

Board Members Charge Unethical Conduct

Two Hicksville school board members have charged that the teachers' contract agreed upon by the board was later changed by the school board president and three other board members.

Board members Jo Ann Miltenberg and William Bennett said that during recent negotiations, the board had agreed to grant the teachers a certain percentage increase, but school board president Mark Cardella later met independently with the president of the Hicksville Congress of Teachers Union, Robert Zaleski. The outcome of that meeting, which may have also been attended by vice president Daniel MacBride and trustees William Collins and James Martillo, according to Mrs. Miltenberg and Mr. Bennett, was an approximate 11 percent increase in the teachers' salaries for each of the next three years.

Mrs. Miltenberg and Mr. Bennett could not disclose the original percentage agreed upon by the board as the percentage was discussed during an executive board session.

However, a letter to the editor from Mrs. Miltenberg in this week's *Hicksville Illustrated News* said that the June budget allocated a total of 3.3 percent annual increase for teachers, in anticipation of negotiations. Therefore, according to Mrs. Miltenberg's letter, the teachers' contract could be increased three percent annually more than was originally proposed in the June budget.

Reached by telephone Monday, Mrs. Miltenberg said that if the union did not agree with the list of demands set forth originally by the board, then the list should have been brought back to the board for a review. Mrs. Miltenberg claims that the school board majority took the matter into their own hands because they "had their four votes." (There are seven board members). She called this action "unethical and immoral."

Mrs. Miltenberg added that as a taxpayer, she "cannot afford this new agreement." She said that if the contract is signed, the budgets for the next three years will result in a 15 increase per \$100 of assessed valuation "just for teachers' salaries."

Reached by telephone Tuesday morning, Mr. Cardella said that the agreement between the board and the teachers' union, was not changed. He added that any reference to the agreement being changed "was totally false."

Mr. Zaleski and Mr. Collins were reached by telephone Monday and refused to comment, saying "there's a news black-out" on teacher negotiations. Mr. MacBride could not be reached for comment.

Mr. Martillo, however, said he did not attend any meeting other than the one on Aug. 1 when the entire board met to discuss the negotiations. He added that "to his knowledge" the only other time that the negotiations were to be discussed was at this past Tuesday night's school board meeting. (The *Illustrated* went to press Tuesday afternoon.)

\$650,000 Bail Set For Robert Izzo

Accused child molester Robert Izzo made another appearance in Nassau County Court last week. His attorney, Anthony Capetola, again asked Judge Marvin Goodman, who had ordered Mr. Izzo jailed without bail, to release his client.

The defense attorney said that Mr. Izzo had lived his entire life in Nassau County, was married and had children of his own, had never been in trouble with the law until last May, and had been a serviceman. In addition, Mr. Capetola urged, he had letters from some 25 Hicksville residents — whom he did not name or identify — attesting to Mr. Izzo's good character.

The attorney asked that bail not exceeding \$10,000 be set so that Mr. Izzo could be released and participate in his defense.

Assistant District Attorney Maureen Ruer again advised that if bail were to be set, it would be in the sum of \$1 million.



Police Warn Residents of LILCO Impostor

A man posing as a LILCO employee has been entering homes in the Hicksville and Wantagh areas claiming to fix leaks and then demanding payments in cash, according to police.

The subject enters a home to check a gas leak. He then tells the victim that he found the leak, fixed it, and wants the fee paid in cash.

In one incident on Hunt Road in Wantagh, the subject demanded \$30 in cash. The homeowner said that she could only pay by check so the subject left the house.

In another incident, a Hicksville

homeowner asked for identification before letting the subject into the home, and the man fled in an unknown direction.

On August 8 at 3:30 p.m., the man entered a home on Plainview Road and charged the homeowner \$66 for the fictitious repair and then took \$100 from a kitchen drawer when she was not looking.



Judge Goodman, citing a probation department report prepared last week, called the accused a "poor parole risk," noting that if convicted on all existing charges, he faced a prison term ranging from 28 to 85 years.

The judge then set bail in the sum of \$650,000, an amount which Mr. Capetola later acknowledged that Mr. Izzo could not post. The slight bus driver, who had not uttered a word during the 10-minute appearance, was returned to jail.

The audience of about 40 residents, many of whom are parents of the children with whom Mr. Izzo came into contact while employed as a school bus driver, cheered when Judge Goodman set the bail amount, but were quickly admonished by the court officers to remain silent.

Mr. Capetola a moment later told reporters that he would consider petitioning the Appellate Division of the State Supreme Court this week for a bail reduction.

Judge Goodman also directed that a felony examination on the complaint against Mr. Izzo be heard in Part 9 of Nassau District Court on August 15. The state would by that date be required to begin proving its case against Mr. Izzo.



Teacher Negotiations

To The Editor:

In June, innuendoes circulated about two new board members being supported by the teachers' union. I had written a letter to the editor asking people not to prejudge. Now it is two months later and statements such as "We are bought and sold anyway, that's why" and "We have already given away the store, why stop now?", give a good indication of what direction negotiations are headed.

I was advised not to make a statement because it would be political suicide but I do not want to be political. What is about to happen to the community is a travesty. The entire board had agreed that in Hicksville we have some excellent teachers and we want to continue to encourage excellence in teaching. We set out to or at least we thought that we did "negotiate in good faith." But when the president of our Board takes it upon himself to accept HCT demands or four board members met to change the Board's list then I feel that it was unethical and immoral and I must speak out.

Included in the June budget provided by the community was a total of 8.3 percent increase for teachers in anticipation of negotiations. This was based on the fact that the majority of districts were settling at 7 percent plus a 1 percent increment. The Hicksville Board majority is now considering a three year agreement which will cost the tax payers 11.5 percent, 11.7 percent and 12.4 percent; five million, ninety three thousand, nine hundred dollars for three years; an increase of more than five dollars per assessed hundred in our taxes just for teachers' salaries. I am a home owner and a taxpayer in the community, something that I feel every board member should be, so they understand the impact of their decision. I do not want to see Hicksville become more industrialized to defray a tax increase. I do not want to see programs go or expenditures frozen on programs that my three daughters would have been entering. I know that we have terrific teachers in Hicksville, but the Hicksville community has said time and time again that we cannot afford any more increases. I implore you to attend every board meeting and watch your elected officials to be certain that the community's best interests are served—if not, asbestos removal will be the least of our financial problems.

Open Letter to Residents

To The Editor:

I am writing to you in desperation and with great urgency. Our newly installed school board officers are embarking upon a course of action that will enrage our tax-payers of Hicksville.

They have privately negotiated a salary package with the Hicksville Congress of Teachers (HCT) totaling 35.6 percent. Salary package increase over three years, totaling \$16,800,000.00.

This translates to a 10.4, 10.7 and 10.6 salary increase over that period, whereas the anticipated salary increases across Nassau County will run 7 percent, and State wide 6 percent, and in private industry 5.5 percent.

As an example, the President of the Board, Mr. Cardella, and Vice President Daniel MacBride, have negotiated a teacher salary of \$10,083,000 (MA-60) in 1988-89 to \$14,804,00 in 1991-92, an increase of \$4,721,00. Going from the lowest paid to the highest paid bracket and just in one year.

There is no question that our teachers required help in achieving a suitable wage increase, however, we were never given the opportunity to make that adjustment.

Mr. Zaleski, the president of the HCT and our Board President, Mr. Cardella, established the agenda privately and our negotiating team and the minority members of the Board had to follow our 22-year-old leaders' arrogant dictates.

Now the sad part - On August 1, we were advised by the Nassau County Board of Assessors that our 1989-90 tax rate WAS MUCH LOWER, by .81 cents per hundred. Our Budget carried a tax rate of \$28,290.54 tax increase, and is now set officially at \$27,48 (.73) that is a \$100,000.00 savings to you the TAX-PAYER. BUT MR. CARDELLA AND MR. MACBRIDE want to use some or all of that money to support the HCT salary package for 1988-89. This is a clear violation of TRUST, for this raid on your lowered tax-rate.

With so many budget defeats this year and the climate of the Tax Community, one would expect our new Board to consider the plight of the tax-payers, but the fact is Mr. Cardella lives with his mother and does not pay taxes, and the same holds true for Mr. MacBride, who also resides with his parents, but they embarked upon a plan that paid little regard to the tax payers and the burden that they must face in the coming years.

Our Asbestos abatement and removal plan will cost millions, and the costs of Health insurance, social security, retirement benefits, oil tank replacements, liability insurance, etc. went up two million dollars in 1988-89, and our young inexperienced board leaders have strapped you with a 2.1 million dollar salary package increase for 1990-91 with a frozen budget WITHOUT ANY INCREASE, for anything else (means a 2.00 tax increase) and in the next year another 1.00 increase just for teacher's salary.

How can this inexperienced Board of Cardella, MacBride, Martillo and Collins show such little regard to the tax-payers, whom they swore to protect in last May's election? I am embarrassed, frustrated and

desperate. Please Hicksville, stop this agreement between the Board and the HCT, if you remain silent, then we must ALL pay the price.





Safeguarding a Slam

South dealer.
Both sides vulnerable.

hearts, planning to ruff both of his
losing hearts in dummy.

Unfortunately, West trumped the
king of hearts, after which South
could not avoid going down one.
When he later tried to ruff the three
of hearts in dummy, West trumped
with the spade six, forcing dummy's
ten. This left West with the seven of
spades and dummy with the three, so
declarer had no way to dispose of the
losing ten of hearts.

At the second table, South also
arrived at six spades, and again the
opening lead was a diamond. But here
declarer took an entirely different
tack and made the contract as a
result.

After winning the diamond, he
also cashed the ace of hearts. But he
then led a low heart instead of the
king! His caution was rewarded when
West showed out, and East won the
trick with the nine. Whatever East
returned, declarer could not be
prevented from ruffing his remaining
heart loser with dummy's ten of spades.
It was then a simple matter to
draw trumps and take the rest of the
tricks.

It is true that the line of play
adopted by the second South might
have cost him an overtrick on many
deals. But when a vulnerable slam is
at stake, the question of an overtrick
has no place in declarer's deliberations.

The bidding:
South West North East
2 ♠ Pass 2 NT Pass
3 ♠ Pass 3 ♠ Pass
6 ♠ Opening lead — jack of diamonds.

This deal, which occurred in a
team event some years ago, illus-
trates the benefits of adopting a
guarded approach at the outset of
play. This attitude is particularly
important when a high-level contract
is at stake.

When the deal was played at the
first table, South reached six spades
after bidding spades and hearts along
the way. Declarer won the opening
diamond lead, cashed the ace of
spades and then played the A-K of


