## Special Christmas Gift For the Jurgensen's

For many of us, the invasion of Panama was just another piece of history taking place far away, but for the Jurgensen family of Hicksville the action might as well have been in their own back yard.

On Dec. 26 Joyce and Richard Jurgensen received a call from a retired military officer who is a HAM radio operator in Georgia.

"We were holding our breath," said Joyce. "But, this operator had good news. He patched through a call for us and it was Paul," her 19-year-old son who was among the first group of soldiers to enter Panama at the start of the invasion.

Since then, Paul's parents have been anxiously waiting for him to call. Joyce and Richard haven't seen Paul in more than a year.

During the HAM radio conversation, which lasted about a minute, Joyce said it was difficult to hear Paul, but he did say not to worry about him. She asked him when he was coming home, and he said he did not know.

She said that she really didn't have much time to talk because his voice was fading and she was crying.

He also kept mentioning something about an "award" but his voice started to sound like "Max Headroom." At the end of the conversation Paul said, "Mom, I have to go now...Merry Christmas."

While Joyce was waiting for the call to be patched in, she chatted with the HAM operator. She asked how many calls he had put through. "This is about my 75th," he answered. After the conversation was over with Paul, the operator said, "You did good Joyce, I thank-ed him profusely, he was an angel." Luckily, she was able to tape the conversation on the answering machine as Paul's dad was working. She said that she will be saving the tape to be played back to Paul when he gets married and has children.

"Getting a call from him was the best Christmas present ever," Joyce said.

Across the globe, the Jurgensen's other son

## Hicksville Man Killed in Jerusalem Accident

Fourth Fatal Accident on Jerusalem in '89

A 37-year-old Hicksville man was killed Thursday night when his 1985 Plymouth Voyager collided with a 1981 Mazda driven by a Levittown man, according to Nassau police spokesman Hank McCann.

Robert Gorski of West Avenue, Hicksville, was traveling westbound on Fourth Street and Robert Dandrea, 54, of Rock Lane, Levittown was southbound on Jerusalem Avenue when the accident occurred at about 10:45 p.m., McCann said. There is a traffic signal at Fourth Street. Four fatal accidents have occurred on Jerusalem Avenue in 1989.

Gorski, who was thrown from his van after it rolled over several times, was pronounced dead at the scene at 11:15 a.m.

Dandrea was taken to Nassau County Medical Center where he was treated and released for facial injuries.

## Hicksville Wraps Up The 1989 Holidays

This holiday season, Hicksville's residents were frantically clearing the shelves of local businesses. Most stores sold at least one hot item and many merchants said retail sales were good.

According to Michael and Matthew Garry, owners of Best Bet Deli at 77 North Broadway, the holidays were a time for local businesses to eat and be merry. The Garrys, who have completely renovated their store since they purchased it in May, said six foot heroes and trays of baked ziti, veal parmesan and their special chicken-and-broccoli salad were in great demand at holiday office parties.

Silvio's Bakery at 495-26 South Broadway, Hicksville Terrace Shopping Center, reported that the majority of customers were buying pies which included holiday favorites such as apple, peach, pumpkin, pecan and especially lemon meringue, which has no cholesterol, the way baker Silvio Alessi makes it.

Holiday Christmas cakes and logs, miniature pastries and cookies were popular this year,



They then exited their car and threw rocks at the man, who managed to pick up one of the rocks, which he threw at the car, breaking the windshield. The suspects then drove off. The victim was not hurt during the incident and he

called the police after arriving home.

The Second Squad is investigating as well as the police department's coordinator for bias related incidents, Inspector Ronald Olsen.

#### School Sign Vandalized

The clear plexiglass announcement board in front of the Administration Building next to Hicksville High School was spray-painted with ethnic slurs Dec. 27.

At 7:30 a.m., employees at the high school on Division Avenue discovered the vandalism which consisted of words spray painted in white that were hateful in nature and contained racial, ethnic and Semitic slurs that are demagogic, Nassau Police said.

The graffiti included the design of a swastika and the letters "TH C" which police say may be a signature of the person(s) responsible for the criminal mischief.

## Hicksville News Briefs

### Abrams Sues Sears

Attorney General Robert Abrams has filed suit against Sears, Roebuck & Co. for falsely claiming that its recent adoption of an "every-day low price" marketing strategy represented substantial savings for consumers compared to the store's former prices. In fact, the actual prices paid by customers remained largely unchanged on items shopped by his office during an 18-month investigation of the nation's largest retailer, Mr. Abrams said.

In addition, the suit, filed in State Supreme Court in Buffalo, alleges that during 1987 and 1988, Sears violated a 1986 agreement with the Attorney General to stop advertising sales that pretended to offer goods at discounts of up to 50 percent off Sears' "regular prices". In reality, the "regular prices" were frequently inflated, fictitious figures that consumers rarely, if ever, paid, and the "sale" prices were prices at which almost all sales were made, the suit stated.

Hicksville has a Sears branch on North Broadway.

### Environmental Commitment

Assemblyman Fred Parola (R-C, Wantagh) received one of the highest scores in the state legislature again this year in the annual legislative "scorecard" issued by the Environmental Planning Lobby (EPL), the state's major environmental lobbying group. This year's scorecard was based on a total of 27 votes, with Parola's vote on 23 of these bills in accordance with standards set by the EPL.

Also, Parola was promoted to Assistant Minority Leader of the Assembly in leadership appointments made by Assemblyman Republican Leader C.D. "Rapp" Rappleyea. As Assistant Minority Leader, Parola will be responsible for advancing legislative initiatives within the assembly and will help design statewide issue agendas.

*A Review of the 1980's*

America as we know it, had some startling changes during the 1980's. Sylvester Stallone's Rambo, became the new super hero. Barbie was

as popular as ever, though she changed to reflect the new image of the 1980's woman.

The role of women in the society changed tremendously. It was

the result of the civil rights acts of the 1970's which included women as a minority with

rights. The doors opened in business and the professions, as never before. No longer were women relegated to the assigned roles of nurse or teacher as the only profession. They were able to be more than "educated fingers" (secretaries) in business. The Business schools were flooded with them (still are). Now they can be "whatever they want to be." Their rise through the ranks has started. Soon there will be major corporations run by women who did not inherit the position from a dead husband. I believe that this is a great development. Business needs the brains, it is in such short supply.

We saw the 1980's bring on the rise of the older person. Reagan knew that there was a tremendous base of people who were getting older. He was one of them. He used this base to become president on the promise that there life style would not be cut by the government. To a great extent, he succeeded. In addition, the social security "perks" were dramatically increased.

Reagan also knew that there was very active resentment against President Carter because of his perceived impotence and the inefficiency

of our armed forces. The Iranian excursion dealt Carter a fatal blow. President Reagan spent money on the armed forces like no peacetime President before him.

He also followed the tactic of every presidential candidate. He said that he would cut taxes. He certainly did that. He also raised them tremendously when the social security "premium" was raised. But his article is not an assessment of Reagan's presidency, it is a review of the 80's. We saw beginning in 1982 a dramatic rise in stock prices and dealmaking. We saw the rise of the young wheeler dealer on wall street and the dramatic rise of the use of corporate debt.

It became the age of the "yuppie", who became the "dink" (double income no kids). Young people, men and women, who made large sums and spent even larger sums. They were accurately personified in "Bonfires of the Vanities". Along with the huge incomes came their huge greed.

The wheeler dealer is personified by M. Milken of Drexel, Burnham, Lambert. He was the ultimate artist at capitalizing on other peoples' lust for money. In the process he earned

with his fertile brain, billions of dollars in commissions for himself and his firm. He took the business of corporate borrowing and turned it into an art form. Corporations have borrowed money for ages, reasonable amounts, to arrange takeovers, mergers and acquisitions. It was generally large companies with healthy balance sheets taking over smaller companies. Milken raised so much capital for takeovers that firms with capital and with no manufacturing ability took over increasingly larger firms in leveraged buyouts. He used deep discounted, high yield bonds to accomplish the job. What Milken pioneered, and the reason he was rewarded well, was the fact that he could turn companies to "Junk." He became a person of immense influence, a present day J.P. Morgan. This spurred a whole new business for the mutual funds, "junk bond" high yield funds.

There is so much more that happened. It was the decade of the Japanese and the Pacific rim countries dominance around the world, the rise and slippage of Chrysler with Lee Iacocca. Lastly, it has been the pervasive influence of drugs in the world, especially in the United States.

# Direct Line

Before we make Mikhail Gorbachev a saint, how about paying respect to the American Presidents who along with NATO, defended western Europe against the "evil empire."

Remember when Ronald Reagan first used that phrase? Much of the liberal media was very critical of his stand — too strident and too harsh. But was it? In retrospect, it is clear that underneath the smothering of individual rights was a seething eastern European community desirous of freedom. Stifling free expression, using tanks to force submission, no open elections, and constitutions guaranteeing communist party power are all direct examples of the "evil."

After World War II, there was Harry Truman. President Truman knew the threat, supported the formation of NATO, and stopped communist aggression in Korea. He drew the line with his policy of containment and said no more territorial grabs for communism. But, China fell and additional portions of eastern Europe were overrun by the "red tide."

After Truman, President Eisenhower, with his deep knowledge of Europe, galvanized NATO to head off the expansionist goals of the Soviet Union. He even organized one campaign which mobilized Italian-Americans. They were asked to write letters to relatives urging them to reject communism in Italy. And, the letter writing paid off — the communists were defeated at the polls.

In our own hemisphere, John F. Kennedy confronted Krushchev over Soviet atomic missiles in Cuba and the Kremlin withdrew.

President Johnson, through miscalculation, attempted to stop communism in Vietnam. We lost the will at home and lost the battle



in southeast Asia as well.

Next, Richard Nixon, "played the China card." That move kept the Russians off balance. President Nixon then sought to reach agreements with the Soviet Union on missiles — the result was a first sign of any that in the cold war.

Ronald Reagan strengthened our military posture — a military which the faltering Soviet economy could not match. The Kremlin was forced to bargain, and the rest is seen each day as we view the headlines about changes in eastern Europe.

Throughout the forty-four-year period from the end of World War II, a strong U.S. military has been the deterrent. There were times during those years when doves in the Congress, the "organized" peace movement, and some of the media would have had us unilaterally disarm. How fortunate we were to have presidents of both parties who understood the threat and took the heat in maintaining a strong military.

Now we have the opportunity to turn closer to home. Castro will have nothing to do with glasnost or perestroika. Nicaragua still exports arms to the Marxist rebels in El Salvador, and Soviet influence flirts with Panama.

There are some in the Congress who would have us give up in Central America. Are they really ready to transfer the "evil empire" from eastern Europe to this hemisphere? Do they really want constitutions guaranteeing communist power a few hundred miles away?

Only when the arms stop flowing to El Salvador, and free elections are permitted in Cuba and Nicaragua, can we acknowledge Gorbachev as a peace maker. Until then, communism, in our own hemisphere remains a threat to our national interests.

President Bush is proceeding cautiously and prudently with the Soviet Union. He anticipated what was to come — "The totalitarian era is passing; its old ideas blown away like leaves from an ancient lifeless tree." Those words were expressed by George Bush at his inaugural. But neither he, nor anyone else, could anticipate the leaves would be blown by hurricane force winds. The "leaves" are almost gone.




