Postal Worker Saves Youth's Life

George was honored for his quick thinking in using a life-saving technique on 2 year old Karin Plackis who was choking on a frankfurter. It was a quiet afternoon at Friendly's Restaurant in Plainedge when suddenly 2 year old Karin Plackis began choking on a hotdog. She began to turn blue as she gasped for air unable to breathe with a frankfurter lodged in her throat. Her mother panicked when all her efforts to remove the frankfurter failed. At this point Hicksville Postal employee, George Gidicsin, 32 years, from Baldwin, began to administer the procedure taught him for conscious obstruction to the child.

"It took four sets of back blows and chest thrusts to remove the food. I acted on instinct. I'm glad I had the training. It all came back to me," said George. "When I finally dislodged the food she began crying. It was the best sound I could hear. This experience was something I will never forget."

Mr. Gidicsin was awarded a Letter of Commendation and a Certificate of Appreciation today by Hicksville Sectional Center Manager/Postmaster Anthony M. Murello. "I commend you for

your quick thinking and life-saving action," said Mr. Murello.

Hicksville Post Office has trained 195 of its employees in CPR since 1982. In that time eight lives have been saved.

Mrs. Plackis attended the award presentation and made a donation to the American Heart Association whose representative trained the seven Postal CPR instructors. "I will be eternally grateful to Mr. Gidicsin for saving my daughter and I'm also grateful to the Postal Service for providing this life saving training for their employees," said Mrs. Plackis.

Hicksville F.D. Election Results

Voting took place on Tuesday, December 11, in the Hicksville Fire District. Commissioners elected were Al Bianculli with 215 votes and Richard Kershow with 201. Mr. Bianculli is filling the 1 year unexpired term of retired Commissioner John McMann. Kershow was re-elected to a 5 year term.

Sanitation Schedule For The Holidays

The Town of Oyster Bay sanitation collection schedule will be modified for the Tuesday, December 25 (Christmas) and Tuesday, January 1, (New Year's) holidays, according to Town Councilman Thomas L. Clark.

"Residents who normally have collection on Tuesday will receive a special pickup on Wednesday, December 26 and January 2," Clark explained. Regular Monday collection will be made on December 24 and December 31.

Clark noted that all Town offices and park facilities will be closed on Christmas and New Year's day.

Seniors Protest P.O. Closing

The closing of the branch Post Office, which was located in the Sterns Store at Mid-Island Plaza Shopping Mall, is causing a hardship for some people, especially Senior Citizens who must depend on public transportation.

It would seem that the volume of business at the Plaza would warrant the continuation of a Post Office there. Since there are a number of empty stores it should not be too difficult to find a location.

At a recent meeting of the Hicksville Friendship Club, members were urged to write to Representative Norman Lent.

Remember when mail was delivered twice a day and the nearest small shopping center had a branch Post Office.

Hicksville Fire Dept. Promotes Fire Safety

Over 1500 persons attended the Annual Hicksville Fire Department Holiday Open House on Sunday, December 9 at Fire Headquarters. Santa was on hand for the kids. However, the main focus was on the adults. In this country over 8,000 persons die each year from fire. Most of those fires are preventable.

The Fire Department is trying to keep everyone in our area from being a statistic. Earlier this year 7 persons in one family died in a house fire. Why? Because they did not have a smoke detector, they did not have an escape plan, they did not follow simple fire safety rules.

Before anyone got to see Santa they had to sit through a brief Fire Safety lecture. Given by the

N.C. Fire Service Academy's Public Fire Education Division. Certain key topics were touched such as "Stop-Drop and Roll" actions to take if your clothing catches fire. Another was "Crawl Low in Smoke". Many people die from smoke inhalation long before the fire gets to them. Other topics touched were the importance of having a smoke detector, knowing the benefits of having a pre-arranged escape plan. As Hicksville Chief Owen Magee puts it, "Santa was for the kids but the majority of the displays and lectures were for the benefit of the adults. We are breeding unsafe people. Only fire safety education is going to change the shocking fire death rate."

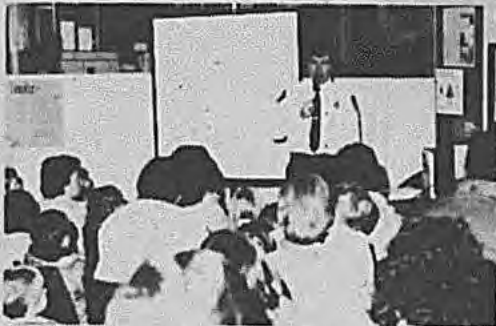

Chetkof Re-elected Water Commissioner

Bernard Chetkof, a one year incumbent serving as a Commissioner on the Plainview Water Board, was re-elected on Tuesday, December 11, defeating his challenger Louis J. Gallo by a vote of 1109 to 608. (At press time the paper ballots were not included in that figure). This was a near record turnout.

Assemblyman Lewis J. Yevoli, R.A.G.E. (Residents Against Garbage Expansion) and many civic associations in the area. According to his campaign coordinator Judy Jacobs, "Bernie Chetkof has worked tirelessly on behalf of the residents of Plainview/Old Bethpage along with Assemblyman Lewis J. Yevoli. He truly earned the support of the

people and this was their way of saying 'thank you.'

Chetkof said, "I am deeply thankful for this victory and I thank everyone who made it possible. I pledge to continue a total commitment to the protection of our water supply and my only interest will be the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the people. Thank you."

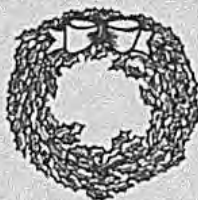

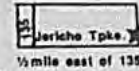

Should sisters be 'keepers'?

Q. Do you think it's so terrible to expect our two older children (they are 13 and 15 years old) to help with the little one once in awhile? He's 3 and really a delightful little boy.

They are girls and object more on the basis of his being a boy than his age. They insist they don't know anything about kids like him and are very reluctant about spending any time with him.

Even though he goes to a fine nursery school there are times later in the afternoon, early evenings or weekends when it would be nice if they would read to him, play games with him or watch carefully selected television shows together.

Am I being unreasonable?

A. As long as they still have time for their own school, social and other activities, you might work out schedules with them (yours as well as theirs) that result in their sharing some responsibility (and enjoyment) related to him. Incidentally, they may be quite surprised at how full your days are.

Their reason for being reluctant sounds like an excuse without much substance. There may come a time, which is probably too far in the future for them to think about right now, when it will be essential that they begin to know something "about kids like him." A good start can be provided now with a child who is apparently pleasant to be around.

Q. Maybe this is just too much of a good thing with my 12-year-old, and that's what bothers me. She talks to me a lot, even confides in me about her friends, teachers and other things that are often quite personal.

She and I went to see "Terms of Endearment" and she expressed her concern that we might have times when we'd be in conflict. I told her that it was just natural that we might, and I really believe that.

The issue is this: Can we be overdoing this "togetherness" bit, to the point where we'll be depending on each other too much?

A. Because you are obviously alert to changes that take place in parent-child relationships over the years and also the need for each of you to have other relationships with family and friends, it sounds as though the danger might be pretty slim.

It's so nice to have the warmth between you now. The teen years, to come aren't always so smooth, although they might be between the two of you.

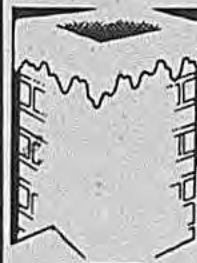

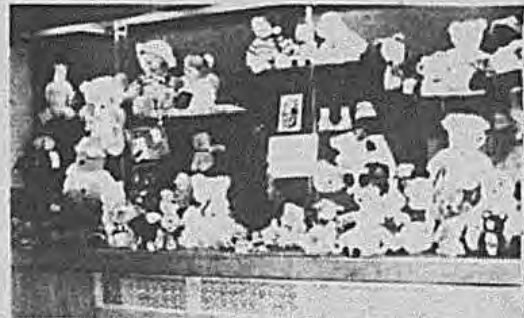

Mixed Reaction On Seat Belts For School Buses

Callers to Input are divided on whether seat belts should be installed in school buses in answer to this question: "Should Nassau County pass a law requiring seat belts to be installed and used on all school buses?" Here are some of the answers:

NOT NEEDED

No, seat belts are not needed on school buses. It was apparent that the politicians could not let this one slide by without trying to get in on the act. The fact is that school buses have a very good safety record. They proceed at slow speeds and they are generally given preferential treatment by most drivers. The seat belts could cause injuries to the children. They would have to be worn all the time to be effective and if the bus were in a fire someone would have to be able to quickly unbuckle all of them. The fact is that adults are going to have much trouble with that aspect of it as well because panicking in a fire or going into water could cause a short delay that would be fatal. M.E.

NEEDED NOW

If seat belts are so important for adults then there is no reason why they should not be important for children riding school buses. I think it is just a matter of money that makes people resist having them installed. G.C.

MORE RESEARCH

In answer to the question. No, Nassau County should allow each school board to decide. Most will not be in favor of them because there are still many untested things about seat belts and many people are skeptical that they are not dangerous for adults. General Motors has an automatic insurance policy which will award \$10,000 damages to anyone hurt while wearing a seat belt. It would have been a good thing for legislators to have waited a year while that policy is in effect so that the claims of people injured could be aired. This type of research would do much to open the eyes of the public more than the type of research that has been done so far. J.T.

WON'T RUN AROUND

In one way I believe seat belts should be used on school buses. The belts will keep the kids from running around and bothering the driver. If they also prevent injuries in an accident then I am for them all the way. K.E.

LITTLE EXPERIENCE

Personally I think they should install seat belts on school buses but leave the use up to the parents of the children. So far we have little experience with seat belts because very few people have used them and they are not tested over a long time. J.E.

FOR BELTS

I'm for seat belts. I always use mine and I want my children to have the use of them in school buses. L.E.

USE THEM NOW

Yes. We should install seat belts in the buses and insist that they are used. There have been many tests proving that serious injuries will be avoided by the use of the belts and the children should have them. F.W.

WON'T HELP

There have been practically no accidents on school buses where children were hurt in accidents that seat belts would have helped. About two years ago a school bus turned over in a nearby district. All of the children escaped injury. The story was put out in newspapers that the children escaped injury because seat belts were used. A later check showed that no seat belts had been installed on the bus and this statistic about the benefit of seat belts had to be retracted. I think this is another political ploy where our politicians want to dictate what we should do while they do little for their money. L.G.

MIGHT BE PROBLEM

This is a tough question for me because I am opposed to the mandatory seat belt law for private cars. We certainly want to protect our youngsters as much as possible and this might argue that seat belts on school buses should be included in the present legislation. However, I know the difficult time I have had in the past getting my little grandchildren to harness themselves in the back seat. Multiply that by about forty such passengers in a bus and you've really got a problem. Additionally, I believe that the space between the seats is so tight that in the case of a crash the risk of severe personal damage is minimized as long as the seats themselves don't tear loose and certainly not as grave as the positions of the driver and passengers of a private car with their close proximity to the windshield. In addition, school buses are already protected to a larger extent by the laws which impose restrictions on passing motor vehicles in the vicinity of a school bus. So, on balance, I believe that mandatory seat belts on school buses would be politically smart but an unnecessary expense and one we can ill afford especially in the light of other high priority needs begging for fulfillment. P.G.S.

Memorable Dinner

A new restaurant serving Northern Italian cuisine has arrived on Hempstead Turnpike in West Hempstead called Dario's Piccola Trieste Restaurant.



Cooking Corner

Barbecue turkey this Christmas

Camping outdoors and barbecuing are two simple pleasures my wife, Emily, and I truly enjoy. Just give us a place to set up our tent, some decent weather, and a nice barbecued turkey dinner. Not much to ask.

Although cooking a turkey on an outdoor grill may seem like a lot of trouble, it isn't. We have found that barbecuing holiday turkey for a crowd is easy, and you don't have to go camping to enjoy the delicious flavor of the juicy meat. Simplicity and convenience are the main guidelines when it comes to cooking for tent campers and home cooks alike. Try charcoaling the bird at home this year — it may be just that "something special" for your family.

Over the last few years, we have found a no-fail way to grill a turkey, but there were some lessons to be learned along the way.

The inauguration of our kettle barbecue was memorable indeed. Although the instruction book gave details on preparation and cooking of the turkey, nowhere was there information concerning size limitations of our cooker. Unfortunately, I didn't realize this until the instant we set our 20-pound bird in the roasting rack. We had followed instructions explicitly, but when we tried to cover the meat with the dome lid, the lid sat high on the breast of the bird, about 6 inches above the bottom section of the barbecue.

In our case, that near-disaster proved to be the father of invention. I cut a piece of galvanized sheet metal 8 inches wide and long enough to go around the center of the kettle. Using pop rivets to secure the ends together and cap screws with nuts for supports of the constructed ring, I invented my own "barbecue extender."

By arranging the ring I had constructed on the bottom of the grill and then setting the dome lid on the ring, the cooking chamber was enlarged, still allowing the lid to seal. Though we only use the ring when cooking large turkeys, it is certainly worth having for those special occasions.

In addition to the metal ring (if you are cooking a large turkey), you will need just a few other implements. Most barbecue manufacturers list those optional attachments available for their product. For ours (a Weber kettle), we needed two rails that attach to the bottom coal rack on either side of the drip pan, and a roasting rack to hold the meat on the grill of the barbecue. You will also need a quality meat thermometer and a good basting brush.

— First, you need to set up and light your charcoal. In our kettle, we stack 25 briquettes on each side of the charcoal grill and light them. With the drip pan in place between the piles of charcoal, set the meat grill in the kettle, mak-

ing sure that the handles are directly over the stacks of charcoal. That may seem silly at first, but you will need to add briquettes during the cooking process, and this will allow you access to the lighted charcoal.

— While the coals are getting started, prepare the turkey. After thoroughly washing the turkey and using paper towels to pat it dry, rub butter or margarine all over the outside of the bird, being sure the legs and wings are especially well covered.

For seasoning, simply sprinkle the outside with salt, pepper and MSG (if desired). Emily makes sure she rubs some of the seasoning on the inside of the breast cavity. We don't stuff our barbecued turkey but make the stuffing aside, so preparation is easy. Just tuck in or tie the turkey legs and insert a meat thermometer in the thickest part of the breast, making sure that it doesn't touch the bones.

— Once the coals are about 50 percent white, set the turkey in the roasting rack and put it on the meat grill in the barbecue. Make sure the turkey is centered above the drip pan, then cover the kettle for one hour.

At the end of an hour, and for every hour the turkey is cooking, baste the turkey with a combination of melted butter and wine. At the time the cover is off the kettle, add about eight briquettes to each side of the grill. It is important to use equal amounts of briquettes in order to keep a uniform heat in the cooking chamber. By adding new briquettes each hour, you are able to maintain heat in the kettle for longer periods of time.

— It has been our experience that a 17- to 22-pound turkey takes about 3 to 4 hours to cook. (Most turkey barbecuing instructions suggest counting on 11½ minutes per pound, turning the turkey after two hours. Some recommend adding a separate water pan to keep the meat moist. Check the pan occasionally to make sure it is filled.) When the meat thermometer reaches 185 degrees, the turkey is done. The thermometer is essential because the coal heat and weather conditions vary outdoors, making cooking time difficult to predict. We found this out the hard way.

With few exceptions, this method is truly the simplest way we know to cook a turkey. When camping, our meal might include mashed potatoes, gravy and green beans with almonds. Even though our table setting is modest and we eat on paper plates, we do extend ourselves one added luxury — we pack along our favorite white wine, and with the smell of barbecued turkey wafting throughout the campground, we toast our camping group for having such a fine and simple meal.

Stuffed fish

Whole stuffed fish lend themselves to a variety of unusual and elegant presentations. Different boning techniques and types of stuffing allow for almost endless variation, and the different shapes of the various families of fish increase the possibilities even more.

In choosing a stuffing, it is important that the stuffing ingredients complement not only the flavor but the appearance of the fish, since the stuffing will be a visible part of the finished dish.

Roundfish, such as trout, can be boned through the back for stuffing. This will create a pouch for the stuffing, and the stuffed fish will have a boatlike shape.

First, place the fish on its belly on a cutting surface and make a deep cut along both sides of the backbone with a short knife to free the two fillets. With a pair of shears, cut through the backbone just behind the head and just in front of the tail. Pull out the backbone and scrape out the viscera. Rinse out the body cavity.

Remove the gills by pulling back the head and carefully pulling out the gills on one side with your thumb and index finger. Repeat for the other side.

Dry the fish with paper towels and fill it with your chosen stuffing. Use enough stuffing to completely fill the opening from the back of the head to the beginning of the tail.

To stuff flatfish, such as flounder, begin by skinning the dark, upper side of the fish. Then, using a sharp knife, make an incision along the length of the fish, cutting down to the backbone. Next, with the knife held almost flat, cut each of the two fillets away from the bones. Fold back both fillets to expose the ribs.

To bone a flatfish, break the backbone in two or three places and pull out the resulting sections of bones. This is much easier than trying to remove the backbone and ribs in one piece. Rinse and dry the boned fish.

Once the bones are removed, the resulting fillets make a perfect pouch for stuffing.

A third method of preparing a fish for stuffing, and the one we used for today's recipe, is to cut from both the back and the front, leaving two halves joined at the head. Once the bones and viscera are removed, cross the two tail-end pieces to form a pouch for stuffing.

Your friendly fishmonger probably will be glad to perform any of these boning operations for you — just make sure that you are very specific in your directions, making it clear how you plan to stuff the fish.

For today's recipe we chose a small, whole scamp — a member of the grouper family — about 1½

pounds. Any roundfish with firm, white flesh may be substituted. Just vary the amounts of stuffing ingredients according to weight before boning.

The stuffing we came up with is light, moist, with bread crumbs, oysters, onions, celery and a hint of sage.

WHOLE FISH WITH OYSTER STUFFING

- 1 whole roundfish, about 1½ lbs.
- 2 tbsps. butter for the pan and for dotting the top of the fish
- 3 pieces of string, about 12 inches long
- Juice of ½ lemon
- Salt and pepper to taste
- ¼ cup dry white wine

Prepare fish as in third method described in text, so that two fillets remain joined at head.

Butter heavy baking dish with 1 tablespoon of butter. Lay fish in pan, belly down, overlapping fillets at tail end, creating "dish" to hold stuffing. Slide pieces of string under fish at intervals along part of body that is to be stuffed. String later will be tied around fish and stuffing, helping to hold shape during cooking.

Sprinkle lemon juice over fish and salt and pepper to taste. Cover and refrigerate while you make stuffing.

STUFFING

- 4 tbsps. butter
- ½ cup chopped onion
- ½ cup chopped celery
- 1½ cups seasoned bread crumbs
- ½ tsp. dried sage
- 1 tbsp. chopped fresh parsley
- 1 egg
- Salt and pepper to taste
- ½ pt. oysters, plus liquor
- ¼ cup milk (or enough to moisten stuffing)

In small frying pan, melt butter and saute onion and celery over medium heat until just translucent. Transfer to mixing bowl and add bread crumbs, sage, parsley, egg and salt and pepper to taste. Mix well.

Gently fold in oysters, with their liquor, being sure to remove any bits of shell. Add enough milk to moisten and mix gently.

Stuff fish, using all of stuffing, by mounding it up and patting it down firmly. Tie strings around fish, firmly but not too tightly. Trim excess string. Dot with remaining 1 tablespoon butter, pour wine into pan and bake, covered, in preheated 450 F oven for 20 minutes.

Serves 2.

me with this problem? — S.B.

Q. My kitchen floor is ceramic tile that has been cemented down for years, installed by the previous owner of our house. It is now old and discolored and I would like to replace it with one of the newer vinyl floor coverings.

I am told that this cannot be done unless I remove the tile first. This would mean I would have to chip up the tiles one by one, and I dread that fact as it will be time-consuming and costly.

Is there any way to put down a new floor on top of ceramic tile without having to rip up the tile first? — B.B.

A. To install new flooring without removing the old tiles you can apply a material called underlayment with a trowel over the old surface, this comes ready mixed and it hardens rapidly when applying.

Be sure that you get a smooth finish when applying. Also, when you put the new vinyl flooring down you may find that the floor is somewhat higher than before. This means you may have to trim any door or low cabinet doors so they will clear the new floor.

Q. My problem is mildew on the bathroom walls and tile. I have scrubbed and put bleach on them but it still grows back. Do you have any suggestions that can help

A. The basic problem is too much moisture inside the house. To solve the problem you have to get rid of this excess moisture one way or another. An exhaust fan can be helpful. It is best if it is vented to the outside.

Sometimes just opening a window a couple of inches directly after a shower will help. Or you can get window ventilators or even the small vents that are installed in the side of a house.

In short, your job is to see that the moist air is permitted to escape. If it has a way to get out, it won't condense on cool surfaces. An alternative is to use a dehumidifier, which will trap the moist air.

Q. I revarnished a walnut desk, but the varnish got bubbly and is not smooth at all. I sanded the surface before varnishing to remove scratches and any gouges. What do you suggest I do now? — Mrs. L.L.

A. A bubbly varnish finish usually is caused by faulty application of the varnish, or stirring the varnish while in the container, thus introducing air bubbles.

Or the varnish may have been brushed on too vigorously or slapped down. Varnish should be

applied so it flows on gently following the wood grain, and don't worry about brush marks that will flatten out by themselves. This requires that the varnish coats be kept thin.

The present, bubbly finish will have to be removed down to the bare wood and the desk refinished, keeping in mind the above cautions about applying varnish.

Q. How can I clean smoke from new plastered walls? We have the misfortune of smoke coming out from the fireplace. — D.N.R.

A. Try cleaning the plaster with wallpaper cleaner, a doughlike material available at wallpaper dealers and paint and hardware stores. Follow label instructions carefully.

The best treatment for soiled plaster, when thoroughly dry, is covering it with paper or paint; it can't be cleaned with soap and water, for the water would soak in and spread the stains.

Q. I would like to install a hood over my range but the exhaust would have to penetrate a stone wall and the work is too expensive.

What problems would we encounter if we used one of the hoods that does not require an outside exhaust? — Mrs. L.R.

A. Non-vented hoods remove most cooking odors and grease fumes, provided you replace the filter at proper intervals. They do not remove the steam, and this should be a principal function. I think that they are a poor substitute for a vented hood, but one is certainly better than none at all.

Dear John: I agree with Don. My hearing is moderately impaired so I use a hearing aid.

Background music is so loud on all programs you cannot hear what the actors are saying. It sounds like a bunch of robots are moving their mouths.

I wish the producers of these shows, and also the movie producers, would sit through and listen to the loud background music. I think it would be all right if they had soft music in the background so you could hear what the actors are saying. — Thomas R.

Dear Thomas: We're with you. But despite several columns about loud background music, and particularly loud commercials, no one seems to be too excited.

I guess it's because they can always turn the tube off. And then, we must admit, there are more serious concerns in this world today.

Dear John: I am a sufferer of neuritis in my feet and legs, up to the knees. I have had this condition for about 20 years.

I see so much about arthritis, but nothing about neuritis. Can you comment, please? I am 82. — Gordon S.

Dear Gordon: Neuritis is inflammation of a nerve or nerves. It often is associated with a degenerative process and accompanied by changes in sensory and motor activity in the region of the affected nerve.

Dear John: In response to the other people who have sore tongues and lips, have they ever had a thyroid profile? An underactive or overactive thyroid can cause a lot of problems. — A.R.

Dear John: I read your column from reader (Nellie B.) concerning burning tongue. I have it and know what I'm talking about. It is a lack of B vitamins. I started taking B-12 and then increased and included all of other B vitamins. My tongue stopped burning.

Dear John: Please send me your leaflet on arthritis.

However, I personally know a London physician who lives in Sarasota, Fla., in the winter who has discovered sensitive spots that he calls "rheumatic spots." These give rise to arthritis symptoms such as low-grade infections.

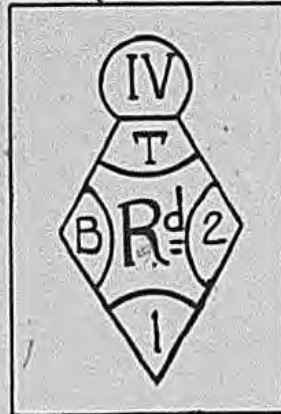

bottom of a china platter. Can you
tell me who made it, when and
where?



A. This is not a potter's mark; it
is the British Registry Mark.

The Roman numeral IV was
used to indicate ceramics; the let-
ter "T" indicates the year (1867);
the letter "B" indicates the month
(October); the number "2" is the
day of the month; "1" indicates the
maker.

The pattern of your platter was
registered Oct. 2, 1867, and could
have been made for 10 or 15 years
after that date.

Only the British Patent Office
can tell who the maker was. Its
value probably would be in the \$75
to \$95 range.

Points on Pets

Traveling with cats and dogs

Q. It seems to me that traveling with an unrestrained dog or cat in an automobile is extremely unsafe. I have seen animals run back and forth on both the rear seat and the front seat while the car was in motion.

Also, it seems extremely unsafe for animals riding on the shelf behind the rear seat in the window.

Are there any commercially available restraint devices for transporting pets in automobiles?

A. It is extremely unsafe to travel with unrestrained dogs and cats inside of automobiles. Dogs and cats roaming freely around the inside of an automobile can be a serious distraction to the driver.

Small dogs and cats riding on the shelf behind the rear seat often obstruct the rear view of the driver and actually may be thrown through the interior of the car if a very sudden stop or accident occurs.

It also is unhealthy for dogs to ride with their heads stuck out of automobile windows. Wind and dirt blowing into the dog's eyes, mouth and nose can cause irritation. Of course, dogs riding in windows also obstruct the view

through those windows.

There are several safe and humane ways to restrain dogs and cats while transporting them in automobiles. Probably the best means is to place them inside of specially constructed portable or permanent animal carriers or cages. These carriers can be as simple as a properly sized cardboard box or as elaborate as the type of carrier required by commercial airlines.

If the carrier is properly sized for the pet and if it contains a few familiar items such as a rug and some toys, most pets do not object to riding in them. An added plus to using this type of carrier is that if the pet becomes ill while traveling, the inside of the automobile will not become soiled by vomitus, urine or bowel movements. Carriers made of metal or heavy plastics can be cleaned by hosing them.

Many veterinarians and pet stores sell inexpensive cardboard pet carriers. Heavy cardboard carriers will last a long time if given reasonable care.

Recently, United Press International carried a story about Shane Hussey, who markets a product he says solves the problem of transporting pets in automobiles —

seat belts for dogs and cats. The product is named "Buckle-Up" and was invented by Fern Kay of Willowdale, Ontario, Canada. The seat belts have been marketed in Canada since last August.

"Buckle-Up" consists of a vest that fits across the animal's chest and is fastened on the back by adjustable straps. One of the straps is attached to a fastened car seat belt and allows the animal limited freedom of movement while keeping it confined to the seat. "Buckle-Up" is sold in various sizes to fit both small and large pets.

Although the seat belt device does not hurt the animal in any way, a period of adjustment to the belt is required for most animals.

The device has been used successfully on both dogs and cats. Seat belt devices for pets should be available in pet stores and veterinary offices in the near future.

Every driver should accept the responsibility of safely restraining the pets and children in his or her car. Pets can be very delightful traveling companions if properly trained and restrained.
