## Sports Medicine Hospital Program

A sports medicine program, designed to appeal to volunteer coaches in the twelve communities surrounding Central General Hospital will take place Thursday, September 5 from 8-10 p.m. at the hospital, it was announced by Joan Ernst, R.N. in charge of the event.

The course covers a wide range of topics dealing with athletic injuries and physical conditioning such as: common types of injuries, understanding the physiology and anatomy of the injury, heat exhaustion, proper conditioning, diet and exercise, and first aid care and treatment. ## Monday Night Bethpage Movies

Members of the Board:

It has come to the attention of this Department through the local media and some residents that the walking routes being set up and measured will bring school children through Municipal Parking Fields just northeast of Fire Headquarters and crossing at the Fire Station and walking through the Town Parking Field opposite Fire Headquarters to East Nicholas Street. All of the areas mentioned are hazard areas in that firefighters converge at Fire Headquarters using these routes.

I would like to request a slight change to prevent a tragedy. Instead of a cut through route of Bay Avenue South past the Old Court House to the school crossing at East Marie - East Nicholas - Bay Avenue - then down either Kraemer Street to Old Country to the school crossing at Broadway or down East Nicholas Street to Broadway. I think it would be a mistake to encourage the routes through parking fields. Visibility is poor at any time and worse during an alarm.

Your consideration on this matter will be appreciated by this Department.

## 2 million a year suffer food poisoning

How can you protect yourself and your family from food poisoning? Contaminated cheese and pesticide-poisoned watermelons continue to haunt us, in addition to the "normal" number of various other infections, toxins and chemicals that find their way into our food supply.

Every year, approximately 2 million Americans become ill from food poisoning in one form or another. There may be more unreported cases because the symptoms are often identical to the flu, and may be mistaken for it. While most cases are relatively mild, some kinds are extremely serious and can be fatal.

Bacterial infections are responsible for about two-thirds of the diagnosed cases. Salmonella, the most common of these, breeds in raw meat, milk and dairy products, fish, poultry and eggs. It also is contagious.

Clostridium is found in beef and poultry. It produces a dangerous toxin in the body.

Staphylococcus contamination usually is transmitted by food handlers.

Viral infections, such as those that cause hepatitis, and toxins are responsible for another third of the diagnosed cases. Raw fish is a frequent source of these viruses, and no amount of marinating with anything will render such fish safe to eat.

Chemical toxins can come from certain species of berries, mushrooms or fish that have eaten contaminated food. Ciguatera is a poi-

soning caused by eating such fish and it can be fatal, if enough is taken. Unfortunately, there is no known antidote for it.

Botulism, while rare, is extremely serious. It is caused by a toxin that is formed as the result of improperly canned or improperly sealed frozen foods. Home canning can be especially dangerous.

Infant botulism has been on the rise recently, linked to the ingestion of honey, which seems to trigger the production of the toxin in babies who may already have the intestinal tract infection.

Symptoms of botulism include descending paralysis that affects the facial nerves and the ability to swallow, and progresses down to the extremities. Blurred or double vision may occur. Immediate medical care is vital.

Severe body fluid losses from vomiting and diarrhea, fever and feelings of acute illness are common symptoms of food poisoning. Anyone experiencing them must see a doctor for immediate treatment.

Hepatitis usually takes several weeks to develop after infected food is ingested. Jaundice, weakness and nausea are common symptoms. Medical care is a must.

There are steps you can take to help protect against food poisoning: Avoid raw meats, raw fish, raw milk and raw milk dairy products (some pasteurized dairy products also can become contam-

inated). Discard any food that looks or smells bad, unusual or is discolored. Throw out any can that is leaking or bulging. Wash thoroughly or peel all raw fruits and vegetables before eating.

Store food in your refrigerator at 45 degrees F, and at 0 F in your freezer. When you prepare beef and lamb, cook it to 140 F, pork to 150 F, and poultry to 165 F. Don't leave foods out of the refrigerator for over an hour, especially in warm weather.

Above all, if you suspect food poisoning, get immediate medical care.

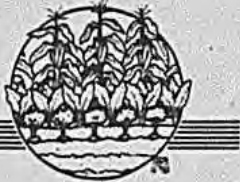

## Converting outdoor flora to houseplants

Let's take a tour through our collection of plants in the garden, on the balcony and patio, to see what we can find to mother along into a promising houseplant for the coming fall and winter.

Some of the most promising prospects will be found among our bedding plants. I'm thinking especially of one of our loveliest houseplants last winter, a light rose-colored double impatiens that I dug up and potted to bring indoors.

It was at about this time last year that I began my annual prowl through our garden and patio to see what might be potted and set in a sheltered spot for two or three weeks before being brought into the house. I looked for the smallest and youngest plants possible, for these would have the best chance of adjusting to indoor conditions.

Impatiens, like geraniums and coleus, are good prospects for keeping over as houseplants because where they grow in nature they are perennials. Because they are frost tender, we grow them as annuals but their perennial nature makes them possible to keep over for further seasons of growth.

Tomatoes and peppers fall into this category, too. Some gardeners have good success wintering over in a cool place both pepper plants and tomato cuttings. Set out late in the spring, these usually will give extra early crops, just as wintered-over geraniums give us far earlier flowers than first-year seed-grown plants.

If you have a few coleus plants in your garden, small plants either can be lifted or cuttings taken, for a fall houseplant. Cuttings set into a light-textured, freely draining soil mixture in a 3- to 4-inch pot will establish quite easily if the whole thing — pot and plant — is placed inside a plastic bag and set in a warm spot out of any direct sun.

As the cutting roots and new growth is observed, the bag, which forms a soothing aura of humidity about the cutting, may be removed gradually by just cutting slits in it to begin with.

Even small marigold plants can have their lifetime and beauty prolonged at least through the fall and early winter indoors. Choose from among any dwarf varieties that you may have in the garden or in balcony containers.

Select a plant that still looks in good condition, lift it with a nice ball of soil around its roots, pot it and cut it back. Place the pot in a warm, bright spot and fertilize it. In two or three weeks you should have a bushy little marigold plant

in bloom.

I should remind you that any plant you are planning to bring into the house from outdoors should be monitored carefully against insect pests. During the two or three weeks before I bring a potted plant into the house, I usually give it at least one spray with insecticidal soap and two soil drenches a week to 10 days apart with malathion at one teaspoon per gallon of water to destroy fungus gnat maggots.

Ivy geranium plants, or cuttings from them, also will make a fine hanging basket plant for indoors in a cool spot that enjoys bright light. More cuttings can be taken of these plants in late winter for an expanded collection next summer.

Black-eyed Susan vines also may be brought indoors for another basket plant. Rooted pieces of outdoor ivy provide more good prospects for a hanging baskets and table plants.

Small herb plants also may be lifted for a fall collection of fresh kitchen herbs. Parsley and basil are good subjects here. If you decide to pot a small outside piece of a clump of chives, leave the pot outdoors through the first frosts before bringing it in to grow indoors. This herb needs that bit of dormant cold to induce new, fresh growth.

## Our Children

### 'Sick and tired' of that old refrain

Q. I am so sick and tired of our children pressuring us with the line that "all the kids do it."

A. It's a pretty recent thing in our family, and I guess that it may be due to one arriving at adolescence and the other on the verge of it. They are both girls, but boys may be the same way for all I know.

Whether it is money, clothes, movies or diet, what the others do (or at least say they do) seems to be a lot more important to them than what we can afford or how we feel about their questionable activities and thoughts.

So far they haven't brought up alcohol, drugs or sex, but I wouldn't put it past them to get involved because "all the kids do it."

How about a little consolation, or is it just something we will have to muddle through, hoping for the best?

A. Peer pressure always has had more influence on many youngsters than the ideas of their parents. However, there are some specific things we can do to survive the years of adolescence that are difficult for some parents and their children.

Keeping communication lines open is a top priority. To do so without letting anger, hostility and frustration take over is sometimes far from easy, but it is necessary for the effort to be made.

The realization on the part of parents that we can't see through their eyes and that they are growing up in a world so different from our own early years is an important fact of life. The kind of movies available to them is only one example of what they can take for granted and that we never encountered at their age.

We are important too as models for our children. How much we drink, whether we smoke, and the relationships we have (some of which we would question if we thought our youngsters were pursuing them) can provide an image we want, or don't want, them to follow.

The all-the-kids-do-it attitude and comments are nothing new. A lot of us used this idea as ammunition to soften up our own parents.

My comments here are just a start in thinking about relationships with adolescent children who are sometimes volatile, difficult to understand, abrasive and — yes — lovable, interesting and challenging. If we can relax a little and listen more, the more attractive factors may emerge.

A few sources for you? Perhaps the writings of Irene Josselyn, Thomas Gordon and Haim Ginott may be useful for starters.

Reactions of other parents on this important subject also may come in handy. I hope they will write so I can share their thoughts with those of you whose children are into or approaching the teen years.

It may help a little to realize that you are not alone.

Q. I am a 14-year-old boy. My question is why is there such a big difference in growth among boys of my own age?

A. My two best friends are my example. Robert is also 14 and is short and has little body hair and no voice change. Greg is 14 too, but has already developed quite a "mat" of chest and especially navel hair. He is the only boy in my gym class with a hairy chest plus heavy beard.

Both Robert and Greg seem to be out of step; I am about in the middle. Although I do have fairly hairy legs I would naturally like more body hair to appeal to women. Any suggestions?

A. Child and adolescent development personnel and physicians seem to agree that the range in development that you describe is within the "normal," just as differences in height, weight and other factors can be.

It is only the extremes that should be of concern, and under those circumstances an appointment with one's family physician may be appropriate. From what you wrote about yourself you don't seem to need that visit, but that decision is obviously up to you and your family.

### Robbery Occurs At Gas Station

Two unknown black males physically robbed a 41 year old gas station attendant of \$78 dollars at an Albertson gas station this past week.

The suspects approached the attendant, Gerard Scheff, at the Benelux Service Center, 944 Willis Avenue, then as one suspect put an arm around Scheff's neck, the second took the money from his pocket. Both suspects then ran from the scene on foot, northbound on Willis Avenue.

Scheff was not injured during the robbery and the suspects were described as being in their twenties, one 5' 8" and the second 6' 1" tall. Both wore jogging suits. The Third Squad is investigating.



## Your Social Security

### Depression spawned Social Security Act

Q. Did the Depression of the '30s play a part in the creation of the Social Security Act? — W.D.

A. Yes. The Great Depression dramatized the fact that many workers were dependent upon factors beyond their individual control for their economic security. Federal action became a necessity inasmuch as neither the states, local communities nor privately organized charities had the financial resources to cope with the growing need among the people. As a result, the Social Security Act was signed into law Aug. 14, 1935.

Q. I am a divorced woman who was married for over 10 years. I will turn 62 in December 1985. I understand I will be eligible for divorced spouse's benefits at that time.

However, I want to know what happens when my ex-husband's present wife is age 62 and files for benefits on his record. Will mine be decreased? I have never worked. — A.T.

A. If you decide to retire at 62 you will be eligible for reduced benefits on your ex-spouse's account. There will be no reduction in your benefit regardless of how many other people file on your ex-spouse's record.

Q. I am a Philippine citizen, 70 years of age. I worked for the U.S.

Navy as a civilian employee for almost 30 years (1946-1975).

I would like to know if I am eligible for any Social Security benefits. I am living in the United States. — P.B.D.

A. It would appear from the above information that you are not eligible for any Social Security benefits on your own record. As a federal employee you would have been covered by the Civil Service Retirement System.

You may want to check further at your local Social Security office to verify if you are eligible for any benefits from other work you may have performed that was covered under Social Security.

Q. I soon will be 65. My husband is still working and I am covered under his employer's health plan.

If I do not take Medicare, Part B, at age 65 and decide to take it later, will I be penalized? — L.H.R.

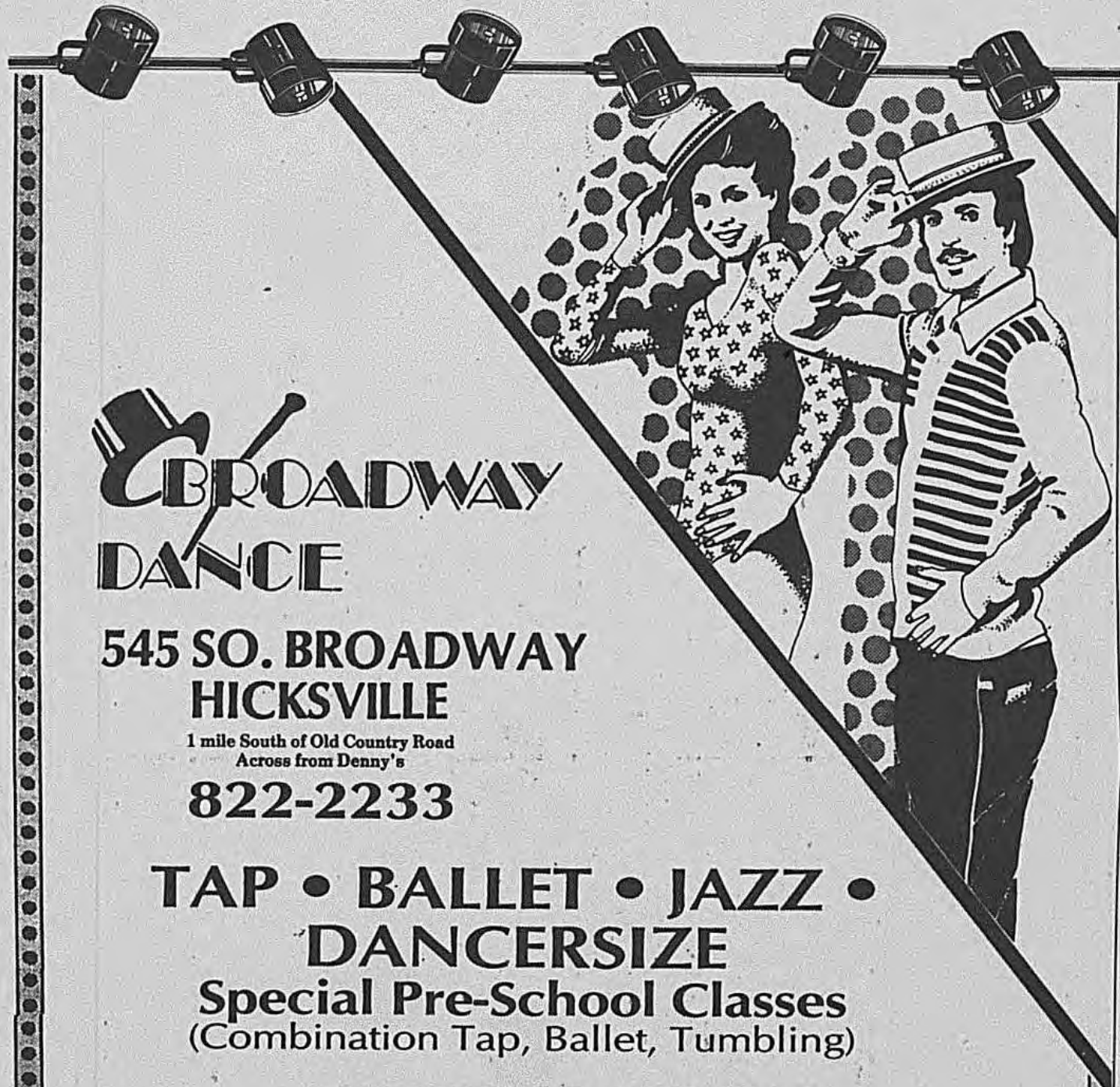
A. Generally, there is a penalty for not taking Part B when initially reaching 65, but not in this case.

A special seven-month enrollment period begins when work is stopped or the employer's health plan is dropped, or the third month before your 70th birthday.

## Fed tries to forestall recession, deflation

The Federal Reserve has thrown the bait in the water. But will the people bite?

That, in essence, is the big question for the U.S. economy for the rest of this year and into next year. Real (inflation-adjusted) economic growth in the first half was an anemic 1 percent (0.3 percent in the first quarter, 1.7 percent in the second).

The Federal Reserve is alarmed: It wants to forestall a recession, partly because it is concerned that during a slump, Congress won't cut entitlements spending. Second, it wants to bring the dollar down — and the way to do that is to bring interest rates down. Third, it fears deflation — a downswath of prices that could wind up pitching the economy into a depression.

The money supply has grown at double-digit rates all year. Interest rates have come down about three percentage points over the last year as the Fed has tried to induce consumers and corporations to borrow and spend. The central bankers have played their usual game of charades: Money growth had vastly overshot prior targets, so in mid-July the bankers just moved the target forward to destigmatize past excesses and rationalize future ones. But employing typical double-talk, Fed Chairman Paul Volcker also hinted the monetary spigot would be tightened in the second half.

Thus, economists and the bond market are confused — which is exactly what Volcker desires. Since he doesn't know what he is going to do next, he doesn't want anybody else knowing.

As usual, it will not be Volcker or President Reagan or anyone else who will determine what happens: It's up to consumers. If they snap at Volcker's bait, consumer spending will rise, and should be followed by business spending.

Many are convinced that consumers won't nibble. Installment debt as a percentage of personal income is back where it was at the 1979 peak. Real consumer installment debt has increased at a 14.5 percent annual rate over the last two years — the fastest two-year rate of debt expansion in more than two years, according to Wright Investors' Service. But some economists think the statistics overstate consumers' indebtedness — and there is room to expand.

In interviews, economic seers expressed — (not surprisingly) — divergent views. Some believe that the economy will rev up again, others doubt it. Some think

interest rates will continue to come down, while others think rates will be turning back up.

If long-term rates continue to come down, long-term bonds will do well. But if those rates rise again, the bond party will be over. Stocks should rally if rates continue to come down — and could even do well in an environment of rising rates.

So how will the fishing be?

Ross M. Starr, professor of economics at the University of California at San Diego, looks for "slow growth in the second half," accompanied by "steady or declining interest rates." The Fed will continue pumping the money in, but the economy will be slow to respond.

By 1986, the 30-year Treasury bond, now yielding around 10.7 percent, will be "well into single digits," said Starr. However, even a drop in long rates of another full percentage point won't necessarily make the economy whoosh upward.

There is not any reason to believe 1986 will be a boom year, but there could be a steady expansion," he said.

"We're already in a recession," said William Holland, a vice president with Wall Street's Kidder, Peabody. The economic statistics are "masking" the de facto recession, said Holland. (Many economists say the manufacturing sector is in a recession. Over the last six months, manufacturing employment has dropped at a 3 percent annual rate, while service employment has risen 5.7 percent.)

The Fed may appear a little tightfisted in the next few weeks, but "Volcker will ease again after Labor Day," said Holland. "All this is just a pause in an otherwise easy period. The Fed has no choice but to ease. The alternative would be deflation."

But the economy won't immediately respond to the munificence. Overall, "the year 1985 will be a write-off year," said Holland. But the interest rate declines will set us up for a booming 1986 — indeed, the stock market's strength is an indication of the looming upturn, said Holland.

Tom Frey, economist for the trust investment department of California First Bank, thinks the fish will be biting. He points at some of the statistics today: The

leading indicators are picking up; ditto for durable goods; consumer sentiment polls (Conference Board and University of Michigan) reveal a more upbeat consumer; the money supply is growing and it now appears to be turning over more rapidly.

The economy will grow by 4 percent in the second half of this year, said Frey. But as growth picks up, interest rates will rise — perhaps by 1 to 1.5 percentage points "between now and the end of the year," he said. This means the bond market will be unexciting, but stocks could stay strong as profits pick up.

In 1986, growth could be in the 4 percent to 5 percent range — "a better than expected year," Frey said.

## Antique Or Junque

### English plate has Japanese pattern

By James G. McCollam

Q. This plate is marked (on the back), "Royal Crown Derby" and "Made in England."

I would appreciate it if you could tell me how much this plate is worth and when it was made.



A. The Royal Crown Derby Co. was founded in 1876 at Derby, England.

Your plate was made during the early 20th century and was the English version of Japanese Imari, which has been famous for over 300 years. It would sell for at least \$50.

Q. I recently acquired a porcelain tea set with the attached mark on the bottom of each piece. The set consists of teapot, sugar bowl and creamer.

What does T.H. stand for? When was the set made? How much is it worth?



A. T.H. stands for Theodore Haviland. According to the mark, it was made in 1894. It should be worth about \$300.

David Haviland founded Haviland & Co. in Limoges, France, in 1842. After his death, his sons Charles and Theodore operated the company until 1892, when Theodore started his own company, while Charles continued to operate Haviland & Co.

After World War II, Theodore Haviland & Co. became part of Haviland & Co.

Q. How can you tell that a piece of furniture is a reproduction by looking at a picture? If it looks just like an original, what do you base your opinion on?

A. Your second question is the answer to the first. Reproductions almost never look exactly like originals. They may be made in the same style, but the designer usually has compromised and modified the design.

If you examined 10 original Hepplewhite game tables and 10 reproductions, you always would be able to make the distinction in the future. If you made the same study of thousands of other antiques, you would be an excellent judge of authenticity.

Sometimes a reproduction can be so good that I have to study the picture a long time and may wind up giving a qualified answer.

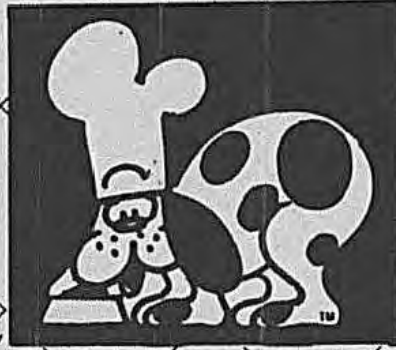

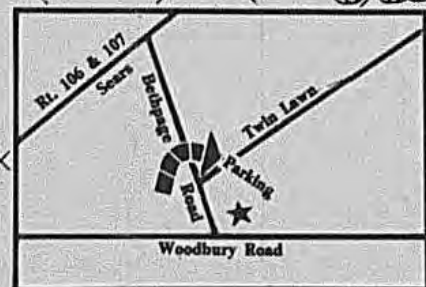

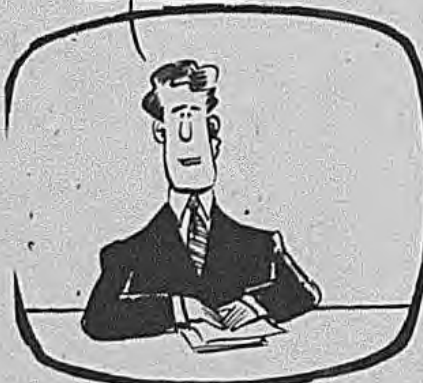

# Callers To Input Divided On U.S. Policy In Africa

Callers to Input were divided in their views on what the U.S. should be doing in South Africa in answer to this question: "Do you think we should have a stronger policy against South Africa at this time?"

### DON'T LEAD WORLD

No. We should not jump in and try to lead the world in whatever way we think is best for it. South Africa has problems that cannot be eliminated overnight and we are not in a position to tell them how to do their part. I am against apartheid in principle and I would like to see the principle applied. But at the same time we do know that Communist forces are taking advantage of the situation and are just sitting waiting for the government to fall so that they can enslave the people with a new government. This is not what we should want. G.R. NO LEADERS

We have already let our views be known to South Africa. We haven't taken any economic sanctions because we do not see how ruining the economy of the country will put it in a position to deal with the problems it has. There is another problem in South Africa that outside of the South African government there are no real leaders who have a full mandate from the people. If the South African government should fall there will be a civil war and that country will be no better off than so many other Third World countries that are not doing right by the population. J.E.

### POT PRESSURE

We must do something to help the blacks in South Africa attain equality. It seems obvious that the people in power do not want to share what they have with the blacks. The only way the power can shift is for outside countries to put pressure on them. If we do not do it the Communists will organize and finally win out in these countries. We have no choice but to work to get rid of apartheid. D.W.

### OUTSIDE INFLUENCE

I do not think that outside influence has had a good effect on South Africa. In many cases the bumbling politicians that have gone there have only stirred up the people against each other. Neither Rev. Falwell nor Senator Kennedy came off as knowing and understanding the real problems in that part of the world. We must have a policy that will not help apartheid but that will not set a time table for a change. In fact we should be interested in seeing that outside countries keep hands off because it could turn out like Vietnam. Presently no one wants to take the blame for the chaos we caused in that country by interfering and then pullin out. G.E.

### UNITE WITH TUTU

I think we should unit behind Bishop Tutu and see that the human race treats its brothers as brothers. Whether the people are white or black cannot have anything to do with the solution. We must stay on the side of truth and justice. D.N.

### DON'T INTERFERE

I definitely believe that our policy toward South Africa is totally off the wall, the reason being that we have taken the perspective in making ourselves the peace keeping nation of the world, concerning morals, morality and we are the ones who enforce it in all countries. Well I don't think that we have the right to go into the other countries and tell them what to do or how to do it. Sure the problem in S.A. is terrible, the way they view blacks and the way the white people took over the ignorant blacks who have now become a part of society, but they are changing by themselves. I don't think that we should interrupt and make our nation which is supposed to be the freedom capital of the world and of course we named ourselves the peace keeping nation of the world, really have to build any stronger policy towards them. They are not all bad. Of course, there are some bad apples in the government, but it is changing. I've done a lot of research on S.A. during this critical time, but it truthfully is not a problem of the U.S. In fact, the U.S. has never been involved with S.A. totally. Sure if we were Great Britain or a country that had some back related history with S.A. we could take stronger actions. I don't believe we should walk in and tell other countries how to run their government. If we tried to do that with Russia we'd start a nuclear war. The government should not take action but the citizens should act on a humanitarian level, rather than political. R.H.

### HANDS OFF

No - I do not! We have made our viewpoint amply clear to the effect that we are not sympathetic to a continuance of apartheid in South Africa and I see no reason to back that up with stringent economic penalties in order to force that government to make decisions under fire, so to speak. I think we have already gone one step too far in endorsing punitive measures by American companies located in that country. Those companies, in my opinion, have already helped to ease the problem by employing blacks at an increasing ratio in their operations and with world sentiment on the side of a relaxation of the problem, their continued influence in breaking down separatist policies is a definite and constructive plus. Evolutionary changes in the mining industry are also an important factor. I think that the problem is clearly in focus but that President Pieter Botha and his government must be given the opportunity to make constructive changes in a way which will enable them to do it effectively and without coercion. Certainly, we would give short shrift to any foreign dictates which would demand actions on our part with respect to internal affairs not consistent with our own concept of government. Obviously, the economic progress made in South Africa over the years should not be destroyed by rash decisions born solely of humanitarian motives by outsiders with little if any responsibility for the chaotic results which might follow\* and with no personal involvement in such results. Needless to say, the USSR is watching this bit of drama with keen interest and it certainly is not in our own best interests to provide opportunities in South Africa which would be inimical to our national concerns or those of the world's peace loving nations. Nor would he find it funny that the clown's pointed hat had punctured the carton it came in as well as the "Grandmother" hanky packed on top of it.

The "tickler" was the very first sentence in my disgruntled consumer letter. It read: "You may have cured me from ever ordering from a catalogue again."

Living with a catalogue addict, my husband knew better than I did that this was not to be my last order.

"I mean it," I said defensively if not convincingly as soon as I heard this editorial snicker. "This whole order was a disappointment and a waste of money and now I have to bother with packaging it and sending it back."

And for days after I lived up to my own expectations if not my husband's. Catalogues would come in the mail and I'd carry them to the wastebasket with hardly a glance at the covers.

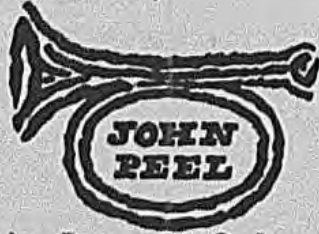

# DINING GUIDE

## READER RATINGS



Q What do you do if you enter a restaurant and some friends at another table tell the waiter to see what you are drinking because they want to buy you a drink and you do not drink?

E.R.  
A. There is no set answer to your question. You obviously have some very generous friends who do not know your habits. The best thing to do would be to inform the waiter that you do not drink but you might make a gesture with a water glass towards your friends table as a toast.

If you have Questions about etiquette or dining out you may call them in to 931-0027 and we will find the answer.

Q. Whenever I go to a restaurant that has a salad bar I see people taking two plates and some coming up several times. Aren't these people just acting like pigs?  
R.W.

A. They may be acting like pigs but the management ought to be the one to do the complaining if the dinner cost doesn't cover it. We are told by restaurant owners, though, that it evens out and that except in restaurants that specifically say the dinner includes "one trip to the salad bar" that they will not appear to notice how many trips are made and it appears that if they are "pigs" to you, the management still views them as customers.

Q. If I have a party of about 30 guests, is it best to go to a restaurant or a regular caterer?

A. Generally you can find a restaurant that would be more interested in that size party than a caterer although some caterers do have mid-week and off-season rates. But, in general restaurants have rooms that they can close off and give you special service. Often the price is no higher than the menu rates.

A. If you're giving a party in a restaurant, should you await your guests in the entrance of the restaurant, or should you go to the table?

A. If the entrance is tiny, there really isn't room for you to congregate all your guests there. It's better in this case to go straight to your table.

However, remember to arrive before your guests do. It's extremely rude for the hosts to arrive after their guests!

Q. If I'm awaiting my host in the restaurant and he or she is very late, is it all right for me to order my own drink at the bar and pay for it?

A. It's far nicer to wait for your host to arrive before ordering a drink.

Q. How many people does a bottle of champagne serve at dessert time?

A. Normally four. If you're at a wedding-rehearsal dinner or an anniversary party, the toasting might go on for quite a while, so you have to supply twice as much champagne for your guests as you would for a regular dinner party.

**The adventure of eating in China opens new doors**

By Antonia Allegra

There is one thing to remember when traveling to China: Chinese food is all you will eat. Granted, Peking offers a few French restaurants, but think bok choy, stir-fry and steamed dumplings for the majority of your stay.

Shark's fin, duck's feet, snow fungus, bird's nest, roasted peacocks, monkey brain, 1,000-year-old eggs, pickled python, turtle eggs, braised fish lips... Before going to China, fellow travelers and I had heard stories of weird foods available in the mysterious Orient.

Surprisingly, most of the dreaded foods were not only available, but also were delicious. The above list, for instance, includes only three dishes which we did not taste — peacock, monkey brain and python. Before traveling the China seas on the Royal Viking Star, hesitation might have been my pattern when presented with such unusual foods. However, the adventure of eating in Hong Kong, Shanghai, Suzhou, X'ian and Peking does tend to open doors to new experiences.

Mrs. Lo, our Chinese guide in X'ian, mentioned that most Chinese eat fresh foods prepared at home. When in restaurants, the

Chinese expect at least 10 courses and, for weddings and festivals, hold feasts of even larger dimension.

Lo also told us, "It is considered polite to make a mess and to make sucking noises. A dirty tablecloth is a sign that the meal was enjoyed." She added, "Spit out bones and shells."

That was clear: Just entering a Chinese dining room (as opposed to one for foreigners) was a surprise for the ear: The crunching sound of chicken and fish bones and sunflower seeds underfoot is an indelible audible memory of China. The bones, seeds and all are swept away at day's end.

In the true spirit of hospitality, we foreigners were constantly treated to multi-course banquets. The dishes were served in a haphazard manner. That is, soup was served sometimes at the beginning of the meal, sometimes at the very end. For instance, dinner in X'ian at the May First restaurant included: eels, hard boiled quail eggs, bean sprouts, rice noodles, wheat noodles with a pressed fine crosshatch pattern in the pasta, bread rolls, chicken with cauliflower, cauliflower with scallions, steamed white rice, fried fish cake, mandarin orange segments in syrup, fish soup with greens, nut cake, cookies and bananas. Drinks offered were Tsing Tao or Shanghai beer or a pulpy orange-apple carbonated drink. The meal reflected the banquet dining pattern we experienced on a daily basis, sometimes at lunch and dinner.

Following are some favorite dishes, or variations thereof, eaten in China. Recipes are adapted

from "Hong Kong and China Gas Chinese Cookbook," edited by David W. Perkins.

**SCALLION PANCAKES**

Street vendors in X'ian fry these crisp, deep-fried vegetable pastries in huge black caldrons and serve them on small squares of newspaper. Some pancakes include a nut of sausage meat, as well.

- 7 ozs. all-purpose flour
- 5 ozs. cold water
- 1 tbsp. melted lard
- 2 tbsps. scallion, chopped
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 tps. sesame oil
- Oil for shallow frying

Sieve flour into mixing bowl and pour in cold water. Quickly work into flour, adding just a little more water if dough is dry and hard. It should be soft and workable. Knead 3 minutes, then cover with damp cloth and leave 15 minutes. Cut into 12 pieces. Roll each out into rectangle about 1/4-inch thick and brush with melted lard. Scatter chopped scallion onto dough surface and add salt and sesame oil. Roll up lengthwise to encase scallion. Flatten each piece with fingers or by using rolling pin on floured board.

Heat wok or large frying pan and add about 1/4-inch oil. Fry pancakes two at a time, 3 to 3 1/2 minutes. Cover pan during half the cooking, and shake pan occasionally to make pancakes puff up slightly. Remove, drain and keep warm while remainder of pancakes are cooked. Serve hot.

Makes 12 servings.

**DEEP-FRIED CRISPY CHICKEN**

By drying and then quickly cooking chicken skin with boiling water, the skin of the bird becomes ultra-crisp. In a typical Chinese restaurant kitchen, some chickens are hung along a wall, waiting to be prepared in this method.

- 1 whole chicken (about 3 lbs.)
- Oil for deep-frying

- Seasoning A:
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. five spices powder (available in Oriental groceries)

**Seasoning B:**  
 1½ ozs. maltose (see note)  
 5 ozs. white vinegar  
 1 oz. red vinegar  
 3 ozs. water

**Preparation:** Clean and wash chicken. Tie string around neck and hang chicken to drain and dry skin. Pour boiling water over chicken several times to partially cook skin, which will crisp skin when cooked. Rub Seasoning A ingredients into cavity.

Heat Seasoning B ingredients together in double saucepan until maltose dissolves. Pour over chicken several times, catching it in drip tray placed beneath chicken. Leave to hang another 1½ to 2 hours until dry, with smooth shiny glaze.

**To cook:** Heat wok and add oil. When oil is very hot, reduce heat slightly and deep-fry chicken 6 to 7 minutes. Ladle hot oil over chicken continually while cooking. Raise heat and continue to cook until chicken is deep golden brown and skin has puffed slightly and come away from meat. Remove and drain. When slightly cool, chop into bite-size pieces and arrange spread-eagle on serving plate. Serve with spicy salt dip.

Makes 12 servings.

**Note:** Maltose, also known as malt sugar, is a molasseslike substance produced from germinating grains (particularly barley) through a process similar to wine making. It is available in Oriental grocery stores; or, substitute honey or golden syrup.

**DICED PORK WITH WALNUTS**

Judging by the number of squealing piglets carried in burlap bags from the open market, pork is a mainstay of the Chinese diet. This dish combines the techniques of deep-frying and stir-frying.

7 ozs. lean pork, ½-inch dice  
 5 ozs. walnuts  
 4-5 slices carrot  
 4-5 slices ginger  
 2 scallions, 1¼-inch lengths  
 Oil for deep-frying

**Seasoning A:**  
 ¼ tsp. bicarbonate of soda  
 2 tps. cornstarch  
 1 tbsp. water

**Seasoning B:**  
 ½ tsp. salt  
 ¼ tsp. monosodium glutamate

2 tps. chicken stock  
 ½ tsp. cornstarch  
 Dash white pepper

**Preparation:** Mix diced pork with Seasoning A ingredients and leave 10 minutes. Boil walnuts until they soften, about 5 to 6 minutes. Remove, drain very well and leave until partially dry. Mix Seasoning B ingredients and set aside.

**Cooking:** Heat wok, add oil and, when very hot, reduce heat slightly and deep-fry walnuts until they turn deeper brown, about 2 minutes. Remove, drain and set aside.

Reheat oil, add pork and cook on moderate heat 1¼ minutes, until cooked through. Remove and drain. Discard most of oil. Reheat wok and stir-fry carrot, ginger and scallion 1 minute longer. Makes 6 servings.

**STEAMED OPEN DUMPLINGS**

As appetizers, dumplings like this were served for lunch or dinner in many restaurants. Use of prepared round won-ton wrappers makes the steamed dumplings a quick dish to prepare. This recipe also can make use of leftovers.

24 won-ton wrappers, (3 inches) round  
 5 ozs. semi-fat pork  
 4 ozs. fresh shrimp meat  
 3 dried black mushrooms, soaked

**Seasoning:**  
 1 tsp. sugar  
 ½ tsp. salt  
 ¼ tsp. monosodium glutamate  
 ½ tsp. dark soy sauce  
 2 tps. light soy sauce  
 1 tbsp. cornstarch  
 Few drops sesame oil  
 Dash white pepper

Wash and finely dice pork and shrimp meat. Drain and finely dice mushrooms. Mix with seasoning ingredients. Chill ¼ hour before using. Make circular shape with forefinger and thumb of left hand. Place won-ton wrapper over fingers and place spoonful of filling in center of wrapper. Push into circle of fingers, producing open-ended dumpling with sides of wrapper gathered up around filling. Flatten bases and place in lightly greased bamboo steaming basket.

Set basket in steamer over rapidly boiling water and steam for 10 minutes. Serve.

**Note:** A flat-based colander or strainer or perforated pasta cooker could be used in place of a bamboo steaming basket.

**CANDIED POTATO**

An unusual use of the potato, this dessert was served at the May First restaurant in X'ian. The recipe is also successfully made with apple slices.

3 russet potatoes  
 1½ ozs. all-purpose flour  
 2½ tps. cornstarch  
 1 egg white, beaten  
 1 tsp. white sesame seeds  
 Oil for deep-frying

**Toffee:**  
 3 ozs. sugar  
 1 tbsp. lard  
 1 oz. water

Peel potatoes. Cut into ½-inch slices or chunks and roll in flour. Mix remaining flour with cornstarch and egg white, adding a little water to make thick batter. Stir well.

Heat wok, add oil and when very hot, deep-fry potato pieces 1½ to 2 minutes, until golden. Remove, drain and set aside. Pour off oil, reheat wok and add sugar and lard. Stir until sugar melts, then pour in water and simmer until syrup begins to color and become toffee. Reduce heat and cook until toffee is light golden color. Add potato and stir until well coated with toffee. Remove to oiled serving plate. Sprinkle sesame seeds over coated potato pieces. Dip each piece of candied potato into bowl of iced water to harden toffee before eating.

## SUPERSCRAMBLE

- 1/4 lb. bulk pork sausage
- 1 (8 1/2 oz.) can whole kernel golden corn, drained
- 1/2 cup chopped green onion
- 6 eggs
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper

Put double thickness of paper toweling on bottom of microwave-safe 9x9x2-inch baking dish. Crumble sausage onto paper toweling in dish. Cook in microwave oven 2 1/2 to 3 minutes at HIGH (100 percent power).

Slip out paper toweling. Stir in corn and onion, spreading evenly in dish. Cook in microwave oven 1 minute at HIGH.

Beat eggs, milk and seasonings fork. Pour egg mixture over sage mixture. Cover with plastic wrap.

Cook in microwave oven 5 minutes at HIGH; stir after 3 minutes to move cooked portions from edges to center. Let stand covered 1 to 2 minutes before serving. (Remove scrambled eggs from oven when they are slightly underdone; heat retained in eggs completes cooking.)

Serves 4.

## ONION-STUFFED FISH ROLLS

- 2 tbsps. butter or margarine
- 1 medium sweet Spanish onion, chopped
- 1/2 lb. fresh mushrooms, cleaned and chopped
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. dried thyme leaves, crushed
- 4-5 white fish fillets (about 1 1/2 lbs.)
- Salt and pepper
- 1 (10 3/4 oz.) can cream of mushroom soup
- 1/2 cup dry white wine or milk
- 2 tbsps. chopped parsley

Melt butter in 1-quart glass measuring pitcher in microwave oven 30 to 40 seconds at HIGH (100 percent power). Stir in onion and mushrooms. Cook 4 to 5 minutes at HIGH, or until tender.

Season with 1/4 teaspoon salt and thyme. Sprinkle fillets lightly with salt and pepper. Spoon onion mixture onto fillets. Roll each one up carefully, secure with picks. Place fish rolls in circle in 8-inch round glass cake dish.

Combine undiluted soup, wine and parsley. Spoon over fish. Cover with plastic wrap.

Cook in microwave oven 10 to 12 minutes at HIGH, or until fish is done, rotating dish every 5 minutes.

Serves 4 to 5.

## BLUSHING RICE TOMATO CUPS

- 6 large firm ripe tomatoes
- Salt and pepper
- 2 tbsps. butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1 (4 oz.) can sliced mushrooms, drained
- 1 (8 oz.) can whole kernel golden corn, drained
- 3 cups cooked rice
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1/2 cup diced cheddar cheese, divided
- Paprika

Wash tomatoes; cut slices from top of each tomato. Cut out center pulp and reserve. Sprinkle tomato shells with salt and pepper. Turn upside down to drain.

Melt butter in shallow 2-quart microwave-safe dish in microwave oven 1 to 1 1/2 minutes at HIGH (100 percent power). Add onion and green pepper. Cook 1 to 2 minutes at HIGH, or until crisp-tender.

Stir in mushrooms, corn, rice, reserved tomato pulp, 1 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper. Cook 3 to 4 minutes at HIGH. Mix in 1/4 cup cheese.

Spoon 1/2 cup of mixture into each tomato shell. Top filled shells with remaining 1/4 cup cheese. Sprinkle with paprika.

Spread remaining filling in 2-quart glass baking dish. Place filled tomatoes on top of mixture in dish. Cook in microwave oven 6 to 7 minutes at HIGH, rotating dish one-quarter turn after 3 minutes. Let stand 2 to 3 minutes before serving.

Serves 6.

## Here's How

### Slate in patio needs good cleaning

**Q.** My patio is made of natural slate, all different sizes, with cement in between the pieces. It is so faded it looks bad.

How can I restore the natural color? I have scrubbed it and used a silicone water repellent on it. I would appreciate any help you can give me. — H.Y.W.

**A.** I suggest you thoroughly clean the surface using a strong solution of synthetic detergent. Spread it over the surface and let it stand for several minutes. Then with fresh solution, scrub with a stiff brush under a floor machine.

After the slate has been cleaned and allowed to dry, a coat of sealer will render the floor easier to clean and keep clean. Any good floor sealer should serve. It should be of low viscosity and probably not over 25 percent solid. Spread thinly and rub out well. Being non-porous, slate will absorb very little of the sealer, just enough to adhere; but it is not the purpose to build up a surface coating. An ideal sealer for slate is one of the

colorless terrazzo sealers.

Often, water waxes and resin finishes turn gray from exposure. Therefore I suggest that you use only a sealer for exterior slate. In fact, if your patio has been waxed you should remove the wax with a commercial wax stripper prior to beginning the procedure described here.

**Q.** We recently purchased a 25-year-old Cape Cod style home. The house has two bedrooms, one bath, a kitchen and a living room on the first level, with an unfinished dormer and necessary plumbing for a bathroom upstairs. There is also a basement that is half finished.

We want the house to have a roomy feeling instead of the closed-in feeling you get when you come in the front door. We have thought about removing the living room ceiling and installing sky lighting on the roof and using the dormer, which would then become a loft, as our master bedroom. My biggest worry with doing this is

that the house will fall down or cave in with the first big windstorm.

Since we have just purchased this home, our budget is small at this time. However, I am very good at finish work, which will reduce a good deal of the cost. Any of your ideas and suggestions would be appreciated. — J.S.

**A.** This is a major remodeling project and you should consult a reliable, licensed contractor. Advice on the feasibility of your plan can be given only after a thorough inspection of the construction of your home.

However, a number of qualified contractors are willing to cooperate with home owners who want to do some of the construction themselves, working with the contractor. This course of action will save you money and ensure that the remodeling project is structurally sound.

**Q.** We are thinking of installing a new oak flooring in the strip style over our old soft-wood floors. Would you recommend prefinished or unfinished flooring? — G.A.

**A.** If you want the job completed in the quickest possible time and with the least fuss and bother, then the vote goes to prefinished. It is beautifully and durably finished at the mill by experts using the finest equipment, so the flooring can be walked on immediately after it is laid. It costs a bit more than unfinished stock, of course, but there is no further cost.

An advantage of unfinished flooring, especially if you plan to do the finishing yourself, is economy. Another is that you can give the floors any kind and color of finish treatment you prefer.

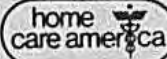

# Points on Pets

## Do hand-raised pups make better pets?

**Q. My husband and I disagree on the effects of hand-raising puppies vs. letting the dam raise her puppies to weaning without human interference.**

**Will puppies that have been raised by hand adjust more or less readily to new environments later in life than those raised strictly by their mothers?**

**Are hand-raised puppies more likely to make better pets than those left entirely to their mothers?**

**A. It is difficult to predict exactly how a particular puppy's personality will develop in later life based solely on the method of rearing early in life. However, some general observations have been made.**

Dr. John C. Wright of the Department of Psychology at Clemson University in South Carolina recently reported on a study comparing "litter-reared" puppies (puppies that are kept with their littermates and have minimal human handling) with puppies that had human contact.

Usually, litter-reared puppies show less interest in exploring

their environment and are less stimulated by new and unfamiliar objects and smells. The behavior of litter-reared puppies is in sharp contrast to 2-week-old puppies hand-reared in homes away from the kennel, who spend much more time investigating strange objects and apparently have better-developed perceptual abilities.

Apparently puppies that are hand-reared and exposed to a variety of people and surroundings during early life are better able to adjust in later life. This may explain

why some puppies raised strictly by their mothers in kennels are shy and reluctant to explore their new surroundings when brought home for the first time. These puppies often exhibit what is termed "avoidance reaction" to every unfamiliar aspect of their new home and family.

All puppies being raised to become pets in later life should have human contact and be challenged with changing environments and situations at an early age.
