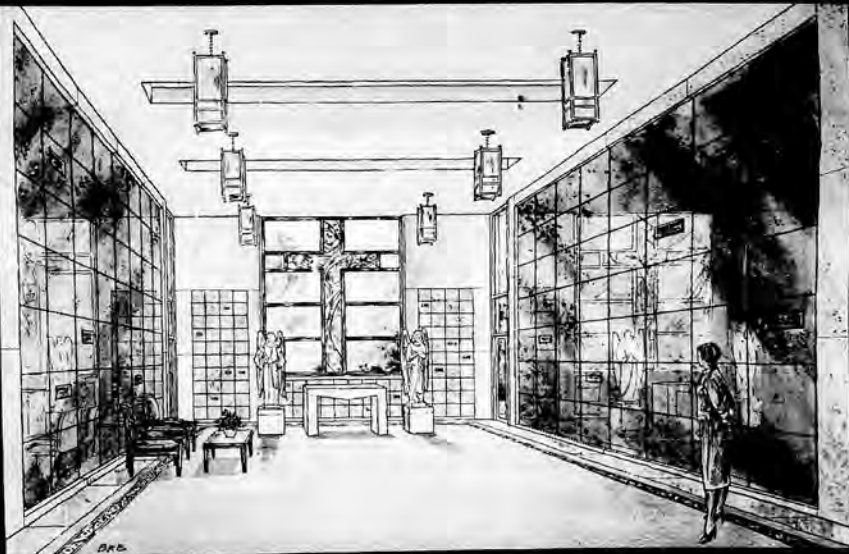

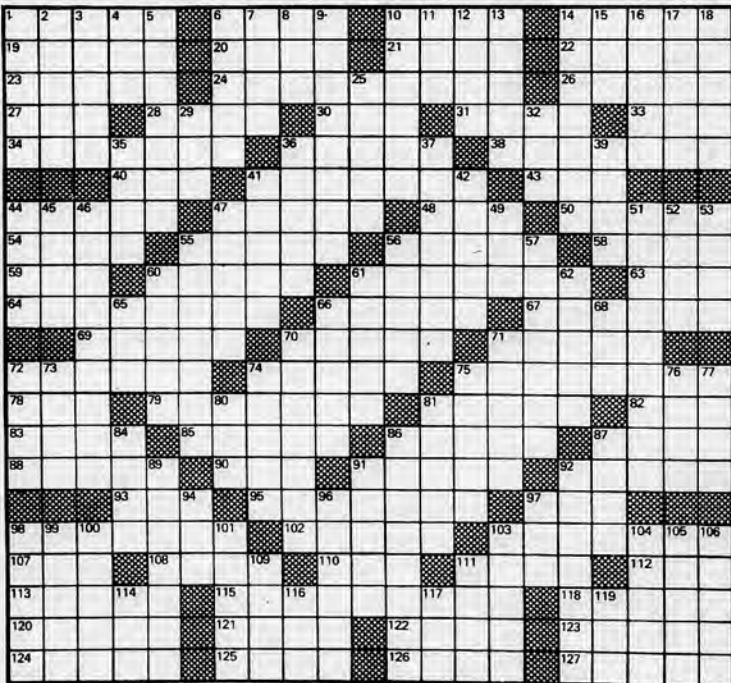

You Auto Know

Just to keep you informed...you are really being watched as you ride the L.I.E. Is it Big Brother??? No, it's INFORM. That is an acronym for information for motorists.

Through sensors under the pavement, INFORM computers constantly monitor traffic speed and density throughout the corridor, enabling operators to alert police, other agencies and the media, along with motorists by means of traffic message signs, when there are accidents or delays.

INFORM rush-hour operation of merge lights is beginning to save travel time for motorists on the Long Island Expressway, James A. Kuzloski, the New York State Department of Transportation's Long Island Regional Director, said recently.

On a 12-mile stretch of the L.I.E. in Suffolk County, eastbound travel times during the evening rush hours dropped by an average of 13 percent when merge lights were operating on six entrance ramps in that segment, he said. The figure takes into account waiting time on entrance ramps. For through traffic, the average travel time dropped by 20 percent, while average speed rose by 10 percent.

Merge lights, part of the INFORM system, are red-green traffic lights on entrance ramps that smooth traffic flow by feeding in entering vehicles one at a time. INFORM is a computerized traffic information system operating along a 35-mile east-west corridor extending from Hauppauge in Suffolk County to the vicinity of Shea Stadium in Queens.

"These are preliminary results, and obviously the highway remains overloaded at peak times," Mr. Kuzloski said. "But it's clear that the merge lights are helping, as they have elsewhere in the country."

The improved traffic flow has also yielded a 6 percent fuel saving and cut vehicle emissions, he said. Carbon monoxide emissions have been reduced by 17 percent and hydrocarbons by 13 percent, although nitrous oxides increased slightly more than 2 percent because of the higher speeds.

DOT studied the traffic movement last September, before any of the merge lights were in operation, and again in March and April when the six lights were in use during the evening rush hours only. The section of highway involved runs from the Nassau-Suffolk line to Exit 57, Route 111.

"DOT has now fine-tuned all 12 merge lights in Suffolk County, including 10 on the L.I.E. and two on Northern Parkway," Mr. Kuzloski said. "We are working westward through Nassau County and currently have 18 merge lights operating there." The computer-controlled lights usually operate

from 7 to 9 a.m. westbound and 4 to 6 p.m. eastbound, although times are modified according to location and traffic flow.

Probably the most mystifying play in bridge is the smother play. It is hard to believe that such a play can exist, but it does. True, the necessary setup seldom arises, but its very rarity makes the play that much more dramatic when it does occur.

Here is an example of the smother play. West appears to have an absolutely certain trump trick, but

South can neutralize it by playing his cards correctly.

West leads a spade. East cashes his K-A and continues with a spade. Declarer ruffs with the nine and plays the queen of trumps. West ducks, of course, and South finesse. Declarer then leads the three of trumps and finesse the eight, East showing out.

A trump loser now seems inevitable, and this, together with a certain diamond loser, would appear to doom the contract. However, South still has one other possibility to lean on — the smother play.

He therefore cashes the A-K of diamonds and A-K Q of clubs, everyone following suit. Then, with fingers crossed, he exits with a diamond, hoping East will have to win the trick and that he started with only three diamonds.

As the cards lie, East is forced to win the diamond with the queen and has no more diamonds. Only two tricks remain to be played at this point. South has the J-10 of trumps, West has the K-6 of trumps, dummy has the ace of trumps and a diamond, and East has a spade and a club.

Whatever East returns, South ruffs with the ten and West's ironclad trump trick is obliterated.

According to the instructor, Joi Eden, the class has increased in popularity over the years. Ms. Eden explained the following about Tai Chi:

Our constantly changing, stressful lifestyles make living an anxiety-producing effort. Tension-free living is increasingly difficult under the trying conditions of today's world. Being calm, even for short periods, has become a modern survival skill.

There is no "cure-all" for this situation, but there is an approach dedicated to relieving stress in mind and body. This approach, called Tai Chi, is enjoyable and immediately applied to every part of life: to cope with conflict/stress/problems, enhance performance and produce healthful, structured and creative environments. It is easily presented, whether you are in business, social service, recreational, athletic, education, government, health/medicine, science, cultural or religious. It can work for your group, organization, students or patients.

Tai Chi Chuan has been called the only self-improvement program/method you'll ever need. It promotes strength, stamina, energy and improves overall physical conditioning and weight control. Increases confidence, heightens creativity and concentration. Improves flexibility, grace, coordination and control. Most important - it is very calming.

Evidence has repeatedly suggested that tension-filled ways of coping weaken the immune system and increase risk of illness. Those under stress and pressure become ill.

We can't magically erase our problems, but we can control the impact our problems have on our lives - and that is the key for reducing stress/tension/anxiety. Evidence indicates a positive attitude and sense of control are essential.

- using energy less wastefully
- being calm; when we are more calm, we can do almost anything.

Student Reaction

According to Hicksville resident Jackie Adelstein, Tai Chi has benefitted her in that she sleeps better than ever before and she is much more relaxed. She brought her mom to class, which is held at Eisenhower Park, and it helped her to feel more relaxed, even after triple by-pass surgery. She found she didn't need her evening medication after taking the class. Jackie said she has been doing this for eight weeks and the exercises have helped her with a rapid heartbeat problem.

Another Hicksville resident, Joe Wilkonski, has been doing Tai Chi since the fall. "I joined because the printed material describing the class intrigued me and because it was something my wife and I could participate in together," said Mr. Wilkonski.

He added that the deep breathing benefits him at night, when he tries to relax and go to sleep. "I only get up to counting to three or four and before I know it, I'm asleep," he said. "I sleep well now the entire night through."
