Gregory Museum

'Going To The Dogs'

The Gregory Museum which contains a history of the Town of Hicksville, Long Island, and has many artifacts from the town's past, has now "gone to the dogs." Joseph Normandy has just donated the trophy of the Raynham Derby won by his famous dog "Hicksville" to the Gregory Museum. Mr. Richard Evers the curator accepted the trophy on behalf of the museum.

Though the racing dog was whelped (born) on Long Island and owned by Joseph Normandy who resides in Hicksville and also was raised and trained on Long Island, not many Long Islanders have seen this great dog race. The fact that dog racing was never passed as yet by legislature, there is no racing of Greyhounds professionally in New York. Hicksville in winning over \$100,000 in purse money, which included the Raynham Derby win, made many tax dollars for the State of Massachusetts when he attracted huge crowds on the days he raced. Large entourages from New York wearing the colors of Hicksville Town, Black & Orange "T" shirts and Jackets inscribed "Hicksville" travelled the 220 miles just to see this agile canine athlete perform. The evening he won the Derby there were many of these colored jackets in the crowd that night. Hicksville qualified for six derbies and in every set of qualification races always would win at least one round, which gives a racing dog the points to make the final races. The pride of

Hicksville, Long Island, was headed for 80 or more wins which puts him in the hall of fame of racing dogs in Abilene, Kansas. He only ran a year and a half so far and he had more than 50 wins and was well on his way to the Hall of Fame. Then a bad thing happened in a race he was winning, he tripped, fell and broke his hock. The Salpietro Kennel in which he raced and was their pride and joy, realized right there that he would never race again. He was retired to the Stud, but here again he did not stand long. While putting him out in the run one day, he collapsed and died instantly. The only thing left of this magnificent racing dog can now be seen at the Gregory museum. Long Island produced many great dogs; probably the three most outstanding were Broadway Donna, Profits Andy and Hicksville.



Second Half Taxes Due

Oyster Bay Town Receiver of Taxes, Gary F. Musiello, reminded residents this week that the second half of the 1990 General Tax Levy is due on July 1, 1990, and may be paid, without penalty, through August 10, 1990.

"By law, a taxpayer has a 40-day grace period from the date the tax is due during which payment may be made without penalty," Musiello explained. "After the 40 days, a 1% penalty is added for each month the tax remains unpaid, retroactive to July 1st."

Residents can pay in person at the Tax Office, Oyster Bay Town Hall West, Audrey Avenue, Oyster Bay, or at Town Hall South, 977 Hicksville Road, Massapequa. They may also pay by mail. In addition, Oyster Bay Town Clerk Carl L. Mccellino, said that the Town Clerk's Annex, Newbridge Road and Duffy Avenue, Hicksville, will be open to accept payments, by check only, from 9 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. on August 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10.

When paying the tax bill in person, residents are reminded to bring the entire tax bill with their payment. Payments being made by mail for the second half of the year should include Stub #2. Musiello urged residents who are mailing in their payment to do so at least 10 days before the August 10th deadline.

The Tax Office will be sending a computerized receipt, but Musiello advised residents to retain their cancelled check as additional proof of payment.



Supt. To Retire,
Three Retirees Honored

In an effort to quell rumors that he plans to negotiate another contract as superintendent, Dr. John Sommi announced his retirement effective June 30, during last week's Bethpage Board of Education meeting.

"I planned to retire four years ago when I asked for a four year contract instead of five," the superintendent explained. "The sale of my home has been no secret, nor has the investigation of retirement communities by my wife and I."

Dr. Sommi joined the Bethpage School District in 1977 as superintendent. He characterized his three decades of service in education into three distinctive periods: from the population growth and teacher shortage of the 1960's to the protests of the 1970's to the declining enrollments of the 1980's. "I have enjoyed my job," he said. "I look forward to the upcoming year's challenges and excitements. We have more staff harmony now than in the past 25 years. The community will now see tangible evidence of growth through the capital improvements projects."

The board granted Dr. Sommi a salary increase said to be slightly under 10 percent for the final year of his contract. In addition the superintendent's vacation time was increased by 22 days.

Past members and one present member of the Board of Education were recipients of plaques celebrating their "unselfish devotion and commitment to youth." Thomas Cannon, Michael Verderosa and Marie Hurley have each served on the board for a minimum of twelve years.

Also recognized for their contribution to the Bethpage School District were three retiring educators. Kenneth Blau, Central Boulevard Elementary School Principal, Robert Anziano, District Director of Physical Education and Athletics and George Daniels, Social Studies Supervisor retired June 30. Dr. Sommi noted that the years of service to the district by the men totalled over 100 years.

In other personnel actions, tenure was granted to Michael Fenster in the area of physical education and health. Numerous terminations and appointments were made as were the abolition and establishing of positions.

Other business included the passage of a 10 page policy regarding gifts, grants and bequests. The reading of the policy was dispensed with due to its length. However, the policy was put to use immediately with the acceptance of two scholarships. The Horton White Scholarship in the amount of \$2500 was created for a senior member of the varsity golf team who is college bound. Several criteria must be met to receive the award including an essay elaborating on how golf taught them about life and how it made them a better person.

The John O'Toole Scholarship, named after former Bethpage Math teacher, is a \$500 award given to a student who has taken four years of high school math and is college bound as a math major, among other criteria.

In other business, the bid for handicapped toilets and water fountains was won b. N & S Shore Construction at a cost of \$60,706. Meat and canned good bids were also awarded as was a Special Transportation bid.

Board president Kathleen Picinic announced that the cafeteria committee and the grounds committee were invited to meet this summer. Interested members were asked to contact Dr. Sommi, Mrs. Picinic or Asst. Supt. George Mann.

The next Board of Education meeting will take place on Tuesday, July 31, at 8 p.m., in the Board Room.
