2 Fires at Local Motel

Two fires struck the Hicksville Motor Lodge at 429 Duffy Avenue, near Old Country Road, this past week. In both cases all guests were evacuated safely, with no injuries reported, according to a Hicksville Fire Department spokesman.

The department received the first alarm at 1:44 a.m. June 28 and found one room on the second floor involved. Chief Terry Farrell and 35 volunteer firemen reported the fire under control in 15 minutes, despite heavy smoke. Damage is estimated at \$10,000, with the cause determined to be a short circuit near a bed.

At 3:42 a.m. the following morning firefighters were again called for a second floor blaze, this one two doors away from the first fire. All occupants were safely evacuated.

Driver, Restaurant Are Robbed Within 2 Hours

Within two hours on June 28, a man driving on Old Country Road and a restaurant just blocks away were targets of armed robbers.

A 30 year old deliveryman from East Meadow, told second squad detectives that he stopped for a red light at Underhill Avenue at 9:10 p.m., when two men pulled along on a motorcycle. One of the pair pulled a gun and demanded the man's money. After getting \$100 in cash, the pair yanked the victim's car keys from his ignition, threw them away and sped off. The deliveryman was not injured.

One of the robbers was said to be black, the other Hispanic.

At 10:45 p.m., two men, one armed with a shotgun and the other with a pistol, walked into the Sizzler Restaurant on Old Country Road, through an unlocked rear door, and ordered the seven employees to the floor.

The restaurant had closed earlier and no patrons remained. The pair then walked the manager into his office, and took \$4,050 from a cash drawer. Police said the duo then demanded that the employees surrender their tip money, which amounted to another \$500.

Police said the two men were black and believed to be about 24 years of age, but released no other description.

Neither the manager nor any of the employees reported any injuries, according to Det. James Carroll, who is investigating both crimes.

Hicksville Bids Farewell to Two of Its Finest

Hicksville High School bid farewell to two of its longtime music teachers last month, orchestra director Thomas Buttice and choral director Charles Arnold who are leaving the district after more than 61 combined years of teaching.

The end of Charles Arnold's tenure as choral director marks the end of a legacy at Hicksville High. For 27 years, he taught high school vocalists the art of singing. Now, Mr. Arnold will bring his talents to New York University where he will serve as the university's choral director.

"I'm not retiring," said Mr. Arnold. "I'm moving on to something else. I'm doing something different ... finally."

Mr. Arnold, who grew up in Kingston, New York, attended Colgate University as a music major and received a bachelor of arts degree. He later went on to receive a master's degree at New York University.

The first of his 28 years of teaching was spent at Patterson High School in New Jersey, the school made famous by principal Joe Clark and his unique ways of instilling discipline. Of course, this was long before the Clark era and, according to Mr. Arnold, it was a middle-class school then.

After one year of teaching at Patterson, Mr. Arnold moved on to Hicksville High, where he produced more than just performances of great caliber, but students who have gone on to achieve much success in the field of music. One of his students is the pop musician Billy Joel who made a surprise visit at Mr. Arnold's final concert in May. Mr. Arnold also has four former students who are currently high school choral directors on Long Island.

Whether they are world famous musicians or never sing another note after high school, Mr. Arnold is proud of all his students.

"Every time they perform, I'm proud of

them," he said. "They have performance poise and [the right] attitude. They trust me and I'm willing to trust them."

At the last concert when Billy Joel made his appearance, Mr. Arnold said that he was ecstatic about seeing Billy, but "I was equally pleased when I saw so many of my former students there."

Despite all of his accomplishments at Hicksville High, Mr. Arnold feels the time is right to move on.

"I wanted something different while I still had good energy."

Mr. Arnold said he is very excited about his new job at NYU. Although it is a part-time position, Mr. Arnold said he can work as long as he wants and that he plans on working full-time for the most part. He will be working

with two choruses, one with 125 members and the other with 10 members, as he builds a program with a jazz choir, madrigal group and a chamber group.

Mr. Arnold said he will miss Hicksville's students a great deal. "Hicksville has been very good," he said. "And the kids are super."

Although Mr. Arnold does not know who will replace him at Hicksville, he said that whoever it is, is "walking into a situation with some wonderful kids."

Music Veteran Retires

After 34 years of teaching music in the Hicksville School District, orchestra director, Thomas Buttice, has retired.

The sprightly and cheerful Mr. Buttice, who's zest and passion for music compelled

him to spend his life teaching it to others, has decided to put aside his baton and pursue his many other interests.

Mr. Buttice was educated in the New York City public school system. After graduating from high school, he went on to study music education at Adelphi University, Columbia University and the Greenwich House Music School. Mr. Buttice has a bachelor of art's degree with a major in music and a minor in education. He also has a master's degree in music education.

The interaction with his colleagues and students is what Mr. Buttice said he will miss most about his job. He will also miss what he called, "the excitement of working with young people."

But one thing he will not long for is having to wake up in the early hours of the morning to prepare for work. "I really won't miss the alarm clock," he said.

Now that he is retired, Mr. Buttice will spend more time with his wife of 29 years and his son and daughter-in-law. But retirement does not mean the end of all work for Mr. Buttice as he plans on working part-time at his son's delicatessen. When he's not with his family or hard at work at his son's deli, he may

be found under a tree reading.

"I'm going to go through the Shakespeare that I should have read in high school," he said. Mr. Buttice will also find time to go sailing or play a few holes on the golf course.

Does that mean no more music? Hardly. Mr. Buttice plans on spending the rest of his free time doing what he has been encouraging his students to do for 34 years: practicing. He will need to keep his fiddling up to par as he will play in the Massapequa Symphony Orchestra in the fall.

Mr. Buttice has found teaching a very rewarding experience. He takes great pride in the fact that a number of his students have gone on to play or teach professionally. He also finds being able to touch the lives of others very fulfilling. He has received notes from some of his former students thanking him for his work and dedication.

"I didn't even realize I touched them that much," said Mr. Buttice.

More than anything else, Buttice's ultimate decision to become a music teacher was based on his teachers throughout his school career.

"My teachers greatly affected me, and I thought if I could just be half as good, I would be a success."

Fibrositis - The Exhaustion and Pain Syndrome

A disorder which has generated much controversy over the last several years is fibrositis. This debate revolves around the cause and the treatment of this disorder. Fibrositis (or fibromyalgia) is used to describe trunk and limb pain, not associated with inflammation of the joints.

Patients with fibrositis often feel pain and stiffness in their muscles. This stiffness may be associated with a decline of motivation. The exhaustion results in poor sleeping patterns, and patients usually awaken feeling unrefreshed. This cycle produces more muscle stiffness, further exhaustion, and depression usually follows. The pain and stiffness can be made worse by exposure to the cold, changes in weather, and even loud noises.

The cause of fibrositis is not known. Recent evidence points to a sleep disorder resulting in an exaggerated pain response of the muscles. Emotional

stress is also known to play an important role in the fibrositis syndrome.

Patients with fibrositis are usually referred to rheumatologists (specialists in disorders of the muscles and joints), for diagnosis and treatment. The diagnosis of this disorder may be difficult at times and it is necessary to make certain that no other illnesses are present. Once this has been established, the recognition and identification of 12 specific tender trigger points will usually confirm the diagnosis.

Current treatment is centered around correcting the sleep disturbance. Medications which are able to break the cycle and restore normal sleep patterns have been some of the most successful therapies tested to date.







A Tribute to An Education

The Building Block of the Future

"Graduation, or as it's more properly called, commencement, is a time to reflect on where you have been as you are about to take those first steps toward where you are going. This is true for any commencement, but becomes more germane as time goes on. I have been fortunate to have been part of many commencements in my life leading up



to my most recent from the University of Miami School of Law. Even though this signals the end of my formal education for the time being, I cannot help but look back

over the 19 years of schooling that made it all possible.

"During my trip down 'memory lane' I realized that what made it all possible was a strong foundation. Such a foundation is built by, in addition to one's parents, those dedicated individuals in the elementary schools, junior high schools and high schools.

"My old elementary school, East Street, had a wonderful assortment of teachers. I have many fond and vivid memories of my time in kindergarten through sixth grade. From a kindergarten teacher whose husband used to come by and surprise his wife's class with candy treats to a foreign language teacher who prepared me for trips to Italy and taught me the value of learning a second language. Many of the lessons learned during those formative years are still valid and

useful today.

As I think about it, my teacher had an awesome responsibility of preparing me for my future. I do not mean this so much in the sense of preparing a second grader for third grade, a third grader for fourth grade etc., but more so in the sense of becoming a well-adjusted individual, capable of taking on situations and dealing with them successfully. My elementary school teacher did just that . . . and more.

"The Hicksville Junior and Senior High schools took the result of East Street Elementary, sharpened it and refined it by giving

an opportunity to grow. Here also I had some very fine teachers who challenged me to take

on more responsibility, use more of my potential and to become my personal best. Here

I learned that "less is more, in ecological terms," to "look back only to pleasant memories," to "keep on truckin', even when you reach the top" and most important of all

How to be a Super Stockpicker

The airwaves and the print media are full of advice on how to pick real winners in the stock market. Let's go over some of what I have heard and some of what I have done and some of what I remember from the past.

Peter Lynch, one of the absolute best stock pickers and mutual fund managers has written

a book, *One Up on Wall Street*, which lays out one way he finds winners. One of his research methods is to observe what his wife and children are buying. He checks his friends and neighbors. Of course he talks to his

business associates. He reasons that if enough people that he knows are buying a product, it is worth looking into.

Note, the phrase is "worth looking into". That does not mean he goes out and buys right off the bat. He investigates. How? Get the financials from the company, look at a few ratios. How? Ask your broker for any information. How? Go to your college library, or in some towns the local public library and look in *Value Line*. In other words, do some basic research.

Will it always work out? No. I remember when I was in another school, I was asked by another professor what I thought of LA Gear. I looked very carefully at the financials—there was absolutely nothing there to recommend the company, absolutely nothing. I was in New York, that company was in California. What I did not know was that their footwear was the rage of California. It became the rage for the younger set across the USA.

The moral of this is that the financials do not always tell the story. They had the market, they got the money, and a major profit opportunity was lost because the stock was cheap, in the penny area. The last time I looked at this company is now on The NY Stock Exchange selling at \$50. If a company has the market, it will get the financing from somewhere. Having the market was more im-

portant than the financials. It usually is the case.

I remember listening to a radio financial advisor back in the 1950's. Someone called in to ask if the fact that Rambler showrooms were going up all over the place was indicative of anything, should the caller buy the stock? The answer was as good as you will get. Yes, it is a significant event.

I remember when I was about 20, I saw a wonderful toy called a polaroid camera. It was expensive. It made no impact on me. I saw it as an interesting toy. Too bad. I knew little about anything at that time, obviously.

Another young man was much smarter and more observant. Frank Cappiello, a frequent guest on Wall Street Week and the author of two books, says in his latest book, *Finding the Next Superstock*, that you have to look around you for ideas. Then, do your homework. Look for rising sales, rising profit margins, and rising earnings per share. If you see a product in heavy use by a group and it has those characteristics, buy.

If you want your children to be aware of the investment world, try to interest them. Ask their opinion of what is happening, find

out what their age group is buying, etc. If you buy any stock as the result of the discussions, let them know. Follow it with them. I can assure you that if you can interest them and get them really involved, they will be truly excited. I have gone to grammar schools to talk to the brighter kids about the stock market, and to help them pick some stocks in a competitive "game". They can get really excited. They want to buy right away. They want to have action.

When you sell, win or lose, let them know why you did it. Explain the gain or loss. Do not be too technical, keep it simple and at their knowledge level (this is hard to do, but remember you were not so smart at their age either).

If you want to be successful in your investment program, do not follow the pack. You have to anticipate where the pack (and that includes the big investment managers) will be in a year or so. You have the advantage over them. They sit in large offices, you are out buying products. Look at what your neighbor is doing. They may be telling you how to make a bundle without even knowing it. So can you kids.

Direct Line

George Bush's proposals for both NATO and the Soviet Union to scale back military levels in Europe has captured international imagination. His ideas will test the sincerity of Mikhail Gorbachev's speeches about easing tensions around the world. We are in for some interesting months of negotiations.

The Soviet Union's stated position is to reach agreement on the elimination of short range nuclear missiles first; or at the same time as negotiating a deal on conventional arms. The United States and the West should never accept this approach. With Soviet forces outnumbering us significantly in every category of conventional arms, and a geographic supply advantage over the

United States, it would be foolhardy to totally surrender the nuclear deterrent now possessed by the West. George Bush's proposals call for an evening of conventional arms. For example, the Soviet Union and the Warsaw Pact currently have twenty thousand more tanks than the West. If George Bush's proposals are accepted, each side would be limited to the same number of tanks.

The reduction of conventional arms in Europe is not a new subject. Last July, in a private meeting with President Reagan, I asked him whether he felt the Russians would be willing to negotiate a conventional arms treaty in Europe. The President responded by saying that he had discussed the subject with Chairman Gorbachev during the 1988 Spring Summit and had concern about the Soviet Union's desire to link conventional arms negotiations with the elimination of short range nuclear missiles. President Reagan did not feel linkage

would serve our best interests and could be a stumbling block to any limitation on conventional arms. But he did feel the Russians wanted to negotiate. That has proved to be correct.

Our short range nuclear weapons deterrent helps to create a balance of forces in Europe. The complete elimination of nuclear weapons would leave the West vulnerable to the massive superiority of Russian conventional arms—not to speak of its geographic advantage in moving troops and equipment. President Bush has recently indicated that short range nuclear missiles could be put on the table for review after decisions on conventional arms. The essential point is that each side now appears willing to discuss both areas.

The situation inside Russia has already had a direct impact. It is clear that Mikhail Gorbachev knows that he must reorient Russian resources towards consumer products. With long lines for available food and a new surge of elementary democracy, they can no longer spend more than one hundred billion dollars a year on the military.

This is not to say that budget pressures do not exist in the United States—because they do. But, we should be careful not to let budget pressures drive our foreign policy or national security interests. Russia is still supplying arms and other aid to El Salvador, Cuba and Nicaragua. Whatever their posturing in Europe, a truer test of Soviet relations with the United States will be played out in Central America.

Internal conditions in Russia, along with the apparent attitude of Mikhail Gorbachev, and the Bush proposal for military reductions in Europe, give us a wonderful opportunity. Ultimately, conventional arms and short range nuclear weapons will end up on the table—together or separately. One thing is certain—an old world is setting, and the new world of the United States will include rather than isolate Russia. Without democratic changes being forced in the Soviet Union and a George Bush willing to seize the opportunity, the Cold War could have continued. And, while we must remain vigilant, the positive signs of nonmilitary competition between the United States and the Soviet Union are heartening to see. The world will be better for this new spirit.





Some contracts stand or fall depending entirely on the opening lead. For example, consider this deal where South got to six hearts on the bidding shown. Obviously, South was not a fainthearted soul; not many players would have leaped to four hearts with only 9 high-card points.

But South made the slam after West chose a spade as his opening lead. West reasoned that on the bidding his opponents were prepared

to cope with a diamond lead, the suit East had bid, and he therefore decided to surprise them by leading a spade.

The overly imaginative lead did not work out well when declarer proceeded to make the most of his chances. After discarding a diamond and a club on the A-K of spades and ruffing a spade, South cashed the K-A of clubs and ruffed a club. He was hoping to find the clubs divided 3-3, in which case he would have had smooth sailing the rest of the way.

But East showed out on the third club, discarding a diamond, and South was left with only one more chance — to find East with the singleton ace of trumps. When he now led a trump, poor East won with the ace and found himself forced to return a diamond. As a result, South lost only one trump trick and made the slam.

Had West led a diamond originally, there would have been no way for South to escape down one. In general, it is much safer to lead partner's suit than to make a blind lead in another suit, unless the circumstances strongly indicate otherwise. West had no good reason in this case to vary from the general rule, and in the actual deal it cost him a slam.
