## HS Students, Staff Get Measles Shots

Approximately 1,350 Hicksville High School students and staff were slated to be inoculated this past Tuesday after a 15-year-old student was diagnosed with measles.

The Nassau County Department of Health set up a clinic in the high school gyms for free vaccinations after notifying the Hicksville district administration of the confirmed case on March 6.

Nora Richards, district spokesperson, said that a letter was sent home to all students, parents and staff notifying them of the vaccination program. Those who have already had a second measles vaccination are exempt from the clinic. The Department of Health warned that students who do not receive the second measles vaccination may be subject to exclusion from school.

There are approximately 1,200 students who have not as yet received their school measles vaccination, Richards said.

She added, "The student who contracted the measles has been tracked to indicate that exposure during school hours has been limited to the high

## IKEA Opens New Store In Hicksville

While many areas are suffering a setback due to the recession, Hicksville is experiencing a business boom.

IKEA, a Sweden-based home furnishing store which opens next Wednesday at the Broadway Mall, recently hired more than 270 workers to operate the new Hicksville store.

About 1,700 people were interviewed for jobs at IKEA, according to Jean Marc Claiser, store manager. He added that many Long Islanders were hired, including people from the Hicksville area.

"This is going to be a big opportunity for Hicksville," said Peter Sharkey of security, a recently hired employee. "There's a lot of jobs for younger people!"

The Hicksville store, IKEA's first in New York State, occupies 226,000 square feet—the size of five football fields—and is a free standing building on the mall property. IKEA has 91 stores in 22 countries worldwide.

IKEA offers home furnishing, ranging from sofas to soup spoons, wall units to wine glasses to wallpaper. The furniture and other household products are imported from Sweden and are also made in the United States.

Claiser attributes the store's reasonable prices to IKEA's do-it-yourself method. Customers who purchase furniture, in many cases, transport the goods home and assemble

themselves. Claiser said, "If you have difficulty putting it together, we have specialists who can help by phone."

"If you need more screws we send them out UPS [United Parcel Service]."

He added that IKEA has a "very good return policy. If you take it home and don't like it, we'll give you your money back." In addition, savings are passed onto the customers

## Silver Jubilee Celebration At Holy Trinity

Holy Trinity Diocesan High School will not just be reflecting on 25 years of memories during its anniversary celebration this year, but will be setting the ground work for its future.

As a result of its year-long celebration, money will be raised at selective events to help implement a new scholar incentive program, expand its communication curriculum and to upgrade the school auditorium.

Trinity will be hosting an elaborate dinner dance at the Crest Hollow Country Club in Woodbury and will be raffling off a 1991 Ford Explorer, both on April 12.

"Such an anniversary celebration is not merely an opportunity to look back," school principal James J. Boglioli said. "It is a time to turn the page of the next chapter in Trinity's history."

All proceeds for the dinner, raffle and ad journal will go directly toward these three future improvements at the school.

This past Sunday, Trinity honored one of its past principals, Msgr. John Seiden schwang at a special mass concelebrated by Most Rev. John R. McGann, bishop of Rockville Centre, and priests from neighboring parishes. Msgr. Seiden schwang, now pastor at St. Anne's in Garden City, joined the Holy Trinity family in 1975. "Msgr. John was a major force in the school growth and development," said Boglioli.

Under Msgr. John's leadership, the number of computers at the school increased from five to 100, extra science labs were made mandatory to give students more hands-on experience, a sophomore enrichment program was instituted, and improvements were made in the math, science and language arts programs.

"He really turned the school around," said

William Dalton, director of development and a teacher at Trinity since its early years. "His management style was to get people to say, 'Yes, we have to reform. We need programs that will make the students feel good about themselves,'" said Dalton.

Trinity's theme throughout its anniversary celebration is "Thank You For The Moment." Dalton explained that in many cases each Trinity student remembers one particular and special moment during his or her high school days. Those "moments" will be highlighted in pictures at the dinner dance. One important event captured in photographs—for example homecoming, football games, the ring dance—for each graduating class will be posted on huge boards at the dance.

Other events planned for Trinity's anniversary celebration include a 5-K Run, sponsored by the Hicksville Lions Club, on

April 14 at the school. Earlier this year, Trinity hosted a dinner theatre called "The No Frills Review" as part of its celebration.

Another goal of Trinity during this celebration is to reunite alumni, parents and friends. "I think what makes this school unique is the people," said Dalton. "Not only do alumni tell us we've prepared them well, but they tell us they've always felt like family."

Trinity, a Catholic high school for grades 9-12, opened its doors on Newbridge Road in Hicksville in 1966 with 660 freshmen. Its first graduating class was in 1970. This year Trinity has 1,420 students enrolled, and expects to have 1,470 students walk through its doors in September.

"Trinity has established a rich tradition of excellence," said principal James Boglioli. "The vision of a school where a youngster can receive a value-centered education in a family atmosphere remains alive."

## NEWSBRIEFS

### Supreme Court Upholds Oyster Bay Town Decision

A Supreme Court Judge upheld the Town of Oyster Bay's decision to deny a permit for a developer to construct an office building near residential homes.

Peter DeJana had applied to the town in 1990 for a special use permit to build a two-story office building and operate a public garage, store heavy equipment outdoors and repair vehicles in connection with municipal services. The property is located on West John Street, west of Kuhl Avenue, Hicksville.

The town denied the permit in September 1990 because "the proposed use would cause undue noise, odor and fumes to penetrate surrounding residences." The board also said that granting this application would result in "appreciable reduction in the market value of properties in the area."

Dejana took the issue to the Supreme Court which ruled in favor of the town board's decision.

Judge Robert Roberto, Jr. presided over the case.

### Town Still Waiting For New Traffic Signal

A traffic light which was scheduled for installation in January has been delayed, according to the New York State Department of Transportation (DOT).

The signal was slated for installation in front of the Motor Vehicle Department on Broadway at Ludy Street in January 1991.

A DOT spokesperson said the contract that includes the installation of this signal has been awarded and construction is expected to begin shortly. There are several signals contained in this contract, which is scheduled for completion in January 1992.

"This signal will be installed as early in the contract as possible," said James O. Frein, Acting Regional Traffic Engineer of the DOT. "The contractor is awaiting delivery of materials necessary for this installation."

The Town of Oyster Bay requested the light because of dangerous traffic situations in that area.

### Man Sentenced In Abuse Case Said He Aided Robert Izzo

A Williston Park man was sentenced last week to the maximum term of 2½ to 7 years in jail for sexually abusing a 10-year-old girl in his home in 1987.

The man, Anders Quintano, 33, also said that he drove a school bus while Robert Izzo sodomized a kindergartener. Izzo was found guilty on Feb. 27 on 35 counts of child abuse.

Quintano pleaded guilty last year to first-degree sexual abuse and criminal facilitation, said Ed Grilli, spokesperson for Nassau District Attorney Denis Dillon.

# Business Leaders Bring Home County Awards

## Next Stop: State Competition

Hicksville High School's Future Business Leaders of America will continue their climb up the corporate ladder as they participate in a state-wide competition this spring.

Four club members have already made their mark on the county level this year by collecting seven top awards at a business leadership competition in Westbury.

Come April, however, five members will get another opportunity to compete—this time against 2,000 of their peers. Michael Chang, Sandeep Chainani, Sal DeFazio, Hedy Elbedewi and Kathy Rombach will represent the Hicksville chapter of the Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) at the New York State FBLA Leadership Conference held in Rochester April 8 through April 10. At the conference, under the guidance of their advisor, Ed Sullivan, the students will attend workshops, participate in competitions and learn leadership training.

At the state-wide competitions this spring, the students will "meet new people, learn leadership qualities, and what it's like to compete," Sullivan said.

At the Nassau County FBLA County Leadership Competition held last month at SUNY Farmingdale, Hicksville placed first, second and third in a variety of categories. Michael Chang took first place in business mathematics, second place in Introduction of Business and Computer Concepts. The business mathematics portion required Chang to take a 100 question test, with the highest score receiving first place.

Hedy Elbedewi won first place in Office Procedures and third place in Introduction to Occupations. The second place award for Office Procedures went to Sandeep Chainani. Denise DeBenedictis won second place for Business Ownership and Marketing.

Although the club has won awards on the county level in the past, "This is the best we've ever done in first, second and third place," said Sullivan.

The business club, now in its sixth year, has 17 members who meet a few times a month after school. So far this year, the club has hosted three major fund-raisers. One included a Type-A-Thon to benefit the American Red Cross. The chapter members raised \$168.70.

At the general meetings the students are introduced to business procedures through teacher guidance and rap sessions.

Through the club, "we hope they get some experience in the business world," said Sullivan, a high school business teacher.

Eleventh grader Hedy Elbedewi said that as a club member she is getting a jump on her planned accounting career. She said that Ed Sullivan helps the students prepare for the competitions and outlines what to expect in the business world.

"I feel I will advance [more quickly] when I get into the business field," she said.

In other high school news, 12th grader Christopher Munson has been chosen by the school and the Hicksville Elks Lodge as February's Student-Of-The-Month.

Among the academic leaders of his class, Chris is also a member of the many clubs. He is currently on the School Improvement Committee and the Youth Advisory Committee. He is also a student government representative, a member of the National Honor Society and Spanish Honor Society, on the Prom Committee, in the Orchestra and Festival Chorus, and a member of Athletes Against Substance Abuse.

Additionally, he has interviewed Assemblyman Fred Parola on Channel 10,

because IKEA purchases in large quantities for all its stores.

The showroom, located on the second floor, contains real-life room settings of bedrooms, bathrooms, living rooms, kitchens, offices and work rooms. IKEA supplies its customers with catalogues, tape measures, shopping lists and a small pencil for jotting down notes and measurements.

After choosing their items, customers must collect those goods at the self-service warehouse. Information Stations are located on every floor if a customer needs help. Through the use of computers, trained personnel can help customers design rooms.

There is a parking canopy located outside the shipping area for customers to load their cars.

The first floor houses the Marketplace and features lamps, gift shops, bed linens, curtains and blinds, textiles, area rugs, plants, frames, tools, hardware and wicker.

IKEA also provides supervised play rooms for children while their parents are shopping; one "ballroom" filled with bright plastic balls for children 3 to 6 years of age and the other for children ages 7 to 10. ### Increased School Bus Safety

The New York State Senate has passed legislation which will strengthen qualifying procedures and require the fingerprinting and comprehensive screening of all school bus attendants throughout the state.

Senator Norman Levy, who sponsored the state law requiring the fingerprinting and increased screening of all school bus drivers, said that he introduced this measure to further safeguard children from incidents involving child abuse, including sexual and other physical abuse, by school bus attendants.

Under this bill, school districts would be mandated to require all school bus attendants to be fingerprinted and be subject to the same increased criteria for employment as bus drivers.

The actual fingerprinting would be done by the bus attendant's employer. The identification would then be forwarded to the State Department of Motor Vehicles, which would request a criminal history check from the state Division of Criminal Justice Services. Motor Vehicles would then inform the bus company and the applicant if the applicant is qualified to be employed as a school bus attendant.

# New For Villages: Contested Elections

In the recent past, most village elections in Nassau County have been leisurely affairs in which the incumbents ran either unopposed or with less-than-forceful opposition.

For example, in tiny (1,200-resident) Bellmore, the Village Party is being challenged on two fronts and has resulted in a three-way race for the mayor's position, plus four candidates for two trustee positions. The heat has resulted in standing-room only debates and considerable community discussion.

And considering the interest, there are some in the community who believe there may be a chance that an opposing candidate could win at least one position.

Another heated race pits East Hills Mayor Leonard Nadel of the East Hills Party against Larry Aaronson of the Unity Party.

In Floral Park, Bea Cook—the first non-Citizens Party candidate for office in the western-Nassau village, focuses her attention on controlling government costs to minimize the impact of taxes on local residents. She also believes that, in general, the village of Floral Park should go beyond one-party politics.

The Westbury-based Coalition Party, which is sending three trustee candidates and a village-justice candidate against the three incumbent Action Party trustees and a village justice candidate, has challenged the village's policies on development, garbage disposal and entry into a state pension plan as parts of their overall contention that the 15,000-resident community is run badly.

In some cases, the incumbents are responding sharply to not only defend their records, but also indicate why the opposition is off base. For example, supporters of the Action Party trustees in Westbury (Paul Echasse, Bridget Zaino and Alphonse Campbell) maintain that the Coalition Party's literature is inflammatory and inaccurate, and that the Coalition candidates (Chip Zaino, Joe Pasarella and John Burnett) challengers have no strong stand on or understanding of the issues.

Sometimes, elections are not only heated,

but complex. For example, Mineola Mayor Ann Galante of the Hometown Party is not seeking another term, and Deputy Mayor Robert Hinck is running for her place against Independent Party candidate Sal Cataldo.

There are two trustee seats available, but the Hometown Party is running only one trustee for the position, John Colbert. Incumbent Frank Pewarski of the Citizens'

Sheila Ong and Al Gallo against mayoral candidate Lawrence Ceriello and trustee candidates Laurann Pandelakis and Richard Drago. The issue is the granting of certain variances from the village code to enable a developer to build on the former Bonwit Teller property.

In little Sea Cliff, trustee Ted Blackburn of the Civic Progress Party is running against Robert Pucciaiello of the New Village Party

Party is running unopposed. In addition to Pewarski, Patricia Frasco is also running for a trusteehip. Because the Citizens decided not to run anyone for the mayoral seat, Mr. Cataldo—originally of the Citizens' Party—decided to run on the Independent ticket.

Got that?

In Munsey Park, a contested election pits mayor Arthur Schultheiss and trustees

for the mayor's spot vacated by Norman Parsons (who endorses Ted Blackburn). Two trustee candidates from each party—incumbent Claudia Moyne and Peter Speranza of Civic Progress and John Barabiere and Michael Riccardi of New Village—are running for election.

Still, in a few communities, the votes are not complex at all—since they are uncontested. For example, on the Great Neck peninsula, none of the six village elections are contested. And in New Hyde Park, trustees William Fischl and Jack Briguglio and Justice Richard Morici are running unopposed, as are Williston Park village trustee Ludwig Odierna and Justice Nicholas Francis O'Shea.

Considering the fire and brimstone of many village elections, it is interesting that in one village—Garden City—the fire and brimstone has been over for more than a month. For their residents, election contests ended Feb. 12, when Deputy Mayor Brian Devaney overwhelmingly defeated local attorney Jack Curry—a sitting trustee—in the mayoral race.

The election was unprecedented because Mr. Curry, a sitting trustee, decided to challenge Mr. Devaney, who was the choice of the nominating committee of the eastern part of the village. Although the move was appropriate under the Community Agreement, Garden City's unique form of government, it was the first time in the venerable village's history that a candidate for mayor was challenged by a fellow trustee.

An alarmingly large number of players show a lack of respect for safety plays. What is annoying about this attitude is that their casual disrespect usually does not wind up costing them a blessed farthing because the remote situation that they should be trying to protect against seldom occurs.

However, lightning sometimes does strike, and when that happens these players often wind up licking

their wounds and bemoaning their fate. For example, consider this deal where South gets to six spades and sees — or should see — that the only way he can lose the slam is to lose two trump tricks.

So, instead of dismissing this possibility, which seems exceedingly remote, South should concentrate all his thoughts on ways of overcoming a 4-0 trump division, if that unlikely distribution happens to exist.

In line with this, he should win the diamond lead in dummy and return a low trump. When East follows suit with the six, South should play the seven, being perfectly willing to lose the trick to the nine, ten or queen in order to assure the slam beyond the shadow of a doubt.

In the actual deal, the safety play pays off and South avoids going down one. Going up with the ace on the first trump lead would be correct if East played the nine, ten or queen at trick two, or if East showed out on the first trump lead. In all of these cases, South could then hold himself to either one trump loser or none with proper play.

This frame of mind — where declarer prays for the best but prepares for the worst — is often crucial to achieving a winning result. It pays to plan the play.

## YA Gotta Have Art: Poetica Musica At Heckscher Museum

Like the Rock of Gibraltar at the gates of the Mediterranean, the Heckscher Park in Huntington. A vest-pocket museum snug enough to enjoy chamber music or poetry yet large enough to leisurely view a cogent visual exhibit without needing a road map to negotiate a labyrinth of display rooms.

Saturday, March 9, was the first in a series of three evenings of chamber music by the Long Island chamber group, Poetica Musica. Titled "The Sound of Color", the program was chosen to compliment the current work on view — "Transformations Into Color: The Art of Stan Brodsky".

Brodsky's lush landscapes, still-life and abstract oils demonstrate an ability to weave a mosaic of deep tones and vibrant luminosity of color as well as an affinity for the land and sea.

While the Poetica group includes a guitarist/flutist, Saturday's performance featured soprano and Poetica artistic director Eleanor Valkenburg and pianist George Schlein.

While Poetica succeeded in evoking the spirit behind the works rather than merely painting a word-picture, the music and art did seem at times, mutually exclusive. While Brodsky's oils are quite approachable to the uninitiated, Poetica's music acted as a backdoor to the intuitive under-belly of the artist.

Musically the program included accompanied chansons and solo piano pieces.

Valkenburg's strong, rich mezzo-soprano resonated through the main exhibition rotunda on Maurice Ravel's *Tout gai!*, but was most melodically pleasing on his *Chanson des Cueilleuses de Lentisques*.

The soaring impressionistic passages of Henri Duparc's *L'Invitation au Voyage* accompanied by a watery, melodic piano-underpinning were right at home with Brodsky's various sea-scapes.

Duparc's *La Vie Anterieure* found Valkenburg at her most evocative in a carefree give-and-take with the accompanist.

Schlein's keyboard prowess was showcased on American Charles Griffes' *Fantasy Pieces, Opus 6*.

The *Barcarolle* is a tense piece culminating in a rolling-boil of sonic interplay. The *Not-*

*turbo* provided relief with its playful introduction and sensual dimension. The *Scherzo*'s floating, whole-tone melodies are juxtaposed against an ominous, almost militaristic sub-structure.

Artistically, the evening was as firmly grounded as the Rock of Gibraltar.




