RING THE FIFTY-Year period 1880-1930 farm lands Din New York State were abandoned at the rate of 100,000 a year. During this period 4,920,000 acres passed out of farm use. There are 5.8 million acres of these idle and submarginal farm lands. They constitute a great problem. The State Planning Council has been cooperating with agencies in this State in an attempt to find uses for these lands.

The steady decline in farm acreage has, in large part, been brought about by farm abandonment due to transfer of the more intensive farming operations to the more fertile soils.

The agricultural problem is not limited, however, to abandoned and submarginal farm lands. Slack markets and low prices for the products of good farm lands have a very direct reaction on the prosperity of industrial communities. When farm income goes up or down factory payrolls invariably follow.




