World Famous Cheeses

Cheese is such a wholesome staple in the food section that almost every nation has developed its own justly famous varieties of cheese.

Swiss cheese is perhaps the most famous English product. The name of real Swiss has a tang which is well nigh irresistible to those who are fond of it. Cheddar and Cheddar cheeses are perhaps more generally popular than the Swiss, but even has its following in European circles. In this country we obtain the first mentioned variety packed in neat glass jars, or pots, and the other two cheeses in eight-ounce cartons, holding six portions.

From France come the famous Camembert and Roquefort cheeses. To them the "cheese" of the cheese family. Germany has also developed a Camembert which is packed in such a way that it is always in prime condition for serving. This is the cheese which is best in its type, creamy state when even the mind is tender.

Both Roquefort and Camembert cheeses are delicious served with hot crisp crackers after dinner, or as a filling for hot bread sandwiches for a luncheon or supper menu. Roquefort is also popular as an ingredient for salad dressing, and as a filling for stuffed celery and onions. For convenience a Roquefort dressing is put up in tubes, ready for combining with French dressing, for salads, or for stuffing celery.

Gruyere cheese is a Swiss product and a most popular cheese in America. One must go to Holland for the Dutch full cream cheese and the famous Edam cheese without which no epicure's household is complete. Most of these imported cheeses are now available to us in small boxes, containing six individual portions, and through this economical method of packing we are becoming more and more familiar with them.

The most famous of the Italian cheeses is perhaps the Parmesan which is used in much of its grated form for flavoring sauces, spaghetti and ravioli. It can be bought in wax-paper envelopes or in sealed jars or cartons, ready for use.

Among the American cheeses the sharp New York Herkimer cheese has the sharpest tang for an American cheese and is used in many dishes and for service with apple and mince pie. These great cheeses may be seen in any market, grocery, fresh and wholly delicious. For milder use, as in sandwiches, there are the Philadelphia cream cheeses and the yellow American cheese.
