SORT Success Saves Town \$1 Million

Recycling has resulted in a savings of more than \$1 million for town residents for the first half of 1989, according to figures released by the town.

The Town of Oyster Bay Separate Oyster Bay's Recyclables Today (SORT) program has netted the savings in solid waste hauling costs which have skyrocketed with the mandated closings of area landfills.

"Thanks to the outstanding cooperation of our SORT residents, more than 10,000 tons of recyclables have been collected through June of this year," said Oyster Bay Town Supervisor Angelo D'Elia. "This tonnage is right on target with our recycling bureau's goal of removing 20,000 tons of recyclables from our waste stream during 1989."

The success of the SORT program was attributed to the cooperation of private carriers in Massapequa Park, Nassau Shores and Harbor Green, where participating residents contributed 1,024 tons of material.

Robert Izzo Remains In Jail — For Now

Robert Izzo, the Hicksville school bus driver accused of sexually molesting young children, will remain in the Nassau County jail without bail—at least until tomorrow, Friday—when he must again appear before Judge Marvin Goodman, who Tuesday ordered a pre-trial probation report to determine whether Mr. Izzo should be freed pending trial.

Some 50 parents and other Hicksville residents packed the courtroom as the slight, mustached defendant was arraigned on a 20 count indictment, voted July 26 by a grand jury, which charged Mr. Izzo with various counts of sodomy, sexual abuse and endangering the welfare of a child.

The spectators gasped as Mr. Izzo, asked to plead to the charge, said in a loud voice, "not guilty." They were the only words ut-

tered by Mr. Izzo, who did not look at the audience. His attorney, Anthony Capetola, blasted the indictment, claiming it was based solely on the uncorroborated allegations of a 13 year old boy. He asked that Mr. Izzo be freed in \$50,000 bail. Assistant District Attorney Maureen Riordan, who has been placed in charge of the case, countered by saying that bail of one million dollars would be acceptable to the prosecution. "Might as well make it two million," Mr. Capetola answered. "He doesn't have it."

Under a statute which became effective August 1, the question of pre-trial release is deferred until the county probation department can investigate the extent to which Mr. Izzo should be released.

Although spectators began arriving in court as early as 9:15 a.m., the arraignment did not get under way until 11, following a conference, in chambers, between the judge and the attorneys.

Mr. Izzo wore an open-necked white shirt and blue-gray slacks. His hands remained manacled behind his back throughout the 15 minute appearance. Uniformed court officers ringed the room, but took no action as the audience burst into a loud cheer when the judge denied the bail request.

Both attorneys indicated they were ready for the trial, and Judge Goodman indicated that an early trial date might be set.

Questions Dating to 1987

As the story continued to unravel, it was learned that as early as December, 1987, questions about Mr. Izzo's relationship to children he was driving had been surfacing. In a letter dated December 21, 1987, Jane Maloney, secretary of St. Ignatius Loyola School, had petitioned Mr. Izzo's employer, Harran Transportation of Hicksville, to remove him from his route "as quickly as possible," because he was making "the children very nervous and they are becoming frightened of him."

Mr. Izzo was first arrested on sexual abuse charges on May 21. The report of that arrest was not wide-spread, leading parents to accuse the Hicksville School District of not informing parents of the situation. Dr. Catherine J. Fenton, superintendent of schools, said Tuesday afternoon that Harran had informed her that the child involved was not one of "our students on our buses—(public and private bus transportation) and that Mr. Izzo had been suspended." Therefore "I thought our children were protected. I thought our children were clear," she said.

Mr. Izzo was arrested a second time on July 21. He has been in jail without bail since.

If convicted of all the charges, Mr. Izzo faces a 25 year prison term.

PTA/Parents Discuss Sexual Abuse Case

Concerned parents met July 25 to discuss the arrest of Robert Izzo, who was later indicted on sexual abuse charges.

The meeting, conducted by Willet Avenue PTA president Donna Conk, was attended by representatives from PTAs throughout the district.

Parents received information from several sources on how to best deal with the situation. Kenneth Lau, a coordinator from the Nassau County Coalition on Child Abuse (481-7784) stressed that parents should be supportive. Also on hand were representatives from the Nassau County District Attorney's office and the Crime Victim's Advocate Unit.

Abuse Case

Nassau County Assistant District Attorney Barry Greenan advised parents on various procedural aspects of the case, but cautioned them against telling personal stories as it might jeopardize evidence.

School Board Vice President Daniel MacBride and secretary James Martillo attended the meeting. Assistant superintendent for business services, William Hall, whose office is in charge of the District's transportation services, and the school's attorney were also available to answer questions. Willet Avenue School principal Michael Dunn was present. The absence of superintendent Catherine Fenton, who was on vacation, angered many parents.

Parents in attendance from Holy Family, Fork Lane and Dutch Lane schools said that Mr. Izzo has also driven for their schools. Several parents described difficulties when filing complaints about bus drivers and asked for direction on how to proceed in the future. Mr. MacBride suggested that complaints be put in writing and sent to the superintendent with copies sent directly to school board members at their homes. Concerns were raised over a perceived lack of parental notification regarding Mr. Izzo's first arrest in an incident involving a child from another district. Mr. MacBride suggested that the parents attend the school board's policy

committee meetings and "help draw up policy" for the district to follow. After a policy is presented to the board for adoption, three meetings must occur before the policy can be adopted. The next policy meeting is Wednesday, September 20 at 8 p.m. in the Administration Building.

Anyone with information about Mr. Izzo has been asked to call the Sex Crimes unit at 535-7816. The telephone number for the Crime Victim's Advocates Unit, which offers help to victims by providing information, counseling and referrals, is 535-4967 for County Court and 566-2000 for District Court.







Editorial Our Main Concern Should Be the Children

Hicksville's parents are justifiably angered by the case of a local school bus driver who was indicted on sexual abuse charges; and many parents have shown their anger to the court. But, now the matter is in the hands of the authorities and we can't let our thirst for justice get in the way of our real obligation—the children.

Clyde Friedman, a certified social worker at Central Nassau Guidance and Counseling Services, Inc., Hicksville, offers these suggestions to protect a child from sexual abuse:

- Find out where your child will be and what type of supervision will be provided.
- If you have a new babysitter, check references.
- If your son or daughter has a new friend who is a few years older, get to know that person.
- Tell your child what to do if someone makes them feel uncomfortable in a situation.
- It's okay for the child to scream and run away if someone touches them," Mr. Friedman said.
- Tell your child it's okay to say "No" to someone who tries to touch them.
- Tell your child not to accept anything from a stranger. For example, money or food.
- Tell the child that if anyone (a relative, close friend of the family, bus driver or babysitter) touches them in their private parts to tell their parents immediately.

Mr. Friedman advises that anyone seeking more information call the New York State Department of Child Protective Services at 800-342-3720. They can refer you to a local agency.

Should I Refinance My House?

There is no hotter topic today than "Should I Refinance My House?" Everyone knows that interest rates have fallen and many are stuck with high mortgage rates of 13 and 14 percent.

Everyone would like to lower his monthly payment. Is it wise to refinance—or should you take a home equity loan (that's a nice acceptable word for a second mortgage)—or should you do nothing?

My experience indicates that if you can't reduce your mortgage interest rate by 2½ percent or more, it is generally a non-

economical deal. It will take you too long to recoup your fees, points, surveys, etc. There will be too much up-front payment for too little long-term gain. This is especially true if you have a variable rate mortgage that is pegged to a current interest rate index.

If you do have a variable rate mortgage, it may be paid off with a prepayment penalty. Be sure to note the index to which the rate is tied and be sure to ask what the bank charges above that index.

There are two basic indices: the one-year treasury bill index and the Federal Home Loan Bank index. Generally the FHLB index is the higher of the two.

Many 15 and 30 year mortgages charge a prepayment penalty if you pay off in advance. It can amount to one or two percent of the unpaid balance, a steep penalty.

In general, you should not refinance with a variable rate mortgage if you intend to stay in your house for at least five years. Refinancing with a fixed rate is better. I base this on my assumption that rates are near the bottom right now and should start to escalate in about 18 months.

I recommend a 30-year mortgage rather than a 15-year mortgage, even though the interest paid is considerably more. Even if you can afford the higher 15-year monthly payments, you have more flexibility, more im-

mediate cash. In addition, if you make one additional prepayment each year, you will pay off a 30-year mortgage in about twenty-one years. Also, you will not lose much of the interest rate deduction on your tax return.

Should you refinance your first mortgage or keep it and seek a second mortgage? This depends on how much mortgage you have, how much you can get, the interest rates of both of these mortgages. I will discuss this next week. In the meantime, here's some homework. Go to the yellow pages and look under "mortgages" and look at the ads in all

of the newspapers. You will see how many people want your business and will be willing to lend you money at the best rate.

There is a lot of guesswork in bridge, but some of it can be overcome by careful play. Let's assume you're in four spades and West leads a heart. When dummy comes down you see that your only possible losers are a heart, a diamond and two clubs.

You realize that the diamond loser can be eliminated with a successful diamond finesse, and that one of the two club losers can also be rescued if you guess which way to take the

two-way club finesse against the jack.

You may therefore feel that the outcome depends largely on whether or not this is your lucky day. But if you consider the matter more thoroughly, you discover that making the contract is an absolute certainty (with correct play), and that it does not matter how the missing cards are divided.

You therefore win the heart lead with the ace, cash the K-A of trumps, and play a heart from dummy. East wins with the jack and presumably returns a low diamond. Now, contrary to all your natural instincts, you go up with the ace, deliberately rejecting the opportunity to finesse the queen!

Of course, there is method to your madness. You refuse the diamond finesse because by doing so you guarantee the contract 100 percent.

You next ruff your last heart in dummy and then exit with a diamond.

At this point, it does not matter to you whether East or West wins the trick with the king. The next play is bound to be either a club, which automatically eliminates one of your two potential club losers, or a diamond or heart, which allows you to ruff in dummy as you discard a club from your hand.
