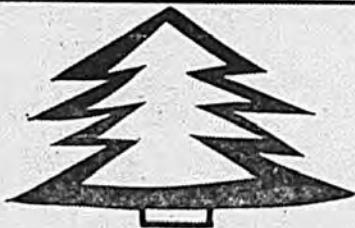

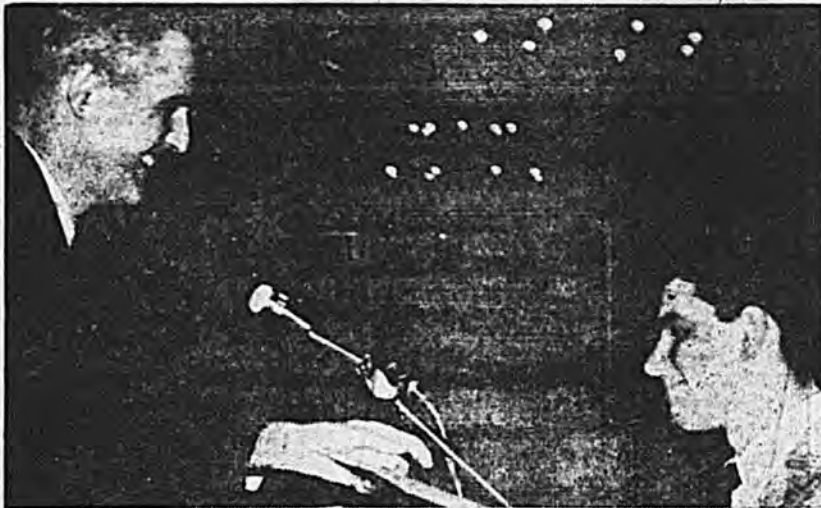

Fire Destroys Four Stores

A fire of undetermined origin has destroyed four stores in the shopping plaza on Jerusalem Avenue near the railroad station. The loss was estimated at \$100,000.

The fire started at about 8 P.M. Sunday and was reported under control at 11 P.M. by members of the Hicksville Fire Department. Fire Chief John Specht said the structures were a total loss. He said the cause of the fire was unknown and called for an immediate investigation by the Nassau Fire Marshal's office. The fire marshal's office said the loss was covered by insurance. The owner of the stores at numbers 4, 6, 8 and 10 Jerusalem Ave. is the Kirby Realty Co. of New York City.

This year's drive began on November 22nd one year to the day that President Kennedy died.

Chairman Bruce Blatt said "President Kennedy did so much to attract young people to government that we decided to see that no one would be discouraged because of the high cost of a college education." If the person receiving the scholarship decides to attend Hofstra, the University will match the amount of the scholarship.

The fund includes about 50 teenage volunteers

headed by Glatt, and Co-chairmen, David Rule, Joe Rohan, and Robert Farrington.

Ralph Sonntag, right tackle on Hicksville High's 1964 football team will be named to the All-Metropolitan Football team by one or more of the New York evening newspapers.

Fullback Larry Wesolko, who bore the brunt for coach Jim Grantham's running game, will be named to the second team All-County All-Scholastic team.

Films of that winning touchdown in the Plainview-Hicksville game confirm the score should not have been allowed. Clipping was called on the play but the flag was thrown down late on the five yard line. The umpire declared no touchdown but the referee ruled the flag was thrown after the score and allowed the TD. It was hotly disputed by coach Grantham but got nowhere. The movies are clear that the clip came before the runner was over the five yard line.

Hicksville High has added another basketball game to its schedule. The Orange and Black will meet Lutheran at Hicksville on December 23rd. That leaves the Comets just one short of a complete schedule. We have been assured that in case of a tie in the standings Hicksville would not be hurt by not playing a complete schedule. Just how it would be resolved hasn't been advanced. Selectors for the Rose Bowl are in an ivory tower justifying the better record deserves the nod decision.

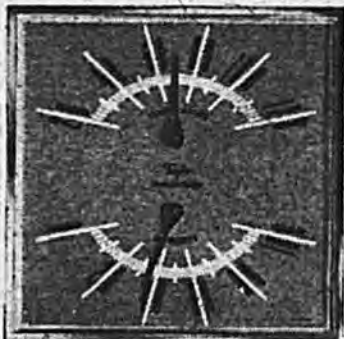

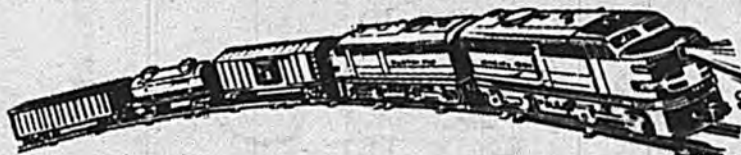
