EXCELLENT WORK!

Whether Oyster Bay is fortunate enough to build the incinerator and complete the tax map with Federal funds or not, no just blame can be directed against the Town Board. Members of the Board, and Supervisor Tappen in particular, deserve great praise for the pa-tience and perseverance they have shown in the long and rather unpromising negotiations for both.

That both improvements are needed urgently there can be no doubt. The need for the incinerator is especially strong. To go back to the dump would be unthinkable. Yet incineration at out of town plants is a heavy expense. The town is fortunate in its negotiations for PWA funds for the incineration in having the support of the State Department of Sanitation, officials of which are using what influence they have at Albany where many useful projects become unaccountably snagged.

The desirability of completing the town tax map as soon as possible is only less urgent. Made mandatory by State law five years ago, the map is still only 60 per cent complete. Nevertheless, surveys made to date have discovered 400 acres of land of which there was no previous record. There may be several hundred more. Supervisor Tappen estimates an increase in annual town revenues of \$12,000 from the acreage already found. That will mean more money for the town and more land for the lucky property owners, both highly desirable.

The Town Board ought to receive every encourage-ment in continuing the splendid work it is doing in seek-ing Federal help for constructive local projects.

LOOKING UP

Business men and residents of the most remote ham les on Long Island have derived considerable encouragement from announcements of the forthcoming World's Fair, with promised increased traffic facilities. It is generally believed that the anticipated crowds will mean increased business development even in communities many miles distant from Queens.

Newcomers will make their homes here; spend their money in local shops; interest themselves in the civic life of their home town; help to bring the return of prosperity to the North Shore.






