## Hicksville Fire Dept. Urges Smoke Detector Use

During the past month several house fires in Hicksville caused considerable damage and in some cases the residents were very lucky to escape. What seems to be happening in Hicksville is many homeowners are opting to play Russian Roulette with the lives and safety of their families, by not installing smoke detectors in their homes. This past weekend smoke detectors were available in local stores from \$5.99 to \$20, some with rebates.

Fellow residents—please heed our warning—it can happen here and sooner or later it will. Fire strikes without warning regardless of income. The headlines will read "Fire Kills Five" etc., etc. Do you want to be a statistic? There is NO EXCUSE for not having a smoke detector, or if you have one, for not maintaining it. The following reports back up what we are saying.

**House Fire** Jan. 22 3:37 p.m., 37 Grape La. No occupants home. Probable cause heating system equipment. Considerable damage to garage and utility room.

**House Fire**, January 27, 12:21 p.m., 25 Boxwood La. Stove left on. Fire Ext. to room and second floor. \$50,000 damage. Smoke

detector present—no battery in it.

**House Fire** January 29, 4:08 a.m., 211 Blueberry La. Possible careless smoking, occupants home. No detector, barely escaped. Extensive damage to home.

**House Fire** February 8, 4:08 a.m., 111 King St. Fire in chair. No smoke detectors. Children awoke to a smoke condition. No injuries.

Are you or are you not risking the lives of your family? Do you have a detector? Do you maintain one?

Another fire, on February 2, at 3:28 p.m., at L.I. School of Typography, 23 Jerusalem Avenue. Had it not been detected, could have resulted in a major business district fire. Firefighters had to break a wall to get into the fire area. The fire burned itself out. Firefighter discovered that a flammable liquid had been poured all around the room and later it was found valuable equipment had been stolen. The Fire Marshals office and Arson Squad detectives are investigating.

## Building Permits Top \$7 Million

Oyster Bay Town Councilman Douglas J. Hynes announced that the value of building permits issued during the months of November and December, 1985 totaled \$7,083,784.

Councilman Hynes indicated that fourteen permits for commercial additions in the amount of \$1,089,360, and six permits for industrial additions valued at


\$2,191,360 were issued.

"The construction of single-family homes has played an important role in enhancing building permit values during the last two months of 1985," Hynes stated. "Nineteen permits were issued for the construction of new homes totaling \$1,519,388, and a total of 232 permits, amounting to \$2,622,333 were issued for home additions."

### LEGAL NOTICE AMENDMENTS TO THE CODE OF ORDINANCES (MOTOR VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC)

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Board of the Town of Oyster Bay, County of Nassau, State of New York, that the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Oyster Bay, New York, adopted October 5, 1971, as amended be and the same is amended, as follows:

That the following locations be ADDED to SECTION 17-25 of the said Code establishing thereunder the following intersections as STOP intersections and stop signs shall be erected at appropriate places facing traffic on the stop street. All traffic on a stop street approaching a through street from either direction, unless otherwise designated, shall come to a full stop before entering the through street:

HICKSVILLE: THROUGH STREET: SECOND STREET; STOP STREET: DIVISION AVE., north & south S. FARMINGDALE: THROUGH STREET: GRAHAM STREET; STOP STREET: LAMBERT AVE., east & west; THROUGH STREET: LAMBERT AVENUE; STOP STREET: ROBERTS ST., northbound; THROUGH STREET: KENT STREET; STOP STREET: FALLWOOD PARKWAY, east & west.

That the following location be DELETED from SECTION 17-25 of the said Code: STOP. HICKSVILLE: THROUGH STREET: DIVISION AVENUE; STOP STREET: SECOND STREET.

That the following locations be ADDED to SECTION 17-35 of the said Code establishing thereunder the following street, or portion of street as ONE WAY, and shall be driven only in the direction designated. MASSAPEQUA UNQUA ROAD - the northern driveway of the "Busy Bee Mall" Parking Field shall be designated as one-way, westbound; only, traffic shall be prohibited from exiting onto Unqua Road via this driveway. UNQUA ROAD - the southern driveway of the "Busy Bee Mall" Parking Field shall be designated as one-way, eastbound; only, traffic shall be prohibited from entering the Parking Field from Unqua Road via this driveway.

That the following location be ADDED to SECTION 17-44 of the said Code establishing thereunder the following location as points where LEFT TURNS OR RIGHT TURNS SHALL OR SHALL NOT BE MADE when signs are appropriately designated by posted signs: MASSAPEQUA UNQUA ROAD - NORTHBOUND all traffic northbound shall be prohibited from turning left into the egress (southern) driveway of the "Busy Bee Mall".

That the following location be ADDED to SECTION 17-152 of the said Code establishing NO STOPPING ZONES, which shall be appropriately designated by posted signs: WOODBURY-WOODBURY ROAD - east side - from the north curb line of Jericho Turnpike, north for



## School Closings An Early Decision

Falling snow, or even the threat of bad weather, puts Hicksville school district personnel on the alert to gather the information needed to make that important decision. Should we close the schools for the day?


The process begins at 4:30 a.m. when the Superintendent listens to weather reports to determine the trends noted by forecasters. By 5 a.m., the Assistant Director of Facilities and Operations and a member of his crew, both Hicksville residents, compare notes on local weather conditions. Crews operating the district's 11 snow plows are ready to work by 6:30 a.m. and they communicate site information about road and traffic conditions. Also at 6:30 a.m., Superintendents in the area locate having the same certain share information and confer about the decision to issue a choice that must be made by 6 a.m.

Unless a heavy storm begins in the evening, allowing plenty of time for notification about closings, the decision must be made by 6 a.m., so that bus companies can be called, and radio stations carrying school closing information can be contacted. Teachers and administrators must also be called before they leave for school. At this point, the machinery which has been put into motion cannot be stopped and the decision to open or close has been set.

"Local district superintendents have to make their decision by 6 a.m., but it's possible that conditions might change for the worse after that time," noted Hicksville Superintendent of Schools Dr. Catherine J. Fenton. "If the snowfall intensifies or road conditions become difficult between 6 and 9 a.m., the parents then must determine whether they want to send their children to school."

"This is a particular problem in the case of afternoon kindergarten classes," Dr. Fenton explained. "If schools are opened in the morning, I would not want to cancel afternoon classes and risk having a parent miss the message and send a child to school. The youngster might be stranded with no way to get home again, so we will keep the classes open and let parents decide."

## YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY

### Report any excess income promptly

Q. I am 64 and have been receiving benefits since I was age 62. I worked part time last year and I expected to make about \$5,000. I actually made \$6,500. What should I do? — K.C.

A. The allowable earnings limit for people under 65 for 1985 was \$5,400. You should have notified the Social Security Administration as soon as you expected to exceed that amount. You could have prevented an overpayment by doing that.

You will have to file an annual report of earnings for 1985 with Social Security on or before April 16, 1986. You will also have to repay \$550 in overpayments received in 1985.

Q. I am 72 years of age. I was married in 1968 and divorced in 1976. Am I entitled to Social Security benefits from my divorced husband? He is retired and drawing benefits. — B.L.

A. No. At least not from that particular ex-husband, since you were married to him for less than 10 years.

Q. I am receiving Social Security disability benefits. My wife is 46 and we have no children.

Is my wife entitled to receive

benefits on my account? — V.C.

A. No. Your wife will be eligible to receive benefits on your account when she is age 62, or age 60 if you die.

To be eligible prior to age 62 (or 60), she would have to have a child under 16 or a disabled adult in her care.

Q. My ex-husband passed away and our two children are receiving Social Security benefits based on his work. He had remarried and his second wife is also receiving benefits for herself and her two children from a previous marriage.

This isn't fair, since they are not his natural children and they receive support from their father. His second marriage was about a year before he died and he didn't adopt his stepchildren. — R.V.

A. The law makes no distinction between natural children and stepchildren in death cases, provided the marriage of the wage-earner to the natural parent of the stepchildren had been in effect for at least nine months prior to death (three months if death was accidental or occurred in the line of duty as a member of a uniformed service on active duty).

## P.O. Explains Mailing Choices

Additional knowledge can help you get better service and more for your money when choosing services at the post office.

That's the word from Hicksville Postmaster Roger Nienaber, who says, "many people are unsure of what postal option will best suit their needs. They may not make the best buy and, in addition, if they know more it can shorten time spent waiting."

The solution, the postmaster says, is for customers to be aware of what delivery services their postal dollar can buy and the differences between them. All fees listed are in addition to postage:

**Certified Mail** - Available only for First-Class Mail, it provides the sender with a receipt showing when and where the item was mailed. The fee is 75¢ per piece. In addition, a record of delivery is kept at the recipient's post office.

**Return Receipt** - This is the sender's proof of delivery. It is available on mail insured for more than \$25 and on certified, registered, Collect-on-Delivery (COD) and Express Mail articles.

For a 70 cent fee, the return receipt identifies who signed for the item and the date it was delivered. For an additional 20¢, the sender can get a receipt showing the exact address of delivery. Except for Express Mail Service, the sender can also request restricted delivery (\$1.25 per piece additional), which means delivery is made only to the addressee or to someone who is authorized in writing to receive mail for the addressee.

**Registered Mail** - The most secure option offered by the Postal Service, it is designed to provide added protection for valuable and important mail. Postal insurance may be purchased at the option offered by the Postal Service, it is designed to provide added protection for valuable and important mail. Postal insurance may be purchased at the option of the mailer to cover articles valued up to \$25,000 at the time of mailing. As an example, an item valued up to \$100 would cost \$3.60 to go registered mail if it is covered by insurance and \$3.55 if it is not. Through a system of receipts, registered articles are monitored from the point of mailing to delivery. Prepaid First-Class postage is required to send anything registered mail.

**Certificate of Mailing** - This is the answer if the sender needs only a receipt to prove something was mailed. A certificate of mailing does not provide insurance coverage, and no record is maintained at the post office. However, the post office will endorse a certificate of mailing for 45¢ for individually listed pieces of all classes of ordinary mail.

**Collect-on-Delivery (COD)** - COD service is best when the sender wants to collect for merchandise when it is delivered to the addressee. It may be used for merchandise which must have been ordered by the addressee - sent by parcel post, First Class Mail or third-class mail. Fees charged for this service include insurance protection against loss or damage. COD items may also be sent as registered mail. It is limited, however, to items valued at a maximum of \$500 and is not available for international mail.

Another helpful hint: Ask at the post office for a copy of Publication 201, A Consumer's Directory of Postal Services and Products.

In addition to entering a top quality running and racing experience, every runner will have the satisfaction of knowing that his entry fee will help a bunch of youngsters who have suffered the misfortunes of cancer and the tragedy of amputation to lead happy, productive and physically fit lives.

Hicksville runners have always played a big part in our annual Run," observed POBRRC President Mike Polansky, "and have been especially prominent on the list of trophy winners." Trophy winners in the 1985 edition of the Run included Hicksville residents Margaret Bertram, who was 5th woman overall and took home the first place trophy in the 20 to 24 age group; Li Flahavan, who took 4th place in that same age group; and Doug Saccio, who was third in the men's 15 to 19 age group.

The 1986 edition of the Run will once again be administered by Finish Line Promotions. Time splits will be given at each mile marker and police traffic control will be provided throughout the Run. There will be a water station at the halfway mark.

Furthermore, I would say that as a result of the disaster and the ensuing intensive federal investigation, future NASA shuttle flights will have vastly increased safety factors incorporated into all structural and testing elements.

Want to join MACS? No, it's not a fast food club or disco. It's a new group called Mothers Against Contact Sports! Only requirement is filial love for a sports nut! Aim is to counteract kids (of any age) trying to reverse Mother's Glamorous Hair Dye back to Worried Gray!

This brilliant idea erupted in the Hospital Emergency Room, where my #1 son spent eight hours. His teammate thought "touch football" meant "Karate the other kid". Actually, the ground was wet, a knee shot up into Todd's face, and caused a fractured cheekbone--the blow missed his eye by a breath! After consultation with two orthopedists, three ophthalmologists, and two plastic surgeons, Todd was prepared for his operation. Thankfully, he survived intact, although it resulted in his face looking like a swollen calico pumpkin--purple, orange, red, black, and blue. If it were Halloween, he would not have needed a mask. Oddly enough, if you saw half his face, it appeared normal, like Dr. Jekyll. However, the other half was truly Mr. Hyde--a ghoulish creation of Hollywood make-up for a monster film! As he recovered, he was not allowed to shave, so he soon became the perfect model for a Smith Brothers Commercial! The truth is that you lie in pain for long hours in an uncomfortable bed, in a drab room, with strangers, bored because there's nothing to do, and you're too drained and sick to do it anyway. You're only a hero if you come out with all your bones healed and moving parts still functioning. The time it takes to be injured admitted, treated, healed, and discharged, just aren't worth the effort, worry, expense and pain that you and your family suffer.

Perhaps the motto for MACS could be simply, Please be very careful. A lot of people love you, and when you get hurt, a lot of people also feel the pain.

## Cooking Corner



### Think healthy and eat accordingly

By Verne Palmer

Here we are, well launched into 1986. And how are you doing with your New Year's resolutions? Are you losing as much weight as you promised yourself you would? Are you keeping to the exercise schedule you set up on Jan. 1?

The holidays are just a memory now and they were wonderful times, but few of us could afford to dwell within their *laissez faire* confines for long.

The obligatory overindulging, hectic pace and shortened nights often leave behind a "hangover" of a kind that has nothing to do with excesses of a bottled nature.

It's a direct result of too much sugar topped off by too much fat, and if there's any question as to whether you're guilty of this kind of overindulgence, drop in on your bathroom scale for a consultation.

The antidote to "post-holiday hangover" is easy and welcome — return to healthful eating, regular exercise and a more moderate lifestyle.

At the dinner table and in between, that means a return to whole grains, fresh fruits and vegetables and lean meats. For health professionals it's almost a litany.

Come dinnertime, chicken, turkey, fish and lean beef are the order of the day, simply seasoned with

low-fat spices, herbs and wine. Accompany the meat of choice with a variety of fresh vegetables and rice or pasta, or serve atop an oat-rich pizza crust.

The dishes that follow were chosen on the basis of flavor and good nutrition, not to fit within any particular dietary restriction. However, calorie, sodium and cholesterol counts are provided where available.

#### TANGY ORIENTAL CHICKEN

1 cup vegetable cocktail juice  
1 tbsp. light soy sauce  
1 tbsp. cornstarch  
1/2 tsp. grated fresh ginger root or 1/4 tsp. ground ginger  
2 tbsp. salad oil  
2 whole chicken breasts, skinned and boned (1 lb. boneless), cut in 1-inch pieces  
1 (8 oz.) can sliced water chestnuts, drained  
1 medium red pepper, cut in 1-inch pieces  
1 1/2 cups (about 4 oz.) fresh snow peas  
1/2 cup sliced green onions  
1 medium clove garlic, minced  
Hot cooked rice

In small bowl, stir together vegetable juice, soy sauce, cornstarch and ginger root; set aside.

In wok or 10-inch skillet over medium heat, in hot oil, stir-fry chicken 3 minutes. With slotted spoon remove chicken to platter, keep warm.

To skillet, add vegetables and garlic; stir-fry until all vegetables are tender-crisp.

Return chicken to skillet; add vegetable juice mixture. Reduce heat to low, cook, stirring constantly until sauce thickens.

Serve over rice.

Makes 4 servings. Per serving (without rice): 251 calories, 448 mg sodium, 66 mg cholesterol.

#### STUFFED SOLE

1 (10 oz.) pkg. frozen chopped spinach  
1 cup sliced mushrooms  
1/2 cup sliced green onions  
2 tbsp. soft vegetable oil margarine  
1 1/2 cups quick or old-fashioned oats, uncooked  
1/2 cup egg substitute or 1 egg  
1 tsp. salt, optional  
1/4 cup lemon juice  
8 sole or flounder fillets (about 2 lbs.)  
Paprika

Thaw spinach, reserving liquid. Heat oven to 375 F. Sauté mushrooms and onions in margarine over medium heat 3 to 4 minutes. Add oats, egg, salt, 2 tablespoons lemon juice, reserved spinach and liquid; mix well. Divide spinach mixture evenly among fillets, spreading to within 1/4 inch of edges. Roll up; place seam side down in 13x9-inch glass baking dish. Sprinkle with remaining 2 tablespoons lemon juice; dust with paprika. Bake 25 minutes or until fish flakes easily with fork.

Makes 8 servings, 283 calories, 163 mg. sodium, 77 mg. cholesterol.

#### TROPICAL YOGURT DESSERT

1/2 pt. (8 oz.) plain yogurt or sour cream  
2 tbsp. honey  
1/2 tsp. mint flakes  
1/4 tsp. grated orange peel  
1 (20 oz.) can pineapple chunks in natural juice, drained  
2 medium bananas, sliced  
2 medium oranges, sectioned  
2 tbsp. flaked coconut

In small bowl, combine yogurt, honey, mint and orange peel; cover and chill. In medium bowl, toss fruit; evenly spoon into individual dishes. Top with yogurt mixture and coconut.

Makes about 6 servings.

Note: 1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh mint may be substituted for mint flakes.

#### VEGETARIAN LASAGNA

1/2 cup salad oil  
1 medium eggplant, cut in 1/4-inch pieces (6 cups)  
1 large clove garlic, minced  
1 tsp. oregano leaves, crushed  
1 medium zucchini, chopped  
1/2 cup chopped onion  
1/2 cup chopped green pepper  
2 1/2 cups cocktail juice  
2 tbsp. cornstarch  
1/4 tsp. pepper  
9 lasagna noodles, cooked, drained (1/2 lb.)  
1 1/2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese (6 oz.)  
3 tbsp. grated Parmesan cheese

In 10-inch skillet over medium heat, in hot oil, stir-fry eggplant with garlic and oregano 10 minutes.

Add zucchini, onion and green pepper; continue stir-frying about 5 minutes or until all vegetables are tender-crisp.

Mix 1/2 cup vegetable juice and cornstarch; add to skillet with remaining juice and pepper. Cook, stirring constantly until sauce thickens.

In 10x8-inch baking dish, arrange 3 lasagna noodles. Top with 1/2 cup vegetable mixture, 1/2 cup mozzarella cheese and 1 tablespoon Parmesan cheese. Repeat, making 2 more layers.

Bake at 350 F for 30 minutes until hot and bubbly. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.

Makes 6 servings, 410 calories, 497 mg. sodium, 60 mg. cholesterol per serving.

#### TURKEY CREEOLE

WITH MUSHROOMS

1 lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced  
1 tsp. corn oil  
4 tbsp. dry white wine

1 small bay leaf  
1 green bell pepper, diced  
1 (16 oz.) can chopped, stewed tomatoes

maining ingredients except turkey. Simmer, uncovered, 5 or 6 minutes. Remove bay leaf.

Heat remaining marinade. Serve kabobs with hot cooked rice and remaining marinade.

### Teriyaki

#### YAKITORI CHICKEN

4 half chicken breasts, boned and skinned, with all fat removed  
8 scallions, including half the greens  
1 green bell pepper, cut in bite-size chunks  
1 can water chestnuts, drained  
Teriyaki Sauce (recipe follows)  
Teriyaki Glaze (recipe follows)

Cut chicken breasts into bite-size pieces.

On thin skewers (preferably wood), alternate pieces of chicken with scallion, bell pepper and water chestnuts, in any order desired.

Pour teriyaki sauce into shallow pan large enough to accommodate skewers, and roll skewered ingredients briefly in sauce.

Cook 5 to 10 minutes over charcoal or under broiler, 2 to 3 inches from source of heat, turning once, until chicken is almost cooked through.

Baste skewered ingredients thoroughly with teriyaki glaze and cook 30 seconds or so more, turning frequently.

Serves 2 to 4.

#### BEEF TERIYAKI

1 lb. beef tenderloin, cut in

1½-inch-thick slices  
Teriyaki Sauce (recipe follows)

Teriyaki Glaze (recipe follows)

Sprigs of parsley for garnish (optional)

8 scallions, cut into "brushes" for garnish (optional)

1 tbsp. dry mustard, mixed with enough water to form thick paste

Marinate beef 2 to 3 minutes in teriyaki sauce. Broil over charcoal or in oven, 2 to 3 inches from source of heat, for 1 minute on each side. Brush both sides with teriyaki glaze and cook about 15 seconds more on each side.

Serve on plates garnished with parsley sprigs and scallion brushes, with spoonful of mustard paste for dipping.

Serves 2 to 4.

#### TERIYAKI SAUCE

½ cup dry sherry  
½ cup sugar  
1 cup soy sauce  
1 cup sake

Heat sherry in medium pan and stir in sugar. Continue to stir until sugar is well mixed in.

Stir in soy sauce and sake, bring to boil, remove from heat and allow to cool to room temperature.

#### TERIYAKI GLAZE

4 tbsps. cornstarch  
2 tbsps. water  
½ cup Teriyaki Sauce  
2 tbsps. sugar

Mix cornstarch and water, whisking until mixture is smooth.

In small pan, heat teriyaki sauce and sugar over medium heat, stirring until mixture almost boils. Reduce heat to low and stir in cornstarch/water mixture. Continue to cook, stirring constantly, until glaze is thick and clear. Pour into small bowl and reserve.

## MICROWAVE MAGIC



### Cottage cheese

By Desiree Vives

Chances are you have a container of cottage cheese in your fridge right now. It's great stuff. A quick shot of protein is just a few spoonfuls away. And because the flavor is about as mild and bland as a flavor can get, cottage cheese goes with almost anything.

Try a healthy scoopful in half an avocado for a quick lunchtime salad. Serve it with fruit salad, over lettuce with a dab of French dressing, sprinkled with sunflower seeds, or just by itself.

Cottage cheese is one of the simplest cheeses ever created by man. It's prepared from skim milk (fresh or dried), lactic bacteria (to make it curdle) and salt. The cheese consists of unripened, uncured curds that vary in size and creaminess. Most commercial cottage cheese is "creamed" with the addition of cream, or milk, or both.

A 2-ounce serving of cottage cheese contains about the same amount of protein as an 8-ounce glass of milk — but the cheese contains less in the way of vitamins and minerals, and should not be thought of as a substitute for milk.

Cottage cheese is great in a microwaved casserole, blending well with meats, vegetables, pasta and other cheeses. Try the following recipes, and you'll be surprised at what cottage cheese can do.

#### CREAMY NOODLE-CHEESE BAKE

8 oz. wide egg noodles, cooked

1½ cups cottage cheese

½ cup sour cream

¼ cup grated Parmesan cheese

1 large clove garlic, minced

¼ cup minced onion

3 tbsps. butter or margarine

2 tbsps. chopped fresh parsley

½ tsp. ground white pepper

Dash paprika

In 3-quart glass casserole combine cooked noodles, cottage cheese, sour cream, Parmesan cheese and garlic. Stir to blend; set aside.

Combine minced onion and butter or margarine in 2-cup glass measure. Microwave on HIGH (100 percent power) 2 to 3 minutes, stirring once, until onions are tender.

Stir sautéed onions into noodle mixture with chopped parsley and ground white pepper. Sprinkle top lightly with paprika.

Cover and microwave on ME-

DIUM-HIGH (70 percent power) 10 to 12 minutes, until sauce is set and casserole is heated through. Let stand, covered, 5 to 10 minutes before serving.

Serves 4 to 6.

#### ZUCCHINI-CORN DELIGHT

1 (12 oz.) can corn, drained  
1½ cups cottage cheese  
2 eggs  
½ cup sour cream  
2 tbsps. flour  
½ tsp. dried leaf basil  
¼ tsp. each garlic salt and pepper  
5 medium-size zucchini  
3 tbsps. butter or margarine  
½ cup fine dry bread crumbs  
½ cup shredded cheddar or Monterey Jack cheese

In medium-size mixing bowl combine corn, cottage cheese, eggs, sour cream, flour, basil, garlic salt and pepper. Stir to blend; set aside.

Wash zucchini, trim off ends and slice. Place in 2-quart glass casserole with butter or margarine. Microwave, uncovered, 6 minutes on HIGH (100 percent power), stirring every 2 minutes.

Pour corn/cottage cheese mixture over zucchini. Sprinkle evenly with bread crumbs and top with cheese.

Microwave on HIGH 6 to 8 minutes, until cheese bubbles and dish is heated through.

Serves 4.

#### THREE-CHEESE SPINACH

2 (10 oz.) pkgs. frozen chopped spin chch  
2 cups cottage cheese  
½ cup grated Parmesan cheese  
2 eggs, lightly beaten  
½ cup grated Swiss cheese

Place spinach in 1½-quart glass casserole dish. Cover and microwave 7 to 9 minutes on HIGH (100 percent power), stirring every 3 minutes. Drain.

Stir in cottage cheese, Parmesan cheese and eggs, blending well.

Microwave, uncovered, on HIGH 10 to 12 minutes, rotating dish ¼-turn every 4 minutes, until heated through.

Sprinkle grated Swiss cheese over top and microwave 1 minute longer on HIGH. Let stand several minutes before serving.

## How to stretch space, function

**Q.** I am moving into my own one-bedroom apartment and want to buy furniture. I expect that I will have guests visiting me for short stays now that I am out of grad school and working in a new job.

I want masculine, easy-care kinds of furnishings with an emphasis on comfort. I'll be starting with the living room because I have some bedroom furniture.

What type of furniture should I buy? — R.P.

**A.** You probably should keep in mind that dual-purpose furniture is a terrific help in stretching space and function, especially in a one-bedroom apartment where you want to entertain friends and relax yourself.

This can be accomplished in a number of ways — basket hampers for end tables that open up to provide storage, storage trunks that are decorative and can hold guest bedding, and, of course, sofa beds.

If you were to choose a modular seating group that you could arrange around a large television screen, your seating could include end arm units with hidden recliners for relaxing and a seating unit that could make into a queen-size bed.

Seating modules in a neutral yet interestingly textured fabric would give you a quiet background for living and entertaining. Add bursts of color and design with soft sofa pillows in shades you want to repeat in your accessories and on the walls.

Choose a large coffee table for the center of your modular seating and see that the table has a top that isn't easy to damage. Plastic laminate and glass are probably the two best choices for a coffee table that will be used often and with food and drink.

**Q.** We have a guest room that we want to convert into a mini gym. But we still want to be able to accommodate guests on occasion.

I have considered rollaway beds, but they take up a considerable amount of storage. Do you have any ideas short of a sofa bed, which is probably the most logical choice? — K.T.

**A.** Have you ever considered offering your guests futons? Those marvelous roll-up mattresses with comforters can be just terrific for the occasional guest.

The only drawback, as I see it, is that your guests need to be fairly nimble to sleep on the floor and get up easily. If your guests are elderly, you probably won't want a futon. But for those who are a bit adventurous, futons are fun and look great.

You can buy the mattresses in a variety of wonderful fabrics with matching comforters or contrasting ones.

If your space is limited you could roll up the futons and fold the com-

torts for storage. Or you can fold the futon into an S-form and use it as seating by day.

**Q.** We have an entry hall in our home with the living room to the right and the dining room to the left.

Should the living and dining rooms as well as the entry be in the same color scheme? I have seen some homes done in this fashion and it seems dull and uninteresting. — T.B.M.

**A.** I believe most interior designers try to work from the same gen-

eral color scheme when they are creating rooms that blend into each other.

For example, if you are in the living room and your eye can take you into the entry and the dining room, you have one continuous space, despite some delineation of walls. The result doesn't have to be dull, however.

Let's say you chose one color scheme of rose, turquoise, green, cream and beige. You might have soft rose carpeting in the living room with painted beige walls, a floral wallpaper in turquoise and

rose in the dining room with an Oriental rug in some of the same colors.

In the entry area you might have nothing on the floor, leaving wood exposed.

If you wanted decoration on the walls, you might do a striped wallpaper in a beige and pale, pale turquoise with accents of rose. The trick here is to vary the color scheme in many ways using interesting textures and quality designs.

## Here's How

By Gene Gary

**Q.** The cement on our terrace and walks is badly cracked and discolored. Could you suggest a covering or treatment for it? We would like something that would be inconspicuous. — Mrs. Gladys W.

**A.** A thin surface of new concrete can be put over an old, thick surface if a bonding material is applied to the old finish, or in some cases, if the binder is added to the new mixture.

In repairing concrete, the cracks should be cleaned of all loose chips or debris and soaked with water before applying the patching material.

Or another method: You can repair the cracked surface fairly easily by brush coating it with a resurfacing product. To do this you mix the resurfacer to a thick paintlike consistency. Spray the area to dampen it, but remove any standing water. Pour the resurfacing mixture onto the walk and terrace and spread it

with a soft push broom.

After the mix is spread out in a thin coat, use parallel strokes of the broom to create an even surface texture.

**Q.** We hope you can help. Here's the problem: We have a large Oriental rug, all cotton, 12x14 feet, that is badly faded. The underside is beautiful and bright, as the floral pattern is the same on both sides.

Could the binding be removed and sewed on the top side edges? If so, could you recommend someone who does this type of work?

**A.** Consult the Yellow Pages of the telephone directory for professionals who do rug cleaning and repair of rugs and carpets. Your problem needs the attention and advice of an expert.

**Q.** My problem is a leak in my patio roof, with which I've been bothered the last 15 years. At one time I had this patio covered with some kind of

waterproof paint, but after the first rain it peeled terribly and the leak was back. I contacted the contractor who put on another coat, but this did not hold up either.

A year later I contracted with a roofer and he put on a "traffic" top roof with large sheets of compressed material. He gave me a 10-year guarantee and it cost me \$1,300. But about six months later, it leaked. I approached him and he got very angry and said, "This is the first time a thing like this has happened." In any event, he did nothing, and I guess I could have taken him to court, but didn't.

About two or three years later, I had another contractor put on some kind of pumice stone cement about three inches thick, after which he coated the surface with a waterproof material. It did not leak for about a year, but now it is leaking and chipping and the contractor who did the cement work is not around.

Would you suggest that I rip up the cement and have someone reveal the surface? I would appreciate your advice. — Thomas P.

**A.** You've certainly had your problems with contractors. Without an inspection, it is impossible to offer a certain remedy for your troubles, but I do have a few suggestions.

You might remove the present roof and replace it with a fiber glass covering. Possibly your problem may be due to the foundation or framing for the roofing, and moisture works up from the underside. If the foundation is unstable, this causes cracks in any type of ceiling roofing.

Another suggestion is to cover the roof with a marine-type deck canvas. If you get another contractor to do the work, make sure he is a reputable, qualified licensed contractor.





## Points on Pets

### Take injured dog to veterinarian

Q. Our neighbor recently hit our 3-year-old cocker spaniel with her car.

At the time of the accident, it did not appear that the dog was injured. Now the dog cannot support the weight of her body on her right front leg. Whenever our dog carries her leg, she does not seem to be in pain.

Is it possible that the leg is broken? If so, is it too late to do anything about it?

A. There are many possible reasons for your dog carrying her right front leg. The behavior may or may not be related to the earlier accident.

Without actually examining your dog, it is impossible to tell if the leg is broken. You should take your dog to a local veterinarian for a thorough physical examination and treatment.

Most bone fractures in dogs are caused by some form of violence — automobile accidents, sharp blows or kicks, and injuries resulting from jumping or falling off high objects.

Signs of bone fracture include the following: intense pain and swelling in the affected area, limping, loss of function of the broken limb, bones protruding from the skin and abnormal angulation of the broken limb. It is often necessary to use X-

rays in diagnosing fractures.

There are three types of fractures: simple fractures, compound fractures and comminuted fractures.

With simple fractures there is one complete, clean break of the bone and neither of the fractured bone ends protrudes through the overlying muscles and skin.

Compound fractures are those breaks in which a portion of the broken bone protrudes through a laceration in the overlying muscles and skin. Usually the fractured bone end can be seen. Because the skin is torn with compound fractures, infection of the wound and of the bone itself often results.

Infections of the bone are very serious and if not properly cared for may result in loss of the affected limb.

With comminuted fractures, the bone is fractured in several places instead of a nice, clean, single break. Comminuted fractures often occur following crushing types of accidents and may be simple or compound.

Fractures, whatever the type, are serious, and dogs with fractured limbs should be taken promptly to a veterinarian. Care should be taken to protect the fractured limb while transporting the dog — keeping the dog quiet and inactive is most important. A homemade splint can be improvised if the dog must be transported a long distance, but never
