## 173 Monkeys Quit Zoo, Roam Over Massapequa

Frank Buck Compound Scene Of More Trouble As Animals Escape, Hold Up Trains, Frighten Residents

Frank Buck's wild animal compound in Massapequa, which has been the scene of loss of trouble ever since Mr. Buck shipped the zoo a boatload of wild animals from Africa, had more difficulties on its hands yesterday when 173 lively and ambitious monkeys escaped and disappeared into the woods.

Up to late this morning only two of the animals had been captured, despite the liberal bounty of \$10 each which has been offered by the zoo for their return. Reports of their wanderings, however, have been pouring into the compound.

The monkeys—all 173 of them—swarmed down to the Long Island Railroad tracks immediately after the third rail proceeded to the station. The engineer slowed down, but the gang refused to budge and the train was held up five minutes.

## Tappen To Seek Renomination, He Announces
