Whatever sum was used to defeat Mr. Maverick could not have been a drop in the bucket compared with the money lavishly tossed about by the Roosevelt Administration to save this fountain of New Deal inspiration, not to mention a personal endorsement by Mr. Roosevelt himself. For instance, a few days before the primary the New Deal sum clearance authority announced an allocation of \$3,500,000 for San Antonio—in the heart of Mr. Maverick's district.


